

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

February 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between January 2016 and February 2016 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the February All-items Index increased from January 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: travel tours; telephone services; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; men's clothing; and internet access services.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: gasoline; fresh vegetables; non-alcoholic beverages; fresh or frozen beef; and fresh fruit.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between February 2015 and February 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.2 percent and 1.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The February All-items Index increased from February 2015 primarily due to higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; water; passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs; and fresh vegetables.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: gasoline; travel tours; natural gas; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); and homeowners' replacement cost.
