

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

December 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.4 percent between November 2010 and December 2010 while the Canada All-items Index was unchanged. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index fell 0.4 percent and 0.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the December All-items Index decreased from November 2010 primarily due to lower prices for furniture, women's clothing, men's clothing and children's clothing. Prices also fell for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, household appliances and traveller accommodations.

Moderating these decreases were price increases for gasoline, food purchased from restaurants, bakery products, fresh vegetables and sugar and confectionery. Prices also rose for personal care supplies and equipment and cigarettes.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.0 percent between December 2009 and December 2010 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.0 percent and 1.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The December All-items Index increased from December 2009 primarily due to price increases for gasoline, food purchased from restaurants, and the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles. Prices also rose for electricity, rent, housing replacement cost and homeowners home and mortgage insurance.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for prescribed medicines, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), natural gas and household appliances. Prices also fell for women's clothing, men's clothing and passenger vehicles insurance premiums.
