

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

November 2013

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended November 16, 2013, there were 552,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan during November 2013, a decrease of 4,200 from October 2013 but 12,300 more than the number employed in November 2012.

Agricultural employment was 42,200 persons in November 2013, down 3,300 from the October 2013 level but 1,400 more than the November 2012 agricultural employment level of 40,800. Non-agricultural employment was 510,100 persons in November 2013. This is a decrease of 900 from the October 2013 non-agriculture employment level of 511,000 but 10,900 more than November 2012.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for November 2013 was 3.8 percent. This is an increase of 0.7 percentage points from the October 2013 rate of 3.1 percent but 0.2 percentage points lower than the November 2012 level of 4.0 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force was 574,300 persons in November 2013, unchanged from October 2013. This is 11,600 more than the November 2012 labour force of 562,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 68.9 percent in November 2013 from 69.1 percent in October 2013. The November 2012 participation rate for Saskatchewan was also 68.9 percent.

There were 21,900 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during November 2013. This is an increase of 4,100 from October 2013 but is 700 less than the number unemployed in November 2012.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 556,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan in November 2013, down 1,600 from the October 2013 level of 557,800 but up 15,100 from the November 2012 employment level of 541,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for November 2013 was 4.1 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the October 2013 rate of 3.6 percent but 0.4 percentage points lower than the November 2012 rate of 4.5 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 29,200 persons in November 2013 to 17,800,000 persons from 17,829,200 persons in October 2013. In November 2012, there were 17,605,600 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.1 percentage points in November 2013 to 6.4 percent from the October 2013 level of 6.5 percent. In November 2012, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.7 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.9 percent in November 2013. This is unchanged from October 2013 and 0.3 percentage points lower than the November 2012 level of 7.2 percent.
