

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2011

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between June 2011 and July 2011 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index increased from June 2011 due to higher prices for women's clothing, men's clothing, traveller accommodation and cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television). Prices also fell for processed meat and beer purchased from stores.

Offsetting these increases were lower prices for gasoline, non-prescription medicines, fresh fruit and fresh vegetables. Prices also declined for paper plastic and foil supplies, inter-city transport and purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.8 percent between July 2010 and July 2011 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.9 percent and 2.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2010 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, cablevision and satellite service (including pay per view television) and electricity. Prices also rose for rent and food purchased from restaurants.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for natural gas, prescribed medicines, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and home entertainment, parts and services. Prices also fell for women's clothing, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and furniture.
