

Overview

Saskatchewan's real economic growth, as measured by the rate of increase in real Gross Domestic Product (real GDP), slowed to an annual rate of 0.9 per cent in 2006. This deceleration occurred after three consecutive years of above average growth.

But while the overall growth rate eased, several components of real GDP show extra-ordinary strength, suggesting the provincial economy was actually stronger. The apparent weakness was concentrated in a few components.

Real GDP

Real GDP measures the volume of goods and services produced in the Province. In 2006, the rate of growth in the Province's real GDP moderated to 0.9 per cent.

The deceleration stemmed from a larger-than expected draw down in farm inventories as farmers harvested less but sold more crops in the past year, and a surge in imports. The value of physical change in farm

inventories subtracted 3.4 per cent from real GDP growth and imports deducted 2.4 per cent from the same.

Investment posted phenomenal growth in 2006 even after adjusting for inflation. Real investments rose by 8.8 percent led by a 24.0 per cent increase in purchases of machinery and equipment, 9.2 per cent growth in non-residential building construction and 5.9 per cent increase in residential construction. As a whole, investment contributed 1.9 per cent to real GDP growth last year.

Real consumer expenditures increased at an annual annual rate of 3.6 per cent and contributed 1.8 per cent to real GDP growth in 2006. As well, real government expenditures increased by 3.1 per cent and contributed 0.6 per cent to real GDP growth

Real final domestic demand, which puts real investment, real consumer expenditures and real government expenditures together, went up by 4.7 per cent in 2006.

As seen at the top of the next page, real exports edged up just 2.1 per cent due to the lower volume of potash and uranium sold in 2006. Supported by a strong Canadian dollar and strong domestic demand, real imports outstripped real exports. Consequently, real net trade, which is the difference after subtracting real imports from real exports, took away 0.9 per cent from real GDP growth in 2006.

Current-dollar GDP

Current-dollar GDP measures the market value of all goods and services produced in the Province.

According to this measure, Saskatchewan's economy expanded at an annual rate of 5.7 per cent in 2006.

Investment grew by 8.6 per cent. Consumer expenditures advanced by 5.0 per cent and government expenditures, 6.3 per cent. Final domestic demand, which is the sum of all these components, grew by 6.1 per cent.

The market value of exports went up by 5.3 per cent last year as a result of strong commodity prices and imports increased by 2.8 per cent.

Real GDP by Industry

Real GDP by industry tracks the industries that grew and the industries that declined in 2006.

Real GDP in agriculture decreased by 7.2 per cent as farmers harvested a smaller crop. Mining real GDP decreased by 6.6 per cent as a result of lower potash and uranium output. Manufacturing and construction real GDP grew by 3.5 per cent and 5.3 per cent, respectively. Service-producing industries registered a 2.9 per cent gain.

Chart 3: Real GDP by Industry




Chart 4: Current-dollar GDP & Components

Other Key Indicators

Employment expanded at a solid pace last year. More than 8,000 net new jobs were added bringing the total employment roll to 491,600 in 2006.

The magnitude of the job gain pushed the Province's unemployment rate down to 4.7 per cent and helped boost labour income. Higher employment and labour income contributed to a pick up in housing and retail



trade.

The Province's total wage bill jumped by 7.2 per cent last year and housing starts increased by 8.1 per cent, the second highest growth posted by any province. Retail trade grew by 6.0 per cent.

Corporation profits rose for the fifth year in a row. Buoyant global demand and strong commodity prices continued to support corporation profits in 2006, lifting it by 8.6 per cent, following growth of 25.6 per cent in 2004 and 24.0 per cent in 2005. Likewise, incomes of unincorporated businesses in Saskatchewan registered an impressive annual gain of 12.6 per cent last year.









Table 37: Gross Farm Operating Expenses and Depreciation Charges, Saskatchewan



Table 38: Acreage Sown to Wheat by Crop District, Saskatchewan








SASKATCHEWAN BY CENSUS DIVISION



Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has developed a set of economic accounts which can be used to trace the development and growth of the Saskatchewan economy.

The purpose of the accounts is to measure the value of economic activity in each sector of the economy. This is done by means of a balancing set of accounts similar to the annual income and expenditure statements of a commercial enterprise.

The accounts have many useful functions. They consolidate information which is now provided through a number of scattered sources and organize it into a central framework. This allows many kinds of economic analysis to be performed ranging from monitoring current economic performance to analysis of structural change in the economy.

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has adopted the Chain Fisher volume index methodology for calculating real Gross Domestic Product (GDP). This method of calculating real growth in the economy removes potential substitution bias that exists when using a constant-dollar method (the Laspeyres index).

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has available, upon request, many more detailed tables and other information concerning the Saskatchewan Economic Accounts.

Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

Saskatchewan Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the total value of goods and services produced annually in the province. By controlling for the effects of inflation, it is possible to measure the volume of output at the economy-wide level. After adjusting for price changes, Saskatchewan's real Gross Domestic Product increased by 0.9 per cent in 2006 (chained 1997 prices).

In nominal terms, Saskatchewan's GDP increased by 5.7 per cent in 2006 to \$45,822 million. Personal expenditure on consumer goods and services rose by 5.0 per cent. Spending rose by 6.3 per cent on durable goods, 4.2 per cent on non-durable goods and 5.1 per cent on services. Government current expenditure on goods and services rose by 6.3 per cent in 2006. Total investment increased by 8.6 per cent in 2006.

In 2006, nominal exports increased 5.3 per cent from 2005 levels. Nominal imports increased by 2.8 per cent in 2006. In real terms, exports increased by 2.1 per cent while imports increased by 3.8 per cent in 2006.

Personal income in Saskatchewan rose by 3.3 per cent in 2006. Wages, salaries and supplementary incomes (on a Gross National Product basis) rose 6.9 per cent and net income of non-farm unincorporated businesses increased

by 3.9 per cent, but net income received by farm operators fell to negative (-) \$120 million. After subtracting direct taxes, contributions to social insurance plans, and pension plan contributions, personal disposable income rose by 3.2 per cent. However, personal savings remained negative in 2006 (-\$736 million).

Real personal expenditure on consumer goods and services increased by 3.6 per cent, government expenditures on goods and services increased by 3.1 per cent and real gross fixed capital formation increased by 8.9 percent. Final domestic demand for goods and services by individuals, the government and for investment purposes increased by 4.7 per cent in 2006.

This document represents the initial release of the Saskatchewan economic accounts for 2006 data. Periodic revisions are common to all economic series, as more comprehensive data is obtained, in order to improve the accuracy, reliability and consistency of the data. These revisions will be available in late 2007.
