Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2014

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.2 percent between May 2014 and June 2014 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index decreased from May 2014 primarily due to lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, men's clothing, women's clothing and children's clothing (including infants). Prices also fell for non-alcoholic beverages, other food preparations and fresh fruit.

Moderating these decreases were increases in traveller accommodation, furniture, gasoline and cereal products (excluding infant food). Prices else increased for reading material and other printed matter (excluding textbooks), household appliances and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.2 percent between June 2013 and June 2014 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both climbed 2.1 percent, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2013 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, traveller accommodation, electricity and water. Prices also rose for cigarettes, food purchased from restaurants and mortgage interest cost.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for non-alcoholic beverages, gasoline, telephone services and inter-city transportation. Prices also fell for travel tours, home entertainment equipment, parts and services and personal care supplies and equipment.
