## Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

May 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.2 percent between April 2017 and May 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both declined 0.2 percent and 0.3 percent respectively during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the May All-items Index decreased from April 2017 primarily due to lower prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; personal care supplies and equipment; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and travel tours.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for: footwear; inter-city transportation; fresh fruit; traveller accommodation; and children's clothing.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.9 percent between May 2016 and May 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 0.9 percent and 1.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The May All-items Index increased from May 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: food purchased from restaurants; electricity; furniture; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; and water.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; men's clothing; personal care supplies and equipment; cereal products (excluding baby food); and dairy products.
