

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

September 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between August 2017 and September 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.1 percent and 0.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the September All-items Index increased from August 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); child care and housekeeping services; women's clothing; and tuition fees.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: telephone services; furniture; fresh fruit; traveller accommodation; and personal care supplies and equipment.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.9 percent between September 2016 and September 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.6 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both climbed 2.0 percent during the same period.

The September All-items Index increased from September 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: food purchased from restaurants; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; cigarettes; and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles).

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; furniture; traveller accommodation; men's clothing; and dairy products.
