

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.1 percent between June 2010 and July 2010 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.5 percent. The Regina All-items Consumer Price Index fell 0.1 percent while the Saskatoon Index rose 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index decreased from June 2010 due to lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, gasoline, and fresh vegetables. Prices also fell for personal care supplies and equipment, homeowners' maintenance and repairs, processed meat, and inter-city transportation.

Offsetting these decreases were higher prices for traveller accommodation, men's clothing, and other food preparations. Prices also rose for non-alcoholic beverages, non-prescribed medicines, bakery products, and mortgage interest cost.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.4 percent between July 2009 and July 2010 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.8 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 0.7 percent and 0.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2009 primarily due to higher prices for rent, food purchased from restaurants, and replacement (new housing) cost. Prices also rose for cigarettes, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, water, and health care services.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, prescribed medicines, and property taxes (including special charges). Prices also fell for natural gas, gasoline, fresh fruit, and home entertainment equipment, parts, and services.
