## 2016 In Review

### Introduction

In 2016, real economic activity in Saskatchewan contracted for the second year in a row. Major factors in the contraction emanated from non-renewable resource markets. Oil prices, after declining steeply in the last half of 2014, remained low throughout 2015 and 2016, with consequent declines in Saskatchewan's oil-related economic activities. Compounding this was a significant decline in the price of potash. Robust growth in agriculture, however, provided a partial offset. Total crop production was at a near-record level, and the agriculture industry experienced benefits from low oil and potash prices.

### Global Economic Growth

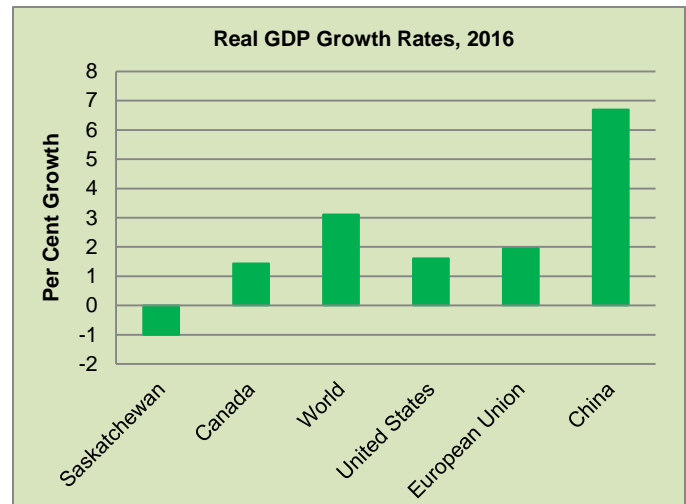
In 2016, the global economy grew by 3.1 per cent, below the 10-year average of 3.5 per cent.

Canada's economy grew by 1.4 per cent in 2016, slightly below its 10-year average of 1.5 per cent. Canada's economy was held back by recessions in the oil producing regions.

The United States, Saskatchewan's largest trading partner, grew by 1.6 per cent in 2016, above its 10-year average of 1.3 per cent.

China and the European Union, two important markets for Saskatchewan, were both boosted by lower energy prices. The European Union expanded by 2.0 per cent, well above its 10-year average of 1.0 per cent. China's economy grew by 6.7 per cent in 2016. China's growth rate is comparatively high, but lower than its 10-year average of 9.0 per cent due to its transition from industrial to service-based output.

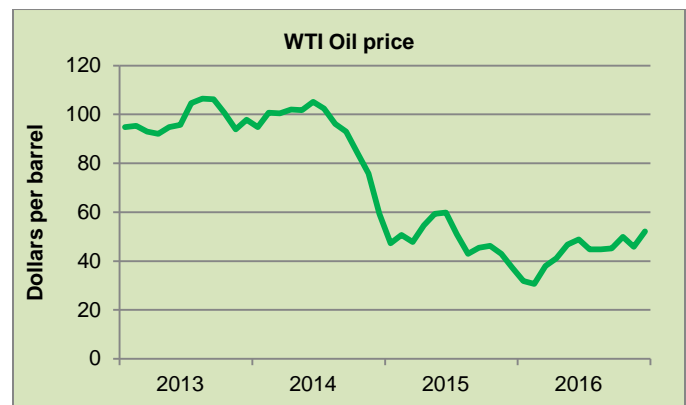
Saskatchewan's economy, measured by real GDP at basic prices, contracted 1.0 per cent, well below its 10-year average growth of 2.2 per cent. Saskatchewan's negative growth in 2016 was mainly the result of continuing adjustments in the oil sector as well as a decline in the price of potash.

### Oil & Natural Gas

In 2013, oil averaged US\$98 per barrel. At the end of 2014, the price of oil dropped 50 per cent. In 2015, oil averaged US\$49 per barrel. Prices did not recover in 2016, averaging US\$43 per barrel.

In 2016, a total of 1,736 oil and natural gas wells were drilled. This is less than half the 3,761 wells drilled in 2014 and is the least number of wells drilled since 1998.

In 2016, Saskatchewan produced 26.7 million cubic meters of oil, a decline of 1.5 million cubic meters from the previous year.

The decline in oil prices dominated Saskatchewan's narrative in 2016, while the greatest effects were felt in

the oil industry itself; ripples have spread significantly affecting construction, manufacturing and tax revenue.

## Potash

In 2016, the average price of a tonne of potash (K<sub>2</sub>O) was \$373.19/tonne, down from \$575.44/tonne in 2015. However, potash production increased from 10.6 million tonnes in 2015, to 10.9 million tonnes in 2016. The value of potash exports declined 29 per cent from 2015 to 2016 to \$4.7 billion.

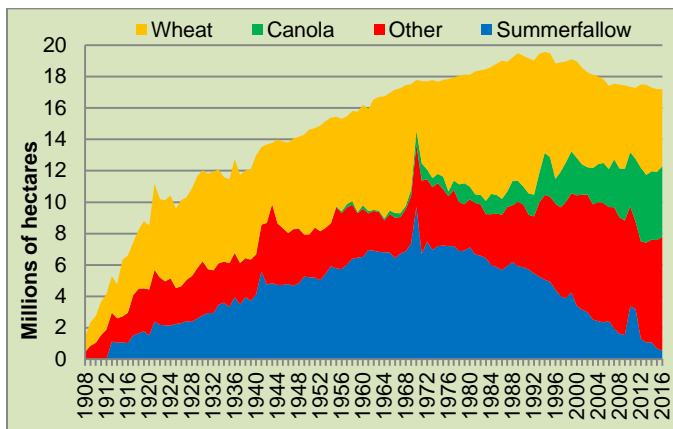
The United States accounts for a little over half of Saskatchewan's potash exports with Brazil, Indonesia, China, and India making up the bulk of the remainder.

## Agriculture

Wheat yields across the province averaged 3,200kg/hectare, tying the record set in 2013, and significantly above the 10-year average of 2,527kg/hectare. Canola yields averaged 2,300kg/hectare, the highest ever recorded and well above the 10-year average of 1,809kg/hectare. Record setting yields were also reported for barley, canary seed, mustard seed, and rye.

Total production across all crop types was 35.6 million tonnes, the second highest behind 2013.

A total of 17,205,100 hectares of land was under cultivation in 2016. The use of summerfallow continued its downward trend reaching 546,300 hectares, the lowest level since record keeping began in 1913.

Total net farm income in 2016 was \$4.1 billion, second only to the \$5.9 billion in 2013, and \$0.5 billion more than in 2015. Cash income from the sale of crops hit an all-time high of \$11.4 billion, despite an increase in inventories of \$404 million.

## Employment & Income

Saskatchewan lost 5,200 jobs in 2016, and the unemployment rate increased to 6.3 per cent, up from 5.0 per cent in 2015 and 3.8 per cent in 2014. Despite the loss of jobs, Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 2,700 to 606,800 people.

Average weekly earnings increased 0.7 per cent in 2016, less than the 1.1 per cent rate of inflation.

Despite declines in the mining, oil and gas sector, the industry continued to offer the highest average wages in the province at \$1,960 per week.

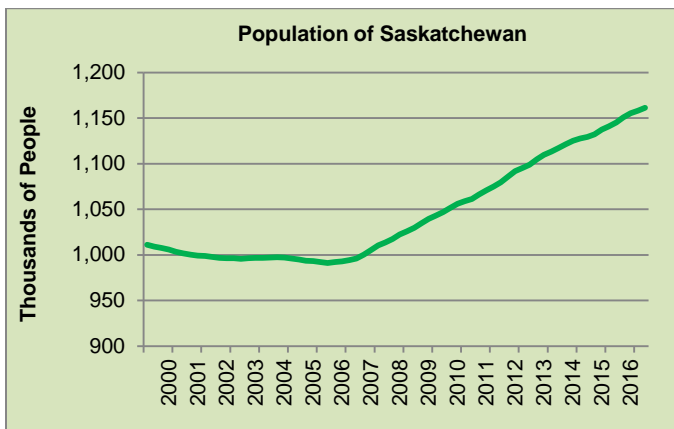
## Investment

New capital investment in 2016 was \$14.1 billion, down \$2.7 billion from 2015 and down \$5.9 billion from 2014. Most of the declines were in the mining, oil and gas sector which, since 2014, has declined by \$6.3 billion.

## Population

In 2016, there were 16,114 births, the highest since 1989, and 9,660 deaths, the highest ever recorded, resulting in a natural population increase of 6,454. Additionally, there were 10,763 more people that moved to Saskatchewan than left. Combined, the natural increase and net migration resulted in a total population increase of 17,217 over the year. At the end of 2016, the population of Saskatchewan reached a record high of 1,158,339.

2016 was a census year. The census recorded a population increase of 64,970 people between May 10, 2011 and May 10, 2016. However, it will take until October 2018 before all the census data is analyzed and incorporated into all of Statistics Canada's products. Revisions to many products can be expected over the next year.

### Retail Trade

Retail trade increased slightly in 2016 to \$18.8 billion, an increase of \$109 million over 2015. On a per capita basis, retail trade declined by \$167 per person to \$16,251.

### Vehicles

In 2001, 92 per cent of all vehicles registered in Saskatchewan were powered by gasoline, however, by 2016 that share had fallen to 75 per cent. The relative decline in gasoline powered vehicles was primarily caused by an increase in diesel and flex fuel vehicles, which increased by 5 per cent and 11 per cent of the vehicle fleet respectively.

### Utilities

In 2016, electricity use increased to 24,169 GWh, up 425 MWh from 2015.

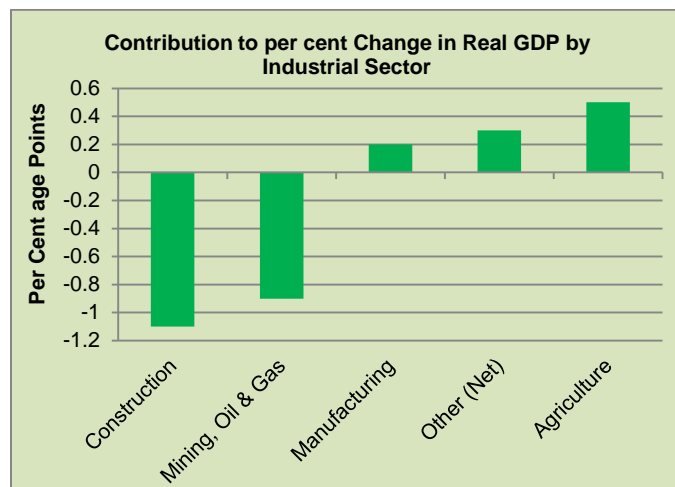
Natural gas continues to provide a growing share of the province’s electricity needs, increasing by about 9.4 per cent from the previous year. Natural gas now makes up 36.1 per cent of the province’s electricity supply, up from 17.7 per cent in 2010. Continuing this trend

SaskPower began construction on the 350-MW natural gas-fired Chinook power station near Swift Current.

On the telecommunications front, Moose Jaw became the first city in western Canada to be completely serviced by fiber optics.

### Conclusion

In 2016, the Saskatchewan economy continued to be affected by low or falling commodity prices. In particular, the year saw continued low oil prices and a decline in potash prices. Overall, real GDP at basic prices contracted by 1.0 per cent. This overall contraction was reflected in declines in a number of economic indicators, including employment and investment.

Diversity in the Saskatchewan economy, though, served to offset some of these negative effects. Notably, the agriculture industry recorded strong results in terms of total crop production and experienced restrained input costs for oil and potash, resulting in strong cash income from the sale of crops and total net farm income.
