

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

August 2008

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between July 2008 and August 2008 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.2 percent. The Regina All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.1 percent, while the Saskatoon All-items Index was unchanged during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the August All-items Index increased from July 2008 primarily due to higher prices for mortgage interest cost, housing replacement cost and rent. Prices also rose for bakery products, fresh fruit, personal care services and personal care supplies and equipment.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for gasoline, women's and men's clothing, and telephone services. Prices also fell for fresh vegetables, sugar and confectionery and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.4 percent between August 2007 and August 2008 while the Canada All-items Index increased 3.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.7 percent and 3.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The August All-items Index increased from August 2007 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, mortgage interest cost, housing replacement cost and rent. Prices also rose for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, other owned accommodation expenses and food purchased from restaurants.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, women's and men's clothing and natural gas. Prices also fell for the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and home entertainment equipment – parts and services.
