

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

September 2008

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.3 percent between August 2008 and September 2008 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.4 percent and 0.2 percent, respectively, during the same period

In Saskatchewan, the September All-items Index increased from August 2008 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, women's clothing and mortgage interest cost. Prices also rose for furniture, food purchased from restaurants, personal care supplies and equipment, and other lessons, courses, and education services.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, intercity transportation, and housing replacement cost. Prices also fell for bakery products, other food preparations, fresh vegetables, and non-alcoholic beverages.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.4 percent between September 2007 and September 2008 while the Canada All-items Index increased 3.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.7 percent and 3.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The September All-items Index increased from September 2007 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, mortgage interest cost, and housing replacement cost. Prices also rose for rent, food purchased from restaurants, bakery products, and other owned accommodation expenses.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, natural gas, and the purchase and leasing of recreational vehicles. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services excluding recreational vehicles, home entertainment equipment, parts, and services, womens' clothing, and prescribed medicines.
