## 2015 In Review

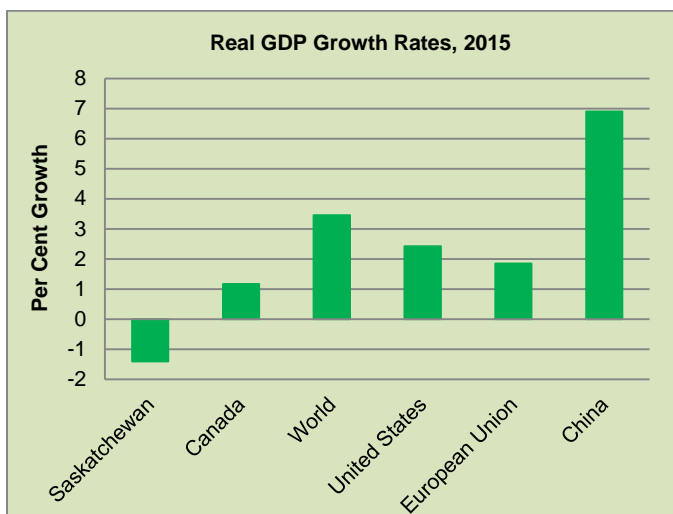
### Introduction

In 2015, Saskatchewan's economy was buffeted by low world oil prices, primarily brought about by increased supply from the United States. After declining steeply in the last half of 2014, the world price of oil remained low throughout 2015, with consequent declines in Saskatchewan's oil-related economic activities. Despite the low price of oil, though, other sectors of Saskatchewan's economy proved resilient enough to bring about increases in both total employment and population.

### Global Economic Growth

The United States, Saskatchewan's largest trading partner, grew by 2.4 per cent in 2015, well above its 10-year average of 1.6 per cent. Canada's economy grew by 0.9 per cent in 2015, well below its 10-year average of 1.7 per cent.

China and the European Union, two important markets for Saskatchewan, were both boosted by lower energy prices. The European Union continued to recover from the Euro crisis and expanded by 1.8 per cent, above its 10-year average of 1.0 per cent. China's economy continued to slow as its industrial revolution nears completion growing by 6.9 per cent, lower than its 10-year average of 9.5 per cent.



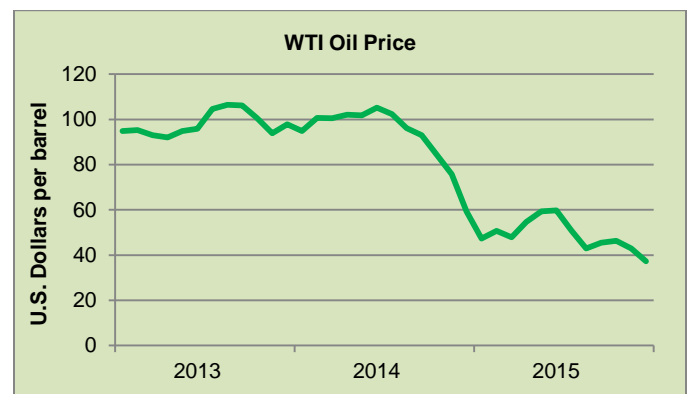

In 2015, the global economy grew by 3.5 per cent, slightly below the 10-year average of 3.7 per cent. Saskatchewan's economy contracted 1.4 per cent, below its 10-year average growth of 2.0 per cent.

Saskatchewan's negative growth in 2015 was mainly the result of the steep decline in oil prices.

### Oil & Natural Gas

During 2014 the price of oil dropped 50 per cent. In 2013, oil averaged \$98 U.S. dollars per barrel. In 2015, oil averaged \$49 U.S. dollars per barrel.



The sudden and dramatic decline in oil prices had a significant impact on the provincial economy, most notably in the oil industry itself, but also in supporting industries and tax revenue.

In 2015, a total of 1,834 oil and natural gas wells were drilled, this is about half the 3,665 wells drilled in 2014 and is the least number of wells drilled since 1998.

In 2015, Saskatchewan produced 28.2 million cubic meters of oil, a decline of 1.6 million cubic meters from the previous year.

### The Canadian Dollar

The Canadian dollar followed the price of oil down. This cushioned the impact of the fall in oil prices because many Saskatchewan exports are priced in U.S. dollars, thus increasing the Canadian dollar value of all our exports sold in American dollars.

## Potash

In 2015, the average price of a tonne of potash (K<sub>2</sub>O) was \$575.44/tonne, up from \$508.19/tonne in 2014. Potash production increased from 10.2 million tonnes in 2014, to 11.1 million tonnes in 2015. Potash is Saskatchewan's second-largest export with \$6.1 billion in sales in 2015, up from \$5.7 billion in 2014.

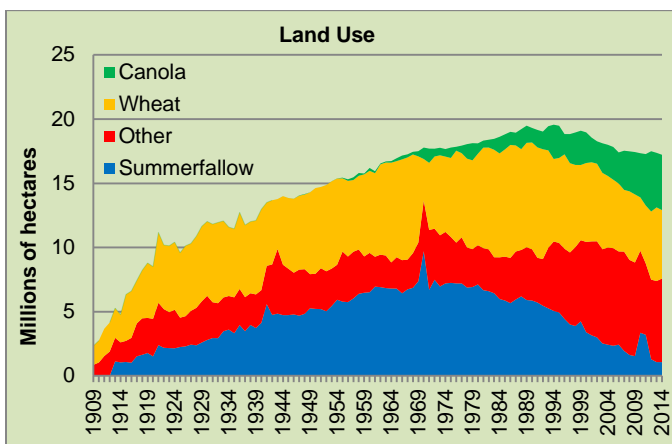
The United States accounts for a little over half of Saskatchewan's potash exports with Brazil, Indonesia, China, India and Malaysia making up the bulk of the remainder.

## Agriculture

Saskatchewan farmers had a good year in 2015. Wheat yields across the province averaged 2,500kg/hectare, slightly above the 10-year average of 2,460kg/hectare. Canola yields averaged 2,000kg/hectare, second only to the record-setting year in 2013 and above the 10-year average of 1,750kg/hectare. Above-average yields also occurred in barley, oats, and flax.

Total production across all crop types was 32,241,400 tonnes, the second highest behind 2013.

Total land used for crops continued its long term downward trend falling to 17,203,100 hectares in 2015, the lowest since 1966.



Net farm cash income from operations hit an all-time high of \$5.8 billion in 2015, surpassing the previous record of \$4.5 billion in 2014. Lower fuel costs, high cattle prices, an above-average harvest and continued

inventory liquidation were the primary drivers of the record-setting year.

## Employment & Income

Saskatchewan added 2,800 new jobs in 2015, however the unemployment rate increased to 5.0 per cent from 3.8 percent in 2014. The unemployment rate increased despite the increase in jobs because the total size of the labour force increased by 10,400 to 604,100 people.

Average weekly earnings increased 3.8 per cent in 2015, and in the past five years have increased 12.1 per cent.

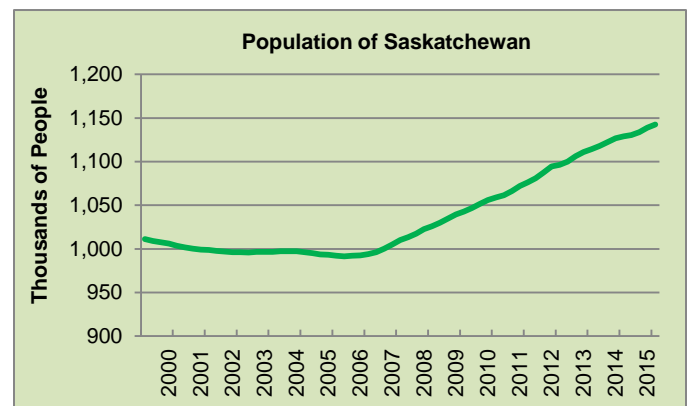
Despite the low price of oil, the mining oil and gas sector continued to offer the highest average wages in the province at \$41.70 per hour.

## Investment

New capital investment in 2015 was \$16.5 billion, down \$3.5 billion from \$20.0 billion in 2014. Most of the declines were in mining and oil and gas extraction sectors which declined by \$3.8 billion.

## Population

In 2015, there were 15,743 births and 9,846 deaths in Saskatchewan, resulting in a natural population increase of 5,897. Additionally, there were 7,612 more people that moved to Saskatchewan than left. Combined, the natural increase and net migration resulted in a total population increase of 13,509 over the year. At the end of 2015, the population of Saskatchewan reached a record high of 1,142,570.



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## **Retail Trade**

Retail trade declined slightly from the record-breaking year in 2014, to \$18.6 billion in 2015, a decline of \$553 million.

## **Utilities**

In 2015, electricity use has increased to 24,744 GWh, up 320 MWh from 2014.

Natural gas continues to provide a growing share of the province's electricity needs, increasing by about 16 per cent from the previous year. Natural gas now makes up 32.6 per cent of the province's total generating capacity, up from 17.7 per cent in 2010.

## **Conclusion**

The Saskatchewan economy was affected by low oil prices during 2015. Reduced investment in the oil sector

and the value of oil sales were major contributors to the decline in real GDP. Other sectors of the economy, however, showed resilience. Agricultural and metals production were up, as was investment outside the oil sector in projects such as the Regina Bypass and the Saskatoon Children's Hospital.

Overall, despite the disruption caused by the collapse in oil prices, Saskatchewan's economy exhibited a degree of diversity sufficient to support an increase in wages, employment, the labour force, and population. Moreover, though investment in new capital in Saskatchewan declined in 2015, the province's per capita investment is still more than double the Canadian average. As the world oil market makes the transition from excess supply to a rebalancing of supply and demand, these fundamental indicators bode well for future prosperity in Saskatchewan.

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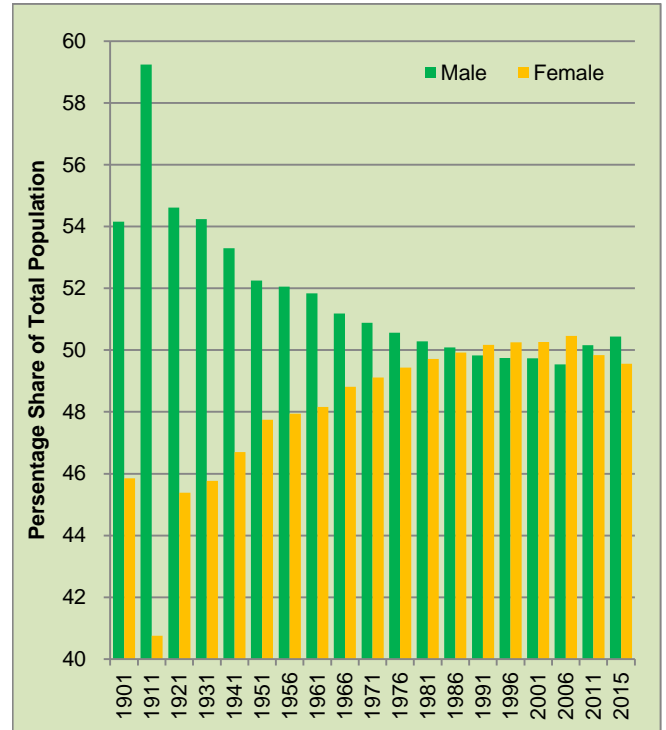
