

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2013

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between May 2013 and June 2013 while the Canada All-items Index remained unchanged. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.2 percent and 0.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index increased from May 2013 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, furniture, fresh vegetables and inter-city transportation. Prices also rose for rent, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and household textiles.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for men's clothing, footwear, children's clothing (including infants) and other food preparations. Prices also fell for fresh or frozen chicken, bakery products and sugar and confectionery.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.7 percent between June 2012 and June 2013 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.0 percent and 1.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2012 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, gasoline, rent and food purchased from restaurants. Prices also rose for electricity, cigarettes and water.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for home entertainment equipment, parts and services, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, mortgage interest cost and travel tours. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), sugar and confectionery and prescribed medicines.
