

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

October 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between September 2016 and October 2016 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the October All-items Index increased from September 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; property taxes and other special charges; gasoline; passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs; and personal care supplies and equipment.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: fresh vegetables; processed meat; non-alcoholic beverages; other food preparations; and travel tours.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.8 percent between October 2015 and October 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Indexes both climbed 0.8 percent during the same period.

The October All-items Index increased from October 2015 primarily due to higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; electricity; furniture; water; and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: gasoline; traveller accommodation; homeowners' replacement cost; natural gas; and travel tours.
