

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

October 2015

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.5 percent between September 2015 and October 2015 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.5 percent, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the October All-items Index increased from September 2015 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, property taxes and other special charges and gasoline. Prices also increased for travel tours, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles and dairy products.

Moderating these increases were price decreases for traveller accommodation, furniture, non-alcoholic beverages and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also declined for homeowners' replacement cost, men's clothing and fresh or frozen pork.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between October 2014 and October 2015 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.1 percent and 1.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The October All-items Index increased from October 2014 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, fresh fruit and electricity. Prices also increased for fresh vegetables, water and food purchased from restaurants.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, furniture, homeowners' replacement cost and traveller accommodation. Prices also decreased for inter-city transportation, sugar and confectionery and footwear.
