

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

April 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.5 percent between March 2012 and April 2012 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.5 percent, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the April All-items Index increased from March 2012 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs and homeowners' maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television), home entertainment equipment, parts and services and fresh fruit.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for natural gas, women's clothing, furniture and traveller accommodation. Prices also fell for processed meat, fresh vegetables and dairy products.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.1 percent between April 2011 and April 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.4 percent and 2.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The April All-items Index increased from April 2011 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, mortgage interest cost, rent and homeowners' replacement cost. Prices also increased for telephone services, passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs and fresh fruit.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for natural gas, furniture, fresh vegetables and home entertainment equipment, parts and services. Prices also declined for personal care supplies and equipment, sugar and confectionery and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles).
