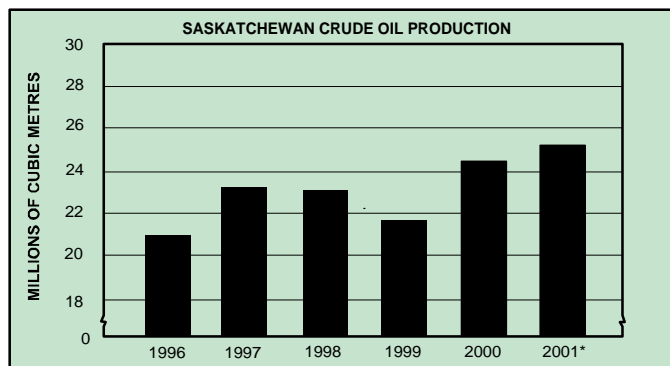

Introduction

The Saskatchewan economy grew at a healthy rate in 2000. Real Gross Domestic Product grew by 4.7 percent, compared to the average real growth rate of 2.8 percent from 1990 to 1999. Strong international demand for Saskatchewan's natural resources was the driving force behind the economic growth last year. In 2001, agriculture suffered as a result of drought and the continued use of international subsidies by other grain-producing nations. Furthermore, the economic slowdown experienced in the United States was felt in Canada. Due to these events, it is unlikely that the Saskatchewan economy will grow at the same rate in 2001 as it did last year.

Mining Continues to Drive Economic Growth

The mining sector, which includes minerals and the extraction of oil and gas, continues to be the leading industry in the province. High prices for both commodities in 2000 and early 2001 have led to increased drilling activity and production in 2001. Through mid-November, the number of natural gas wells drilled was 1,334. This is already more than last year's record of 1,203. Crude oil production stood at 16.3 million cubic metres through the first eight months of 2001, an increase of 2.3 percent over the same period in 2000. Natural gas production increased 1.0 percent through August 2001 over the same eight months in 2000.

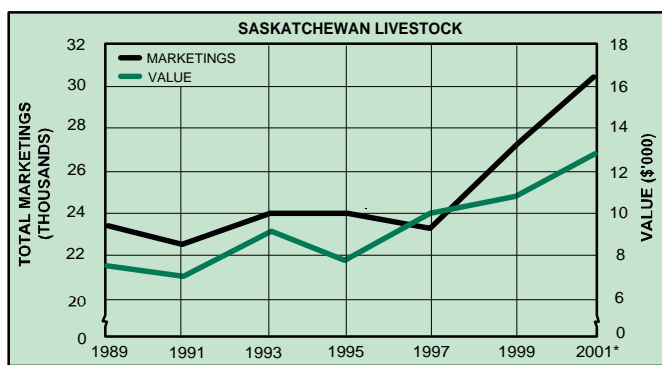
Challenges in Agriculture

The farming sector of the economy in Saskatchewan faced numerous challenges in 2001. A lack of moisture combined with a hot, dry and windy summer led to poor growing conditions and below-average yields and harvest. Saskatchewan farmers are expected to harvest 19.5 million tonnes of the major grains, oilseeds, and specialty crops in 2001. This is 31 percent below last year's harvest, and 22 percent below the ten-year average. All crops, except sunflowers and winter wheat, saw below-average yields and a majority of crops experienced lower-than-normal harvests.

Diversification in Agriculture

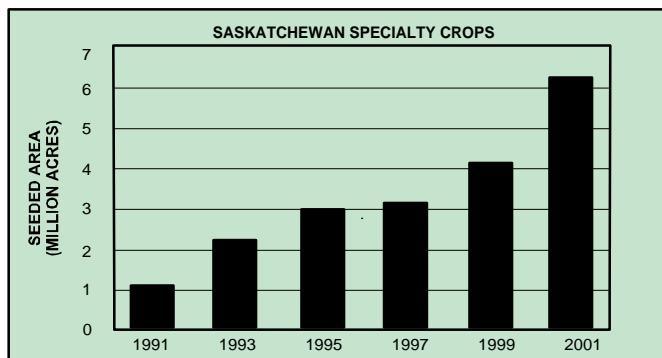
The face of Saskatchewan agriculture continues to change. Livestock continues to become a more important part of farming operations. In 2000, cash receipts from livestock made up 25 percent of total receipts. Through August of 2001, the total number of cattle marketed rose

8.3 percent over 2000 levels. Farm cash receipts from livestock operations, including poultry, rose from \$1,037 million during the first nine months of 2000 to \$1,164 million over the same period in 2001. This is an increase of 12.2 percent. Total farm cash receipts were up 12.7 percent in the first nine months of 2001.



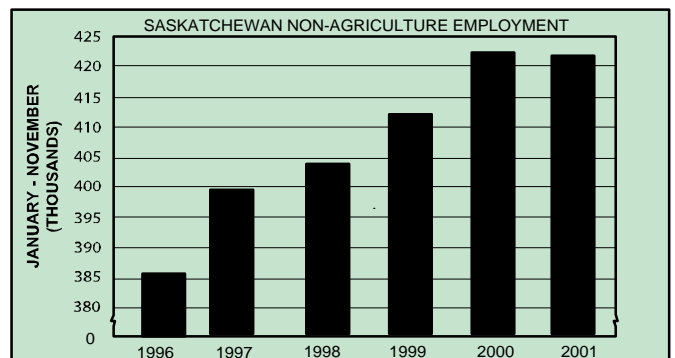

Saskatchewan farmers also continued to diversify into specialty crops. In 2001, the harvested area for the six major specialty crops was 6,030,000 acres, up 13.1 percent from 2000 levels, due to a 15.8 percent increase in seeded area.



Non-Agriculture Employment Remains Strong

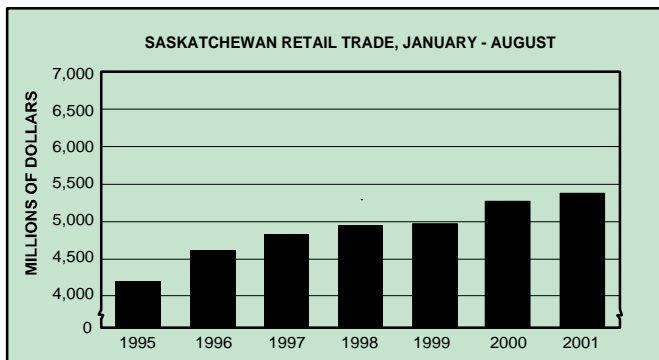
Tough economic times in the agriculture sector have reflected themselves in provincial employment numbers. Agriculture employment has averaged 52,100 from January to November of 2001. For the same period in 2000, the industry had an average of 63,100 people employed. Non-agriculture employment has remained flat even in the face of uncertain economic times. This is a positive sign for an economy once solely reliant on agriculture. Despite the decrease of jobs in agriculture, employment in non-agriculture industries dropped by a mere 1,500 people over the first eleven months of 2001.



Several industries saw healthy increases in employment levels over the first ten months of 2001. The average number of people working in other primary industries, including mining, rose by 13.4 percent, 2.9 percent in construction, and 2.5 percent in manufacturing.

Retail Sales

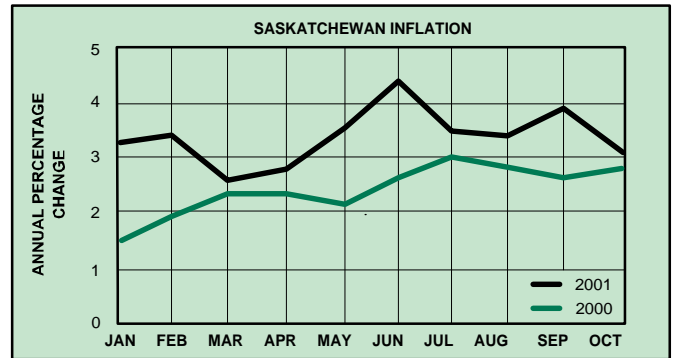
While the global economic slowdown became worse over 2001, lower interest rates were used by central banks in both Canada and the United States to encourage consumer spending and spur economic growth. Retailers in Saskatchewan continued to see gains in sales over the first eight months of 2001. Total retail sales in the province stood at \$5.4 billion at the end of August. This was an increase of 1.9 percent over 2000 levels.



Inflation

Inflation, as measured by the all-items Consumer Price Index (CPI) in Saskatchewan, averaged 3.4 percent for the first ten months of 2001, an increase over the 2000 average of 2.4 percent. Energy costs continue to be high. Through October of 2001, the increase in the energy component of the CPI averaged 11.7 percent. For the same period in 2000, the average was 11.8 percent. Higher costs for shelter, transportation, and tobacco and alcohol products have also resulted in higher prices in 2001.

Canada's inflation rate averaged 2.9 percent over the first 10 months of 2001, compared to an average of 2.6 percent over the same period in 2000.

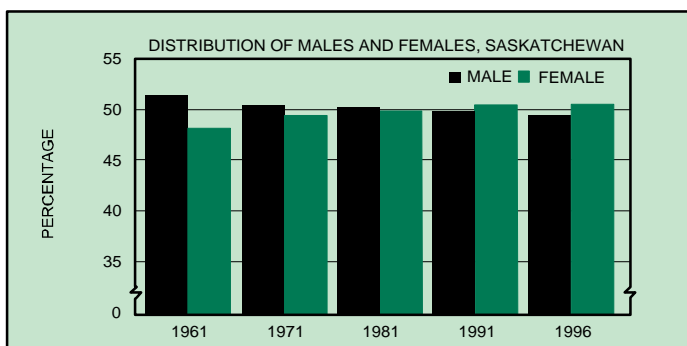


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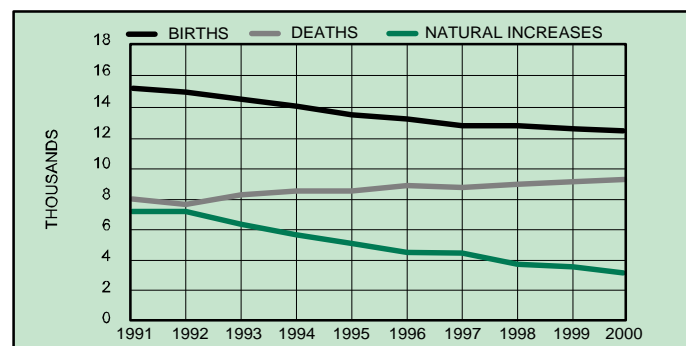

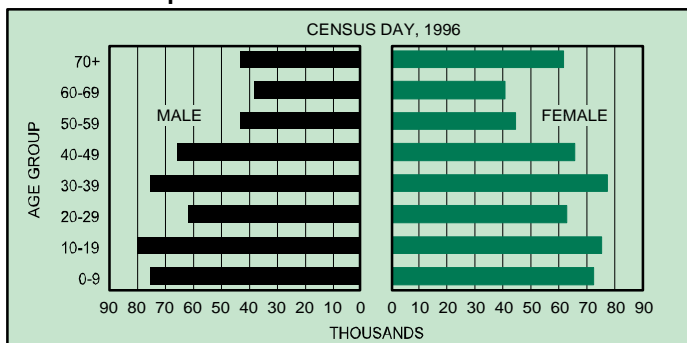

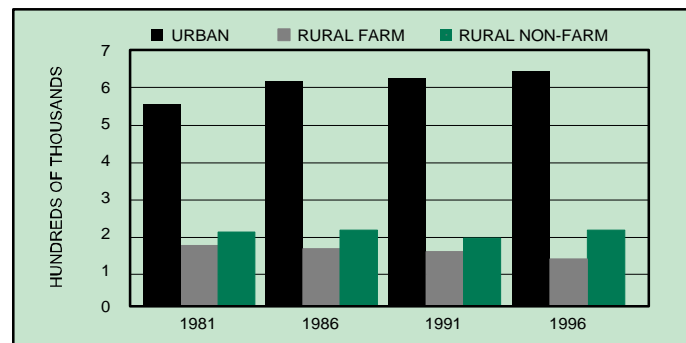
Table 3: Population, Saskatchewan Distribution by Age Groups

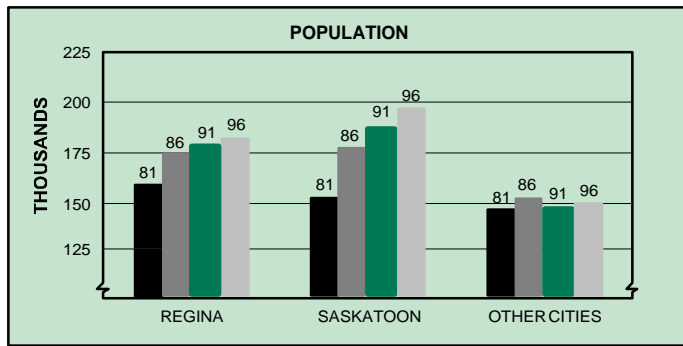

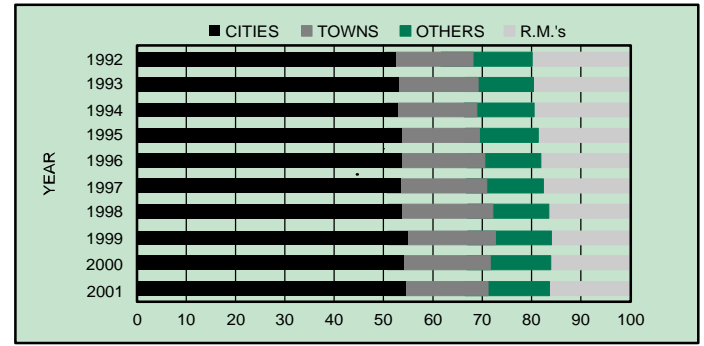

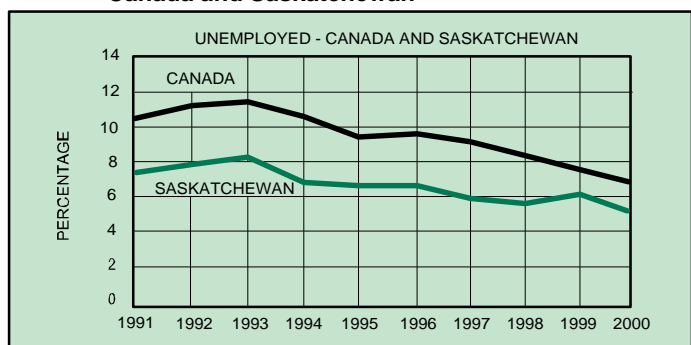

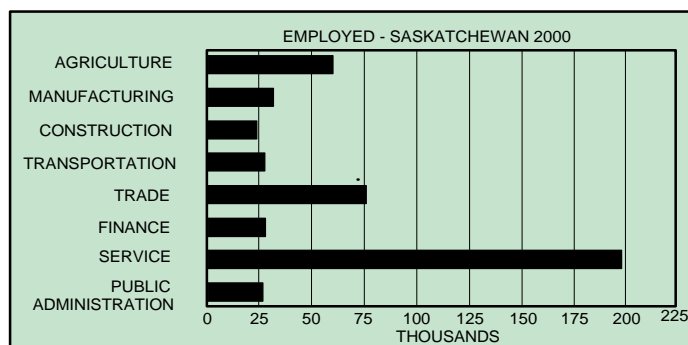

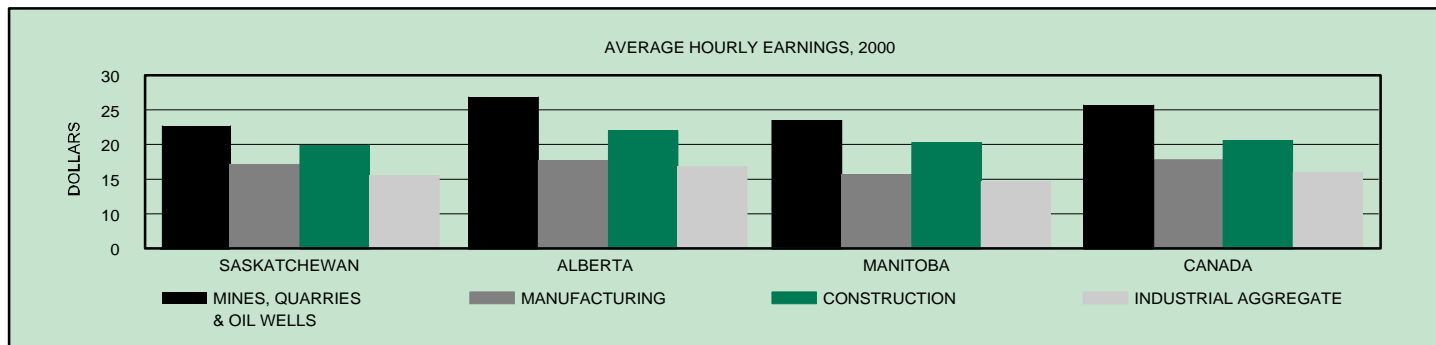

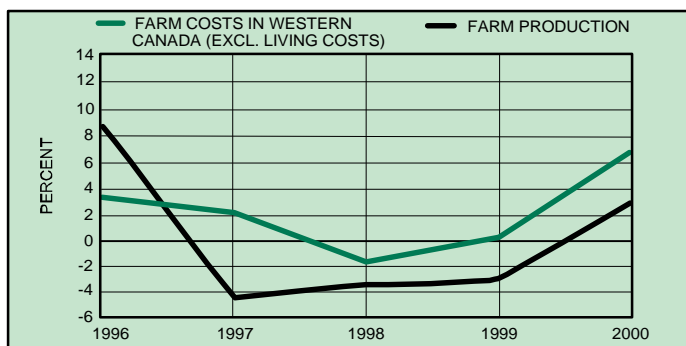

Table 19: Indexes of Farm Costs (1992=100)



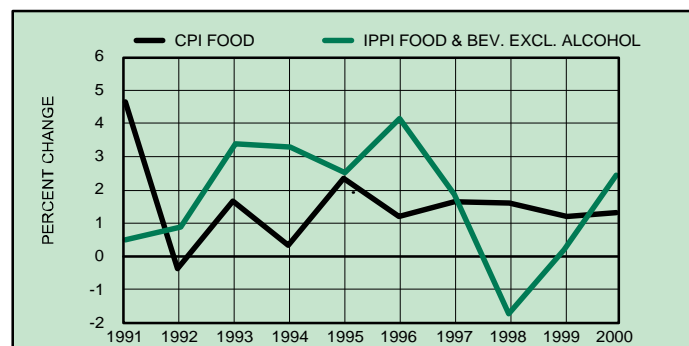

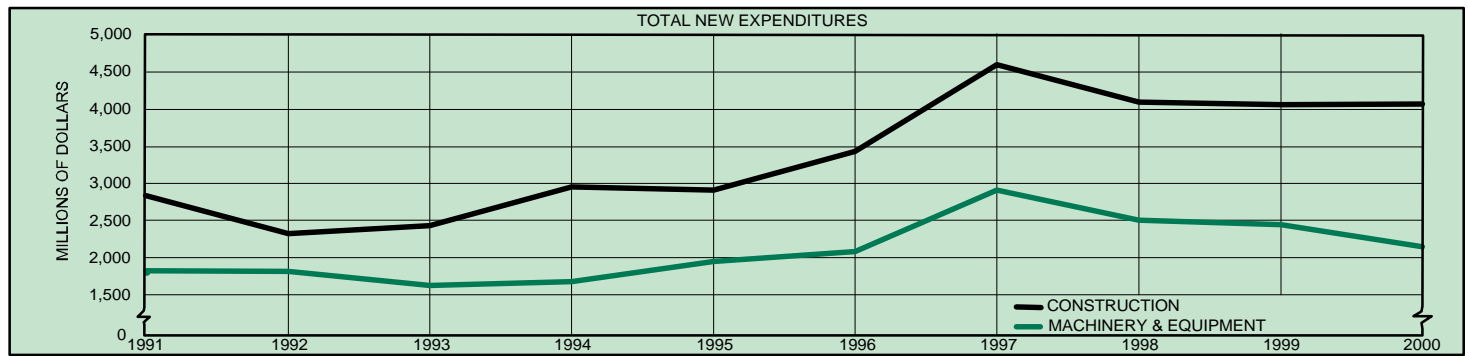

Table 21: Private and Public Investment by Industry, Saskatchewan



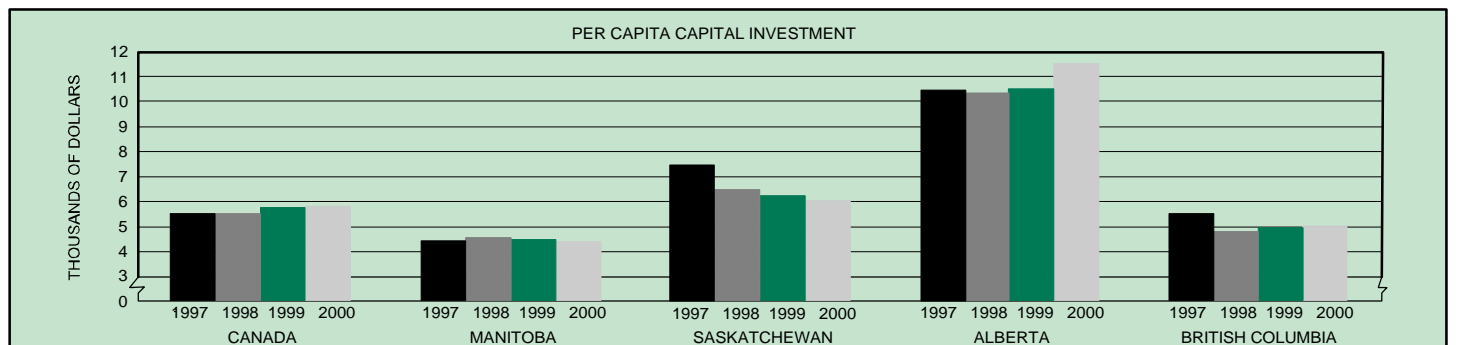

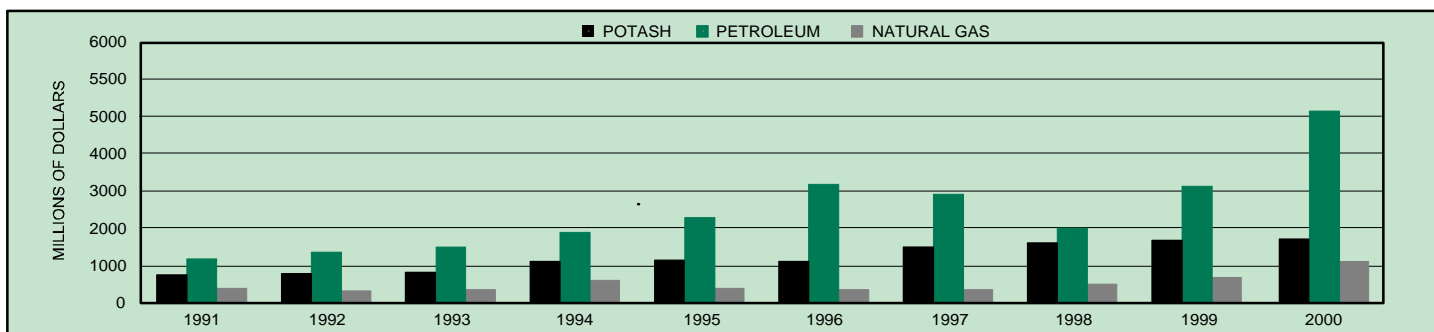

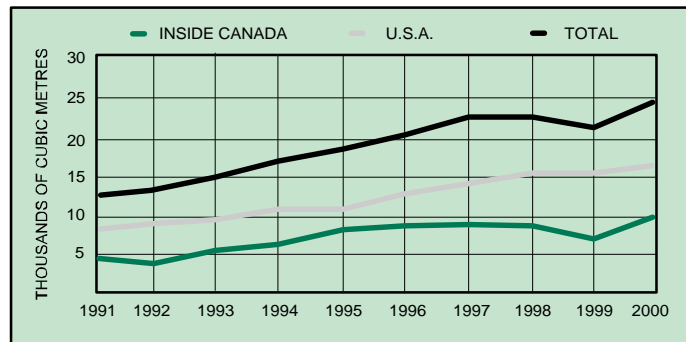

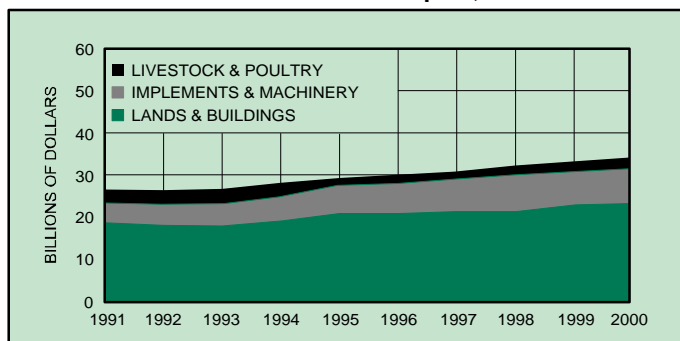

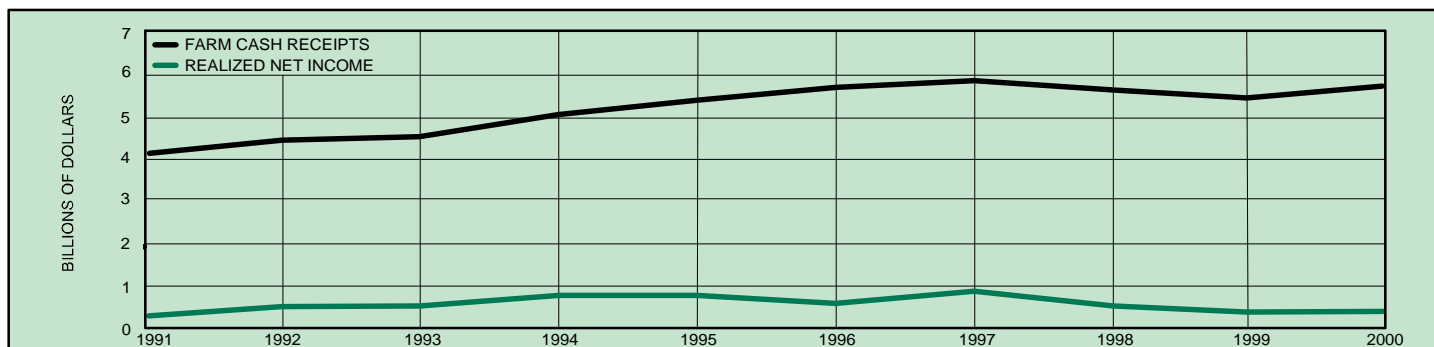

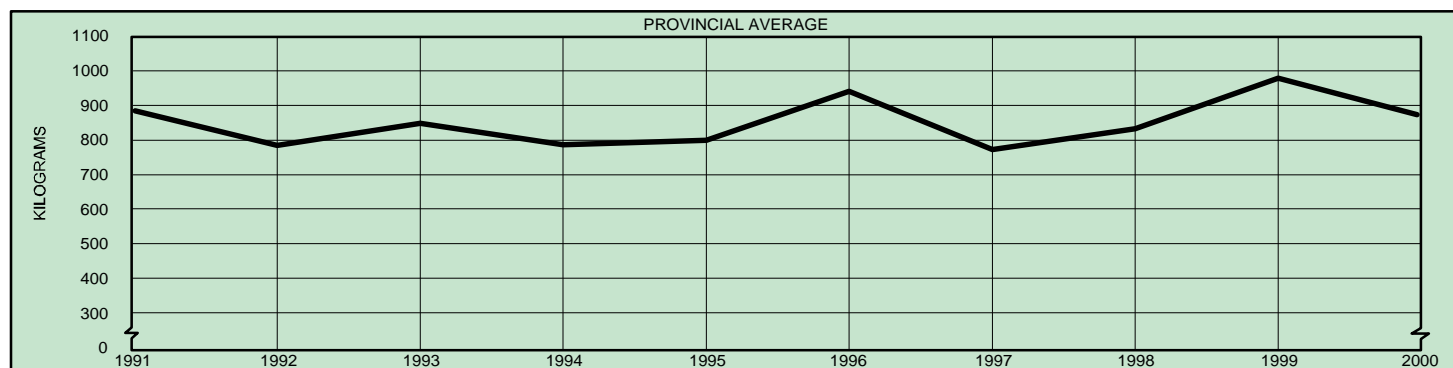

Table 39: Average Wheat Yields by Crop District, Saskatchewan



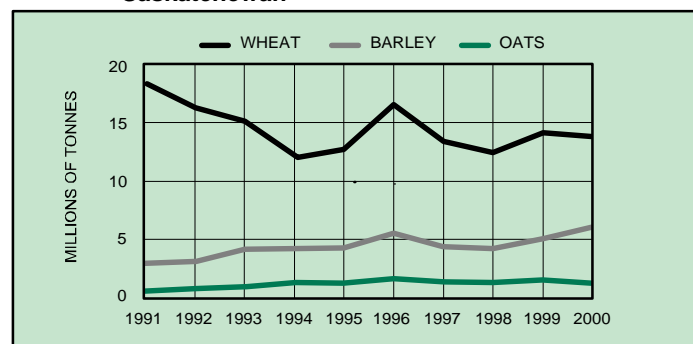

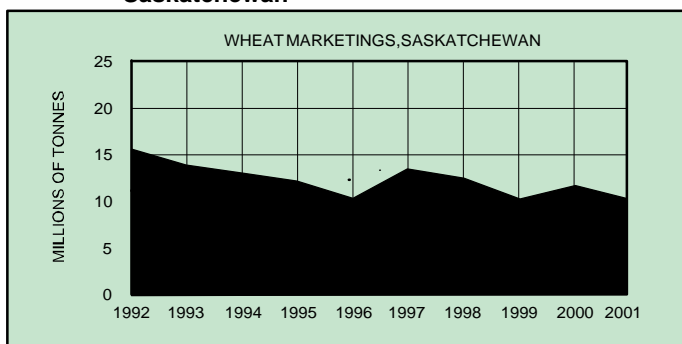

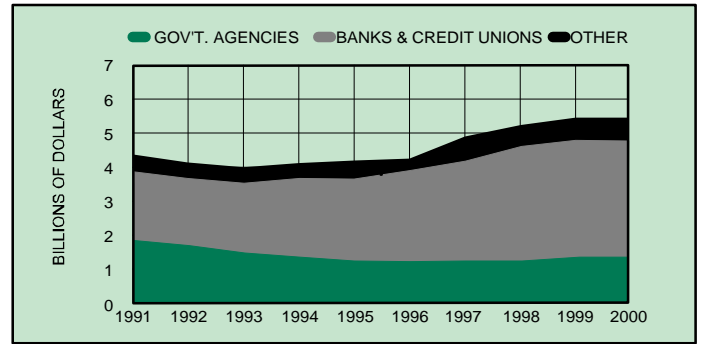

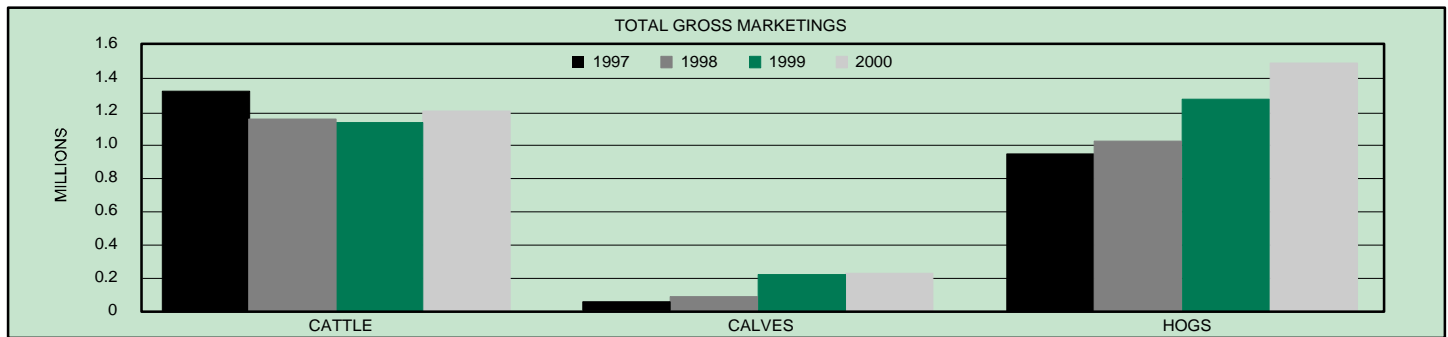

Table 44: Gross Marketings of Livestock by Crop District, Saskatchewan



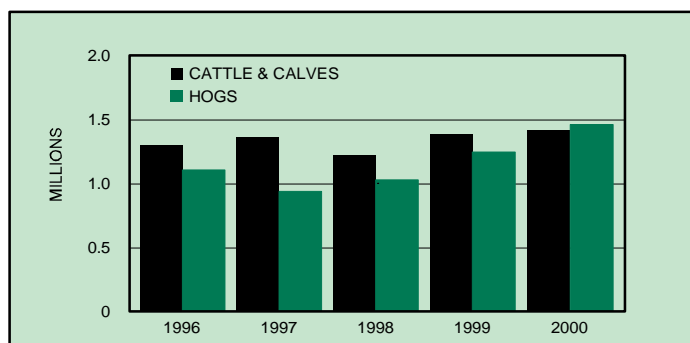

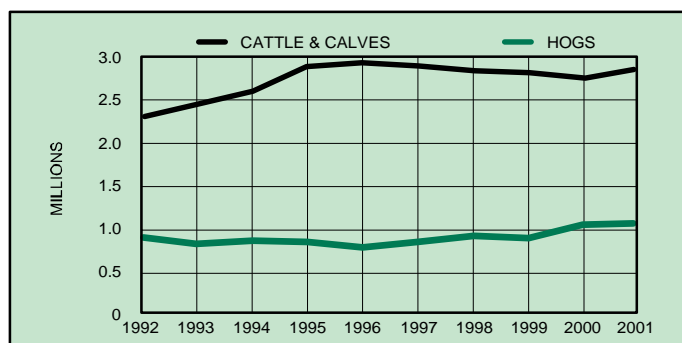

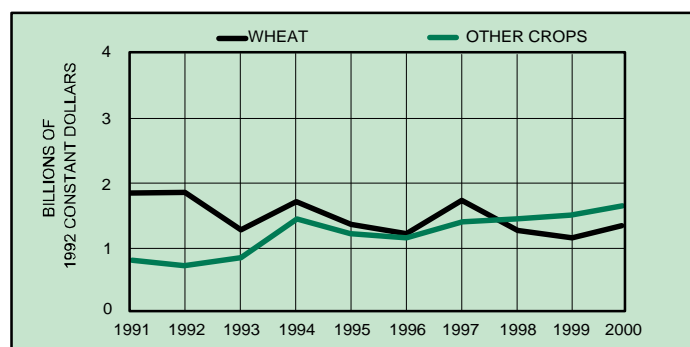

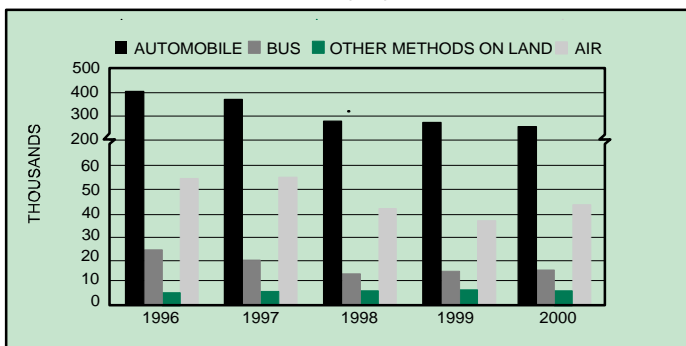

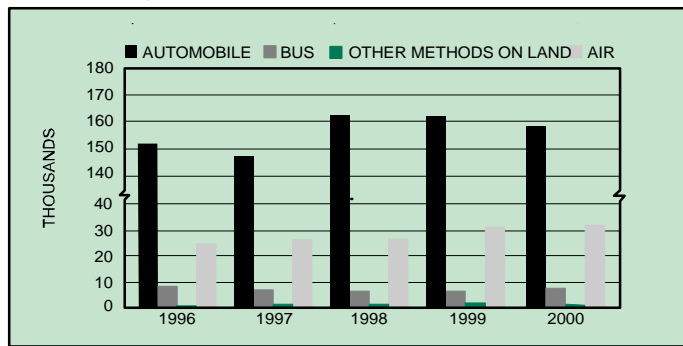

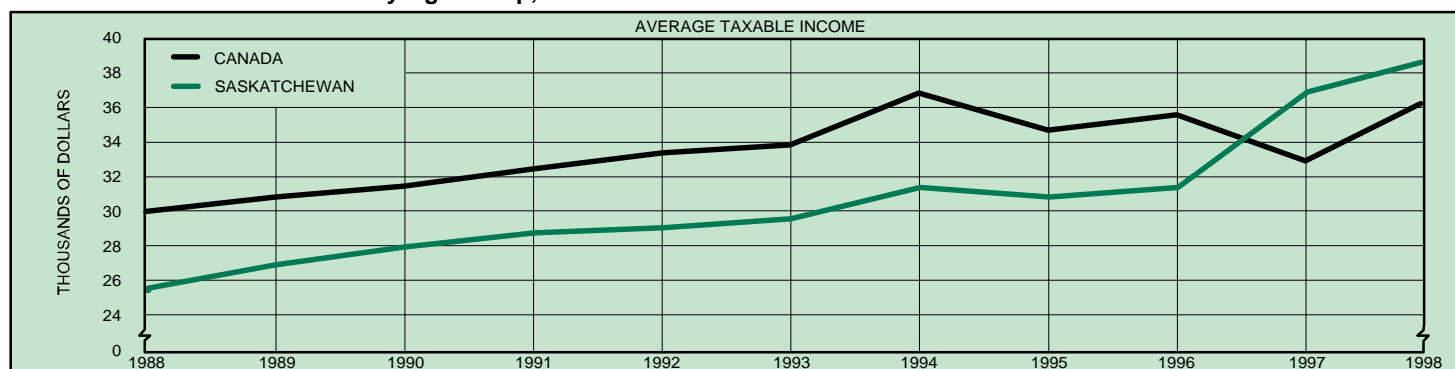
Table 52: United States Visitors Entering Saskatchewan by Type of Transportation

Table 53: Income Tax Statistics by Age Group, Saskatchewan and Canada



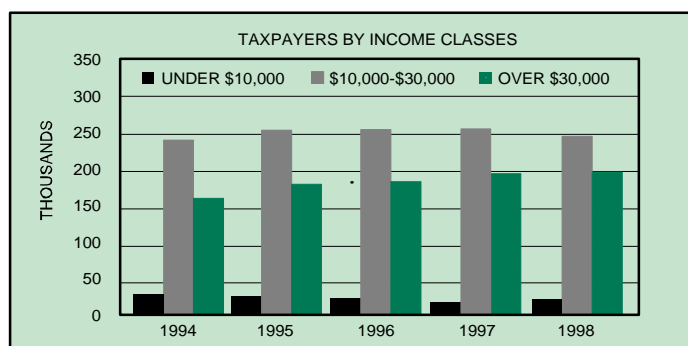

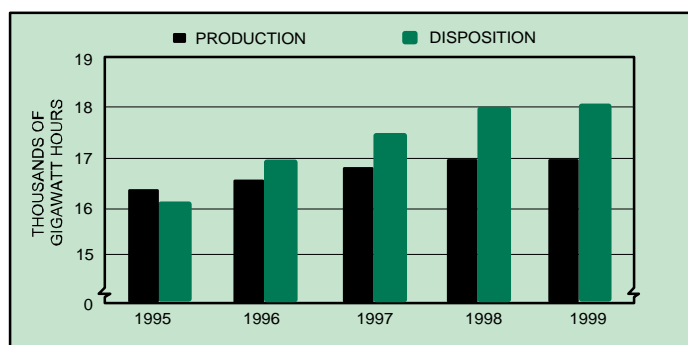

Table 59: Number of Locations and Total Receipts for Major Accommodation Groups, Saskatchewan

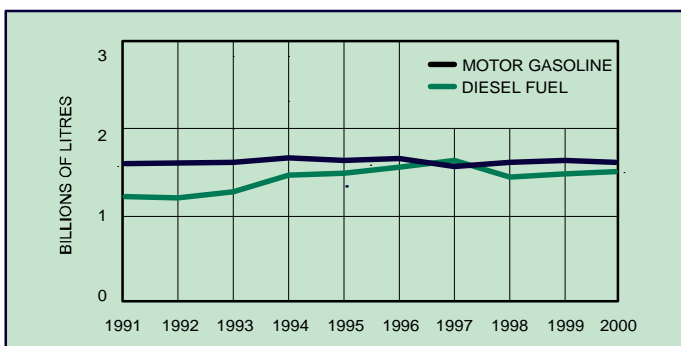

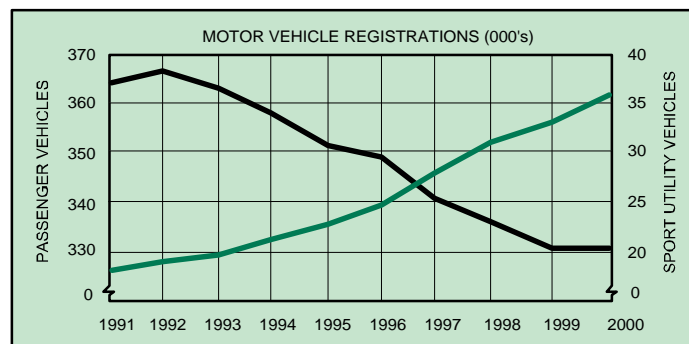

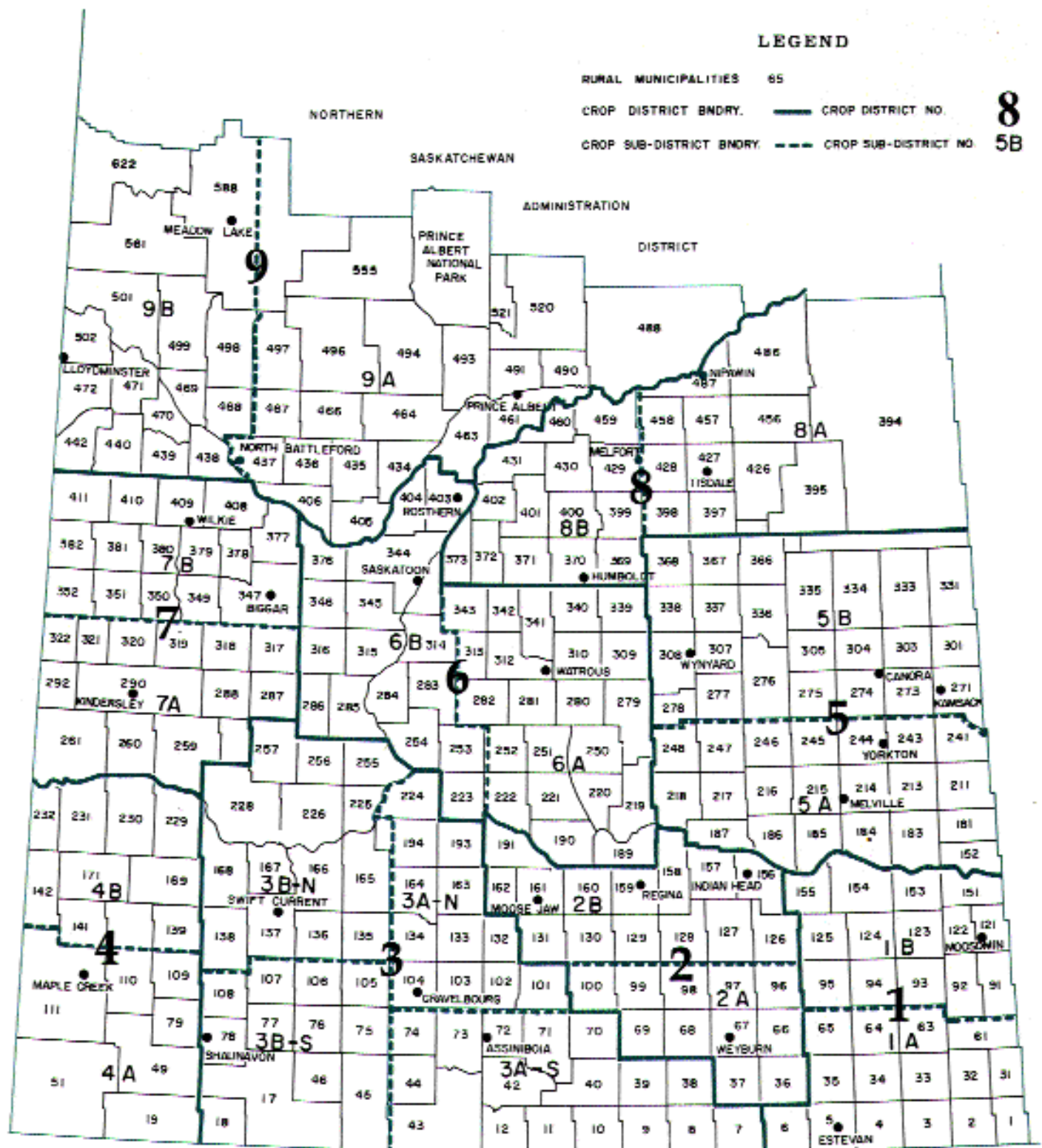

SASKATCHEWAN BY CENSUS DIVISION

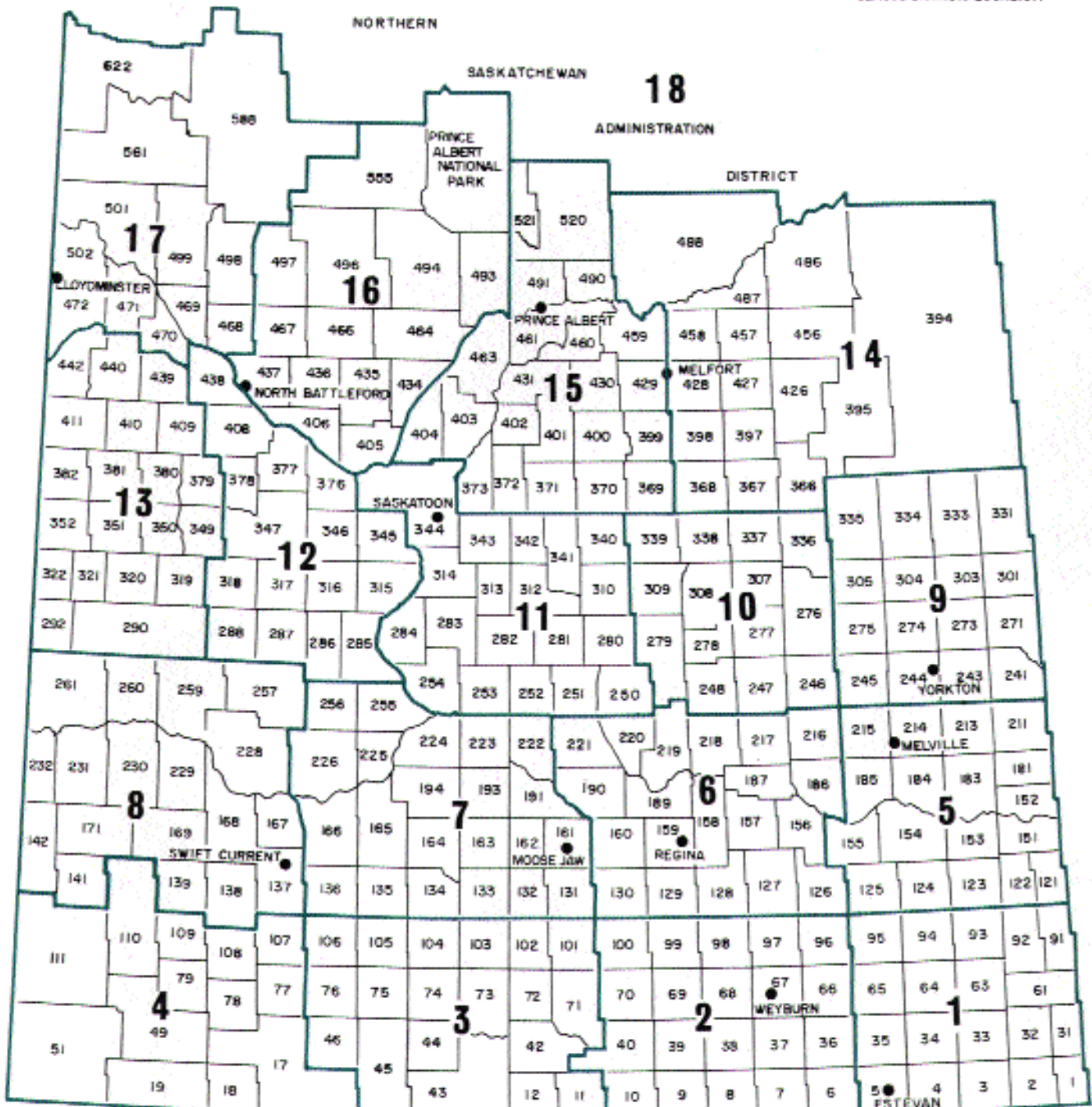

Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has developed a set of economic accounts which can be used to trace the development and growth of the Saskatchewan economy.

The purpose of the accounts is to measure the value of economic activity in each sector of the economy. This is done by means of a balancing set of accounts similar to the annual income and expenditure statements of a commercial enterprise.

The accounts have many useful functions. They consolidate information which is now provided through a number of scattered sources and organize it into a central framework. This allows many kinds of economic analysis to be performed ranging from monitoring current economic performance to analysis of structural change in the economy.

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has available upon request, many more detailed tables and other information concerning the Saskatchewan Economic Accounts.

Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

Saskatchewan Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the total value of goods and services produced annually in the province. By removing the effects of inflation, it is possible to measure the volume of output. After adjusting for price changes, Saskatchewan's real Gross Domestic Product increased by 4.7 percent in 2000.

In nominal terms, Saskatchewan's GDP increased by 11.1 percent in 2000 to \$33,482 million. Personal expenditure on consumer goods and services rose by 4.7 percent as consumers increased spending in all categories. Spending rose by 4.8 percent on durable goods, 4.7 percent on non-durable goods and 4.9 percent on services. Government current expenditure on goods and services rose by 4.9 percent in 2000.

Total investment decreased by 1.7 percent in 2000. Mining, manufacturing and wholesale and retail trade saw increases in investment. However, this was offset by decreases in all other industries. Transportation decreased 46.3 percent, investment in utilities decreased 15.3 percent and public administration saw investment fall by 6.2 percent.

The value of physical change in inventories was positive in 2000, reflecting increased crop inventories.

Nominal exports increased by 18.9 percent over 1999 levels. The overall increase followed from increases in grain and livestock exports, as well as crude oil, natural gas and electricity. Exports of wholesale and manufactured goods also rose. Nominal imports rose 6.5 percent in 1999. In real terms, exports rose by 8.3 percent and imports rose by 2.7 percent in 2000.

Real personal expenditure on consumer goods and services increased by 2.9 percent, government expenditures on goods and services increased by 2.2 percent, while real gross fixed capital formation decreased by 1.1 percent. Final domestic demand for goods and services by individuals, the government and for investment purposes increased by 1.8 percent in 2000.

This document represents an update to the Saskatchewan economic accounts, released in June 2000. Periodic revisions are common to all economic series to improve the accuracy, reliability and consistency of the data.
