

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

April 2015

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index was unchanged between March 2015 and April 2015 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index were both unchanged during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the April All-items Index was flat but contributing to price increases from March 2015 were homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, traveller accommodation, furniture and inter-city transportation. Prices also increased for bakery products, non-alcoholic beverages and children's clothing.

These increases were matched by price decreases for travel tours, gasoline, fresh vegetables, and men's clothing. Prices also fell for women's clothing, dairy products and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.2 percent between April 2014 and April 2015 while the Canada All-items Index increased 0.8 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.2 percent and 1.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The April All-items Index increased from April 2014 primarily due to higher prices for purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles, natural gas, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and fresh or frozen beef. Prices also increased for rent, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and food purchased from restaurants

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, fuel oil and other fuels, home entertainment equipment, parts and services and homeowners' replacement cost. Prices also fell for travel tours, footwear and sugar and confectionary.
