

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.3 percent between May 2012 and June 2012 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index fell 0.3 percent in both cities during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index decreased from May 2012 primarily due to lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, gasoline, home entertainment, parts and services and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles. Prices also fell for men's clothing, footwear and fresh fruit.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for furniture, traveller accommodations, rent and homeowners' maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for dairy products, non-prescribed medicines and non-alcoholic beverages.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.0 percent between June 2011 and June 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.1 percent and 1.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2011 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for rent, mortgage interest cost, homeowners' replacement cost and women's clothing.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for natural gas, gasoline, home entertainment equipment, parts and services and furniture. Prices also fell for fresh vegetables, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and prescribed medicines.
