

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2013

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.2 percent between June 2013 and July 2013 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index decreased from June 2013 primarily due to lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, gasoline, passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles. Prices also fell for women's clothing, footwear, and seeds, plants and cut flowers.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for other household services, traveller's accommodation, cigarettes and men's clothing. Prices also rose for other food preparations, fresh or frozen pork and cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television).

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.6 percent between July 2012 and July 2013 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.8 percent and 1.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2012 primarily due to higher prices for food purchased from restaurants, cigarettes, electricity and purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles. Prices also rose for other household services, rent and women's clothing.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, home entertainment equipment, parts and services and mortgage interest cost. Prices also fell for travel tours, seeds, plants and cut flowers, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and men's clothing.
