Foreword

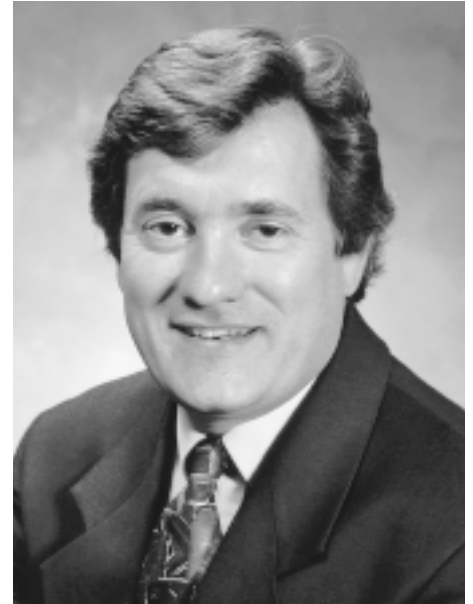
I am pleased to present the 1997 Economic Review, which shows that Saskatchewan's economy continues to grow. The Province's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) has increased in each of the last five years. This strength is broadly based and reflected in most of our key economic sectors.

Saskatchewan continues to rely on resource industries and throughout 1997 our resources have performed well. Oil and mining production, in particular, have been vigorous. This has led to an increased demand for non-residential construction.

While resources remain a vital and necessary contributor to the economy, Saskatchewan's long-term plan calls for greater diversification and value-added activity. Growth in manufacturing and processing indicates that we are making good progress.

Sustained budget surpluses and consistently positive fiscal and economic news have combined to improve the overall business climate. These factors, along with the reduction in the province's sales tax from 9% to 7%, are contributing to strong growth in retail and wholesale trade and, most important, job creation. Saskatchewan recorded an average employment level of 474,345 in the first eleven months of 1997, the highest in the Province's history and 12,727 higher than the first eleven months of 1996.

Greater economic activity has led to an improvement in the Province's revenues from our own sources, such as taxes and resource royalties. However, this trend has been offset by the fact that federal Equalization payments are reduced as the economy strengthens. This means that, in general, the Province does not realize more revenue in the short and medium term. Nevertheless, it is a very positive development that increases our independence from Ottawa and promises more financial flexibility over time.



The efforts of businesses, cooperatives, individuals and organizations to expand economic opportunities in Saskatchewan is paying off. With rising employment, a growing, more diversified economy and the Province's ongoing commitment to careful financial management, Saskatchewan people can feel confident about their prospects in the months and years ahead.

1997 In Review

Introduction

Saskatchewan's economy has maintained solid, broad-based growth in 1997. Retail sales, oil and gas drilling, and manufacturing shipments continue to grow, and non-residential construction activity has been boosted by strong demand for warehouse and distribution space, pipeline expansion and government infrastructure projects.

Positive Factors Sustaining Growth

The Province's growth has been underpinned by a number of factors. In the first half of 1997, both the Canadian and U.S. economies chalked up impressive growth numbers. Strong economic growth brought more jobs with very little inflation, helping to keep interest rates low in Canada. At the same time, the value of the Canadian dollar remained low, strengthening exports.

Strong economic growth, sustained budget surpluses, and consistently positive fiscal news over the last few years have combined to produce a noticeably sharp improvement in consumer and investor confidence. This confidence and the reduction in sales tax from 9% to 7% have been important factors in improving the business climate and creating jobs.

Saskatchewan's Economy Builds on Last Year's Excellent Performance

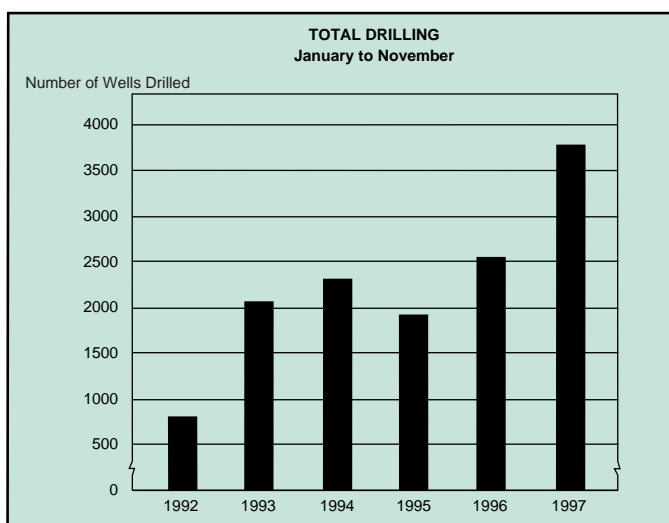
This year's economic results have exceeded most expectations. Retail sales increased by 9.3 per cent in the first nine months of 1997, outpacing last year's performance. During the same period, wholesale trade surged by 28.8 per cent.

New vehicle sales to the end of September this year grew by 16.0 per cent. Sales of trucks and commercial vehicles increased by 21.0 per cent.

Saskatchewan's manufacturing and processing sector has grown at a brisk pace. In the first nine months of 1997, the value of manufacturing shipments increased by 17.5 per cent. Food processing, transportation equipment and machinery were particularly strong,

driven in part by recent initiatives in agri-processing in the Province. Shipments of food products increased by 29.5 per cent; transportation equipment, by 23.1 per cent; and machinery, by 14.9 per cent.

In the resource sector, drilling activity has remained robust with 3,633 oil and gas wells drilled to the end of November, 38.8 per cent more than the number of wells drilled in the same period last year.



The volume of crude oil production increased by 10.7 per cent in the first eight months of 1997 from the same period in 1996. Production of other mineral products such as coal, potash and uranium have also risen sharply during the year. In the first nine months of 1997, coal output rose by 6.7 per cent; potash, 24.6 per cent; and, uranium, 4.9 per cent.

Agriculture is important to the Provincial economy but its relative contribution is expected to be somewhat lower than in 1996. In 1997, Saskatchewan farmers harvested a total of 23.1 million tonnes, 3 per cent above the ten-year average harvest but 18 per cent below last year's total. Grain prices have also come down in 1997.

The quality of the 1997 crop, however, was better than last year's with approximately 78 per cent of the Spring Wheat harvested expected to grade as "Number 1 CW" compared with only 47 per cent on average in the past ten years and 46 per cent in 1996.

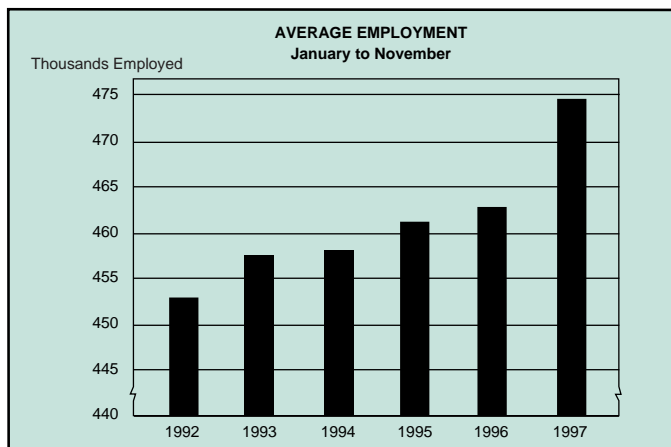
The construction industry benefited from a number of capital investment projects in 1997. Grain terminals and elevators, pipeline expansion, construction of uranium mines and government infrastructure projects such as the 1997 Capital Works Program, contributed to a buoyant construction industry.

Residential construction did not fare as well as non-residential construction. While housing starts in urban areas of the Province matched last year's level, rural housing starts were down 12.9 per cent in the first nine months.

Economic conditions, however, point to a revival of home-building activity in the Province in coming months. Mortgage rates are expected to remain low. Employment has grown strongly this year, and Saskatchewan's population continues to grow. In addition, the inventory level of existing homes for sale in Saskatchewan remains relatively low.

Saskatchewan's Employment Situation Brightens

Strong economic activity has spurred job creation in the Province. Saskatchewan's employment level averaged 474,345 in the first eleven months of 1997, the highest in the Province's history. In the first eleven months of 1997, the economy created 12,727 net new jobs.



Over the same eleven-month period, full-time positions increased by 12,072 while part-time positions increased by 655. Youth employment increased by 4,100 and employment of women rose by 3,773.

The new jobs were distributed across a wide band of industries indicating broadly-based economic growth. Employment in manufacturing and processing industries increased by 3,264. Construction jobs increased by 3,273.

The majority of new jobs were in the service sectors. A total of 15,000 jobs were created in transportation, communication and utilities; finance, insurance and real estate; and, personal, community and business services.

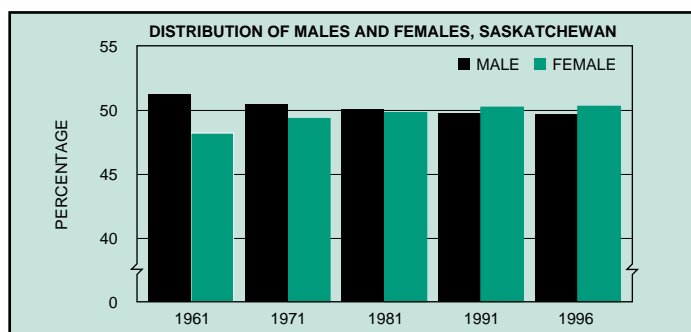
Saskatchewan's unemployment rate averaged 6.1 per cent in the first eleven months of 1997, the lowest in Canada. Signs point to a continuation of low unemployment and good economic growth in Saskatchewan.

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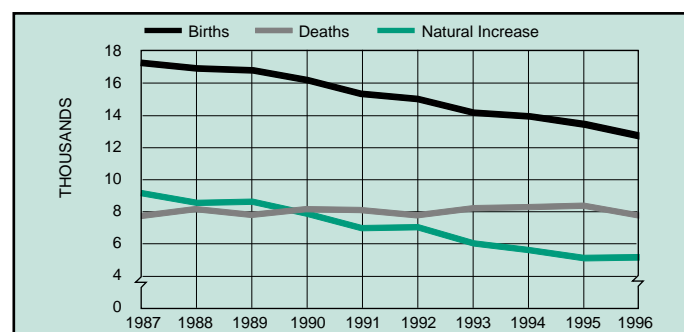
Table 1: Population, Canada and Saskatchewan by Sex

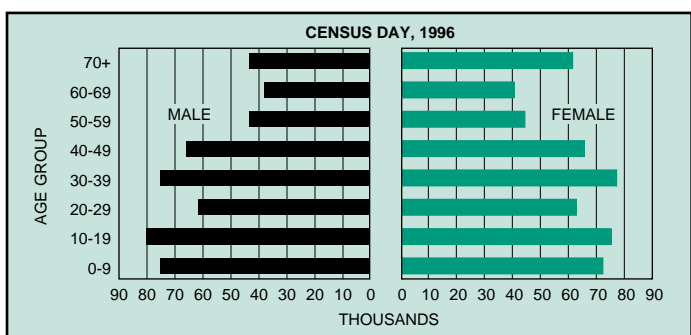
Table 2: Saskatchewan Components of Population Change

Table 3: Population, Saskatchewan Distribution by Age Groups

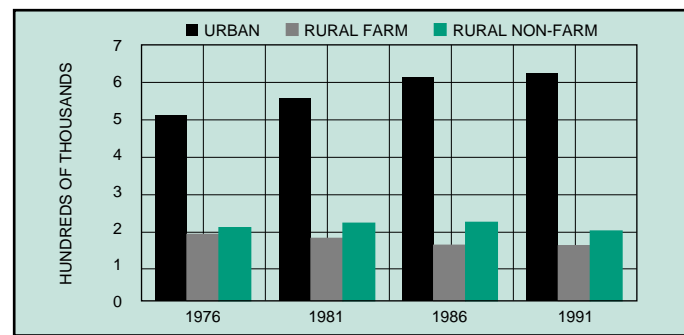

Table 4: Population, Saskatchewan Urban, Rural and Farm

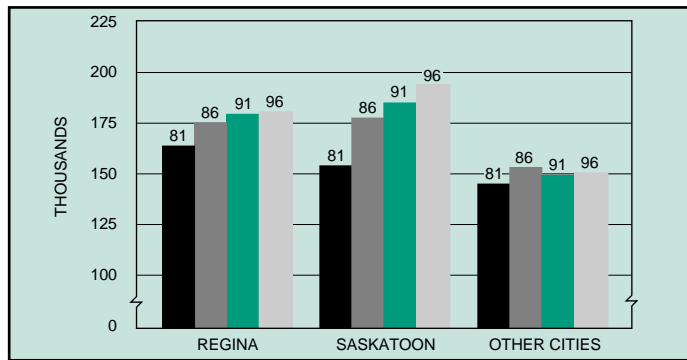

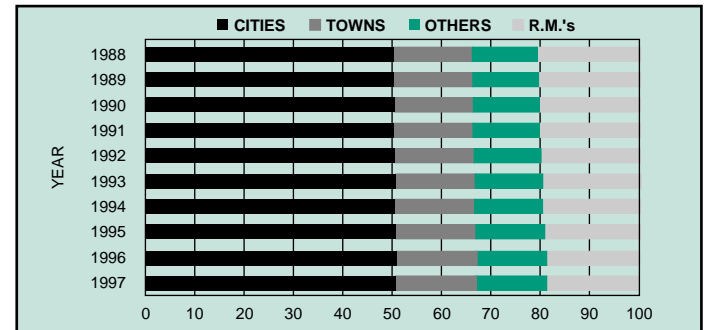

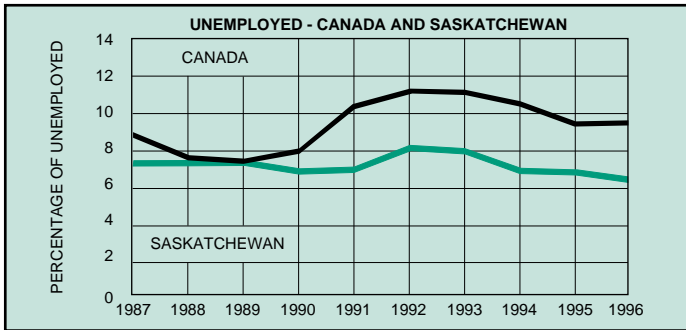

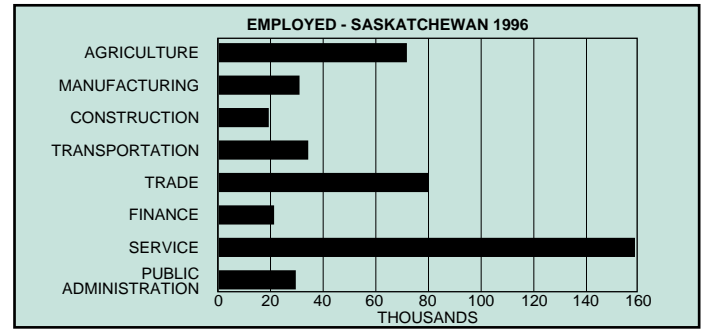

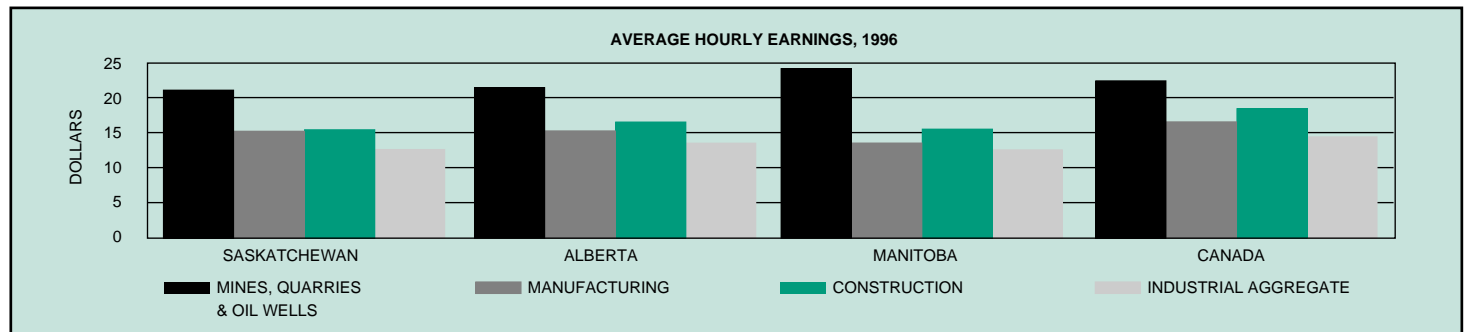
Table 10: Employed by Industry, Saskatchewan

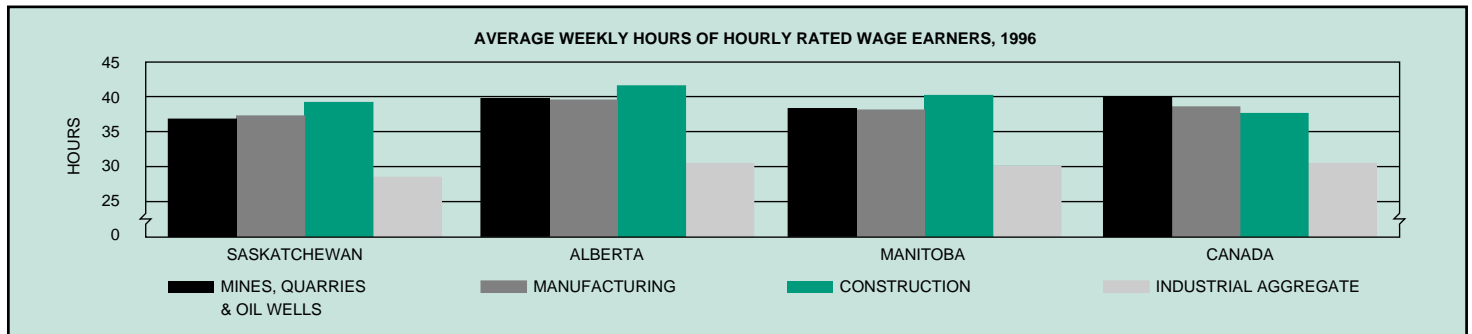

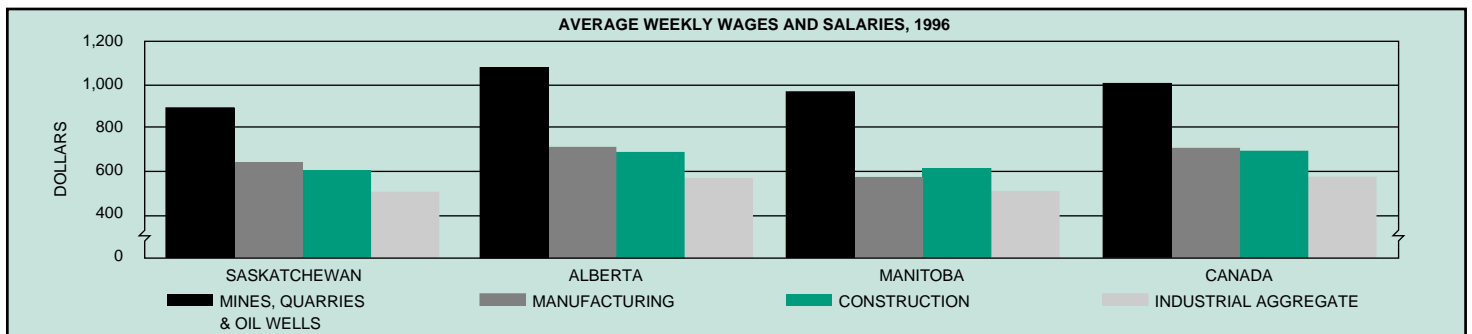

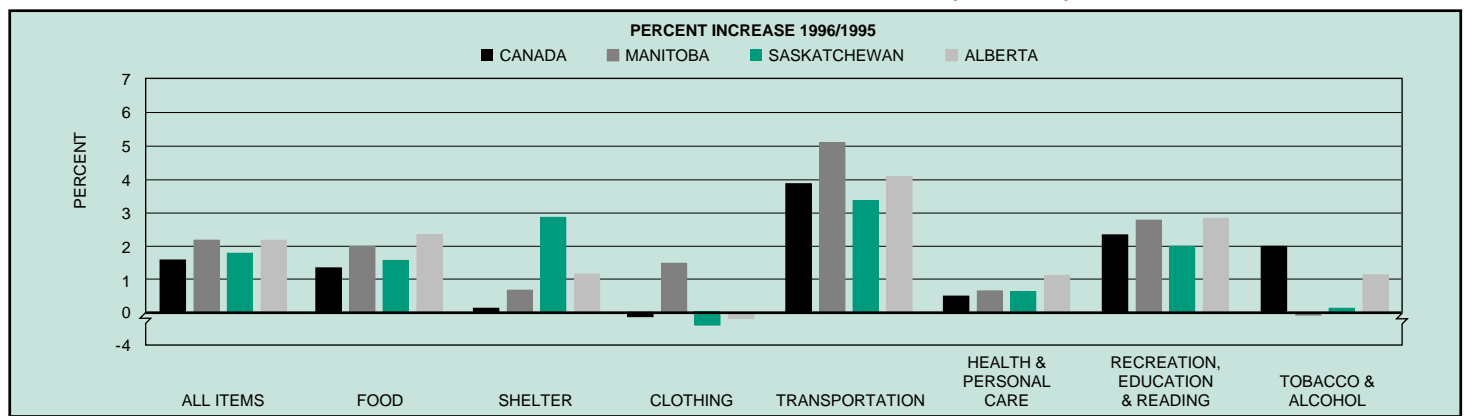

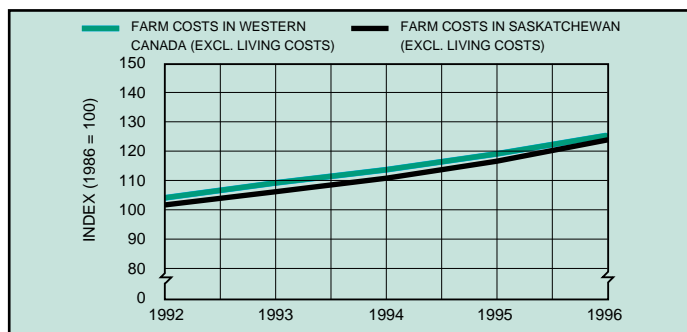

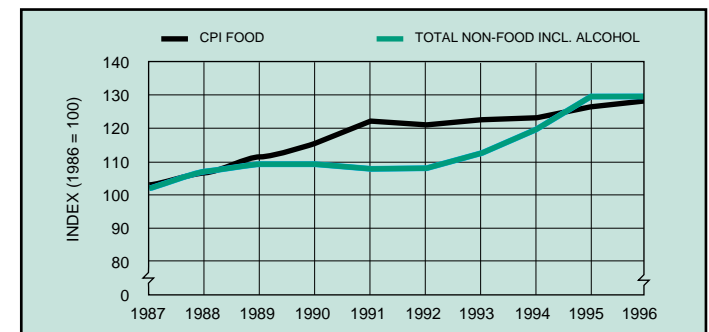

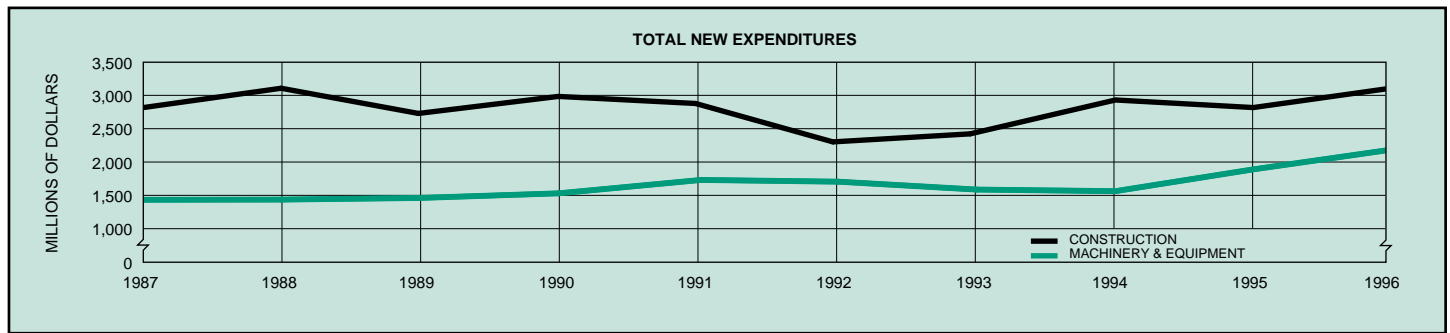

Table 21: Private and Public Investment by Industry, Saskatchewan



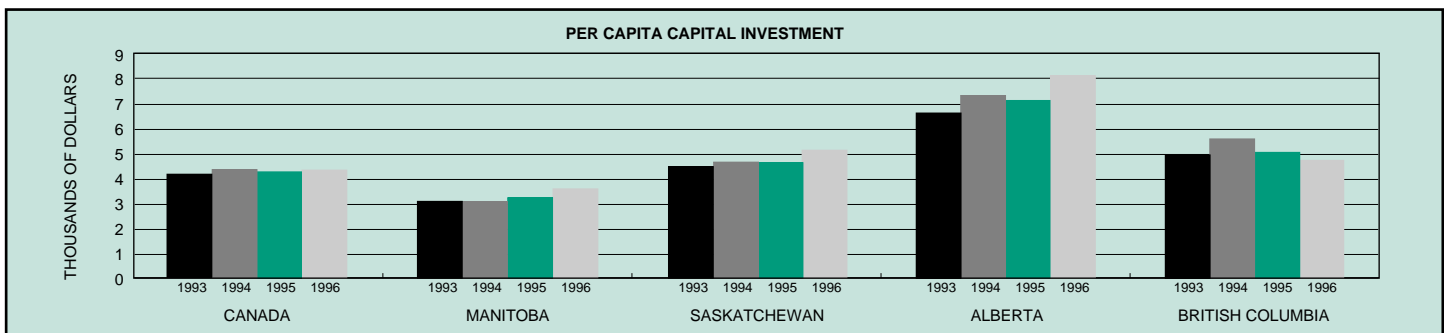

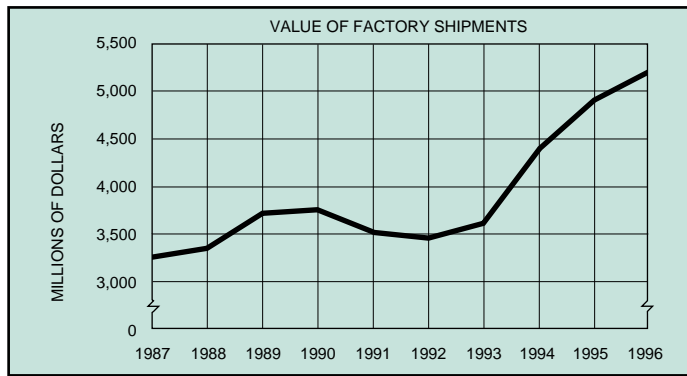

Table 27: Value of Mineral Sales by Kind, Saskatchewan

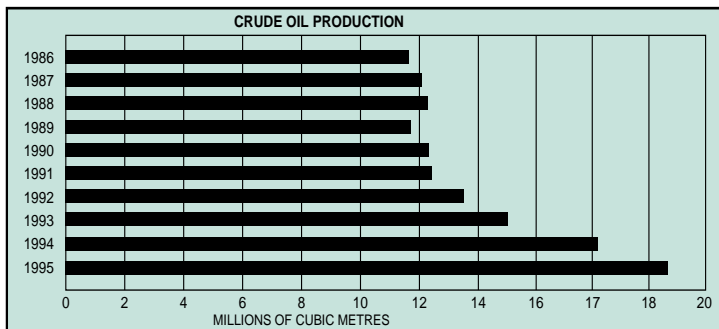

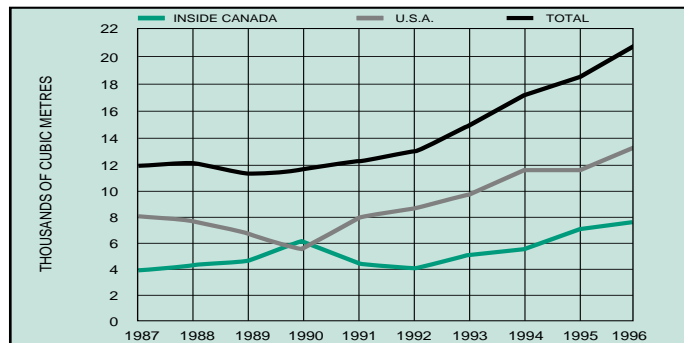

Table 34: Number and Average Size of Farms, Saskatchewan

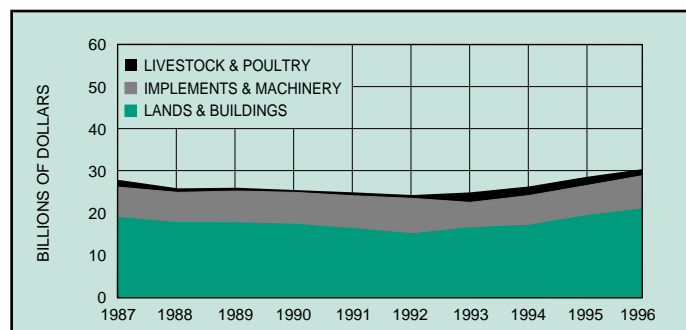

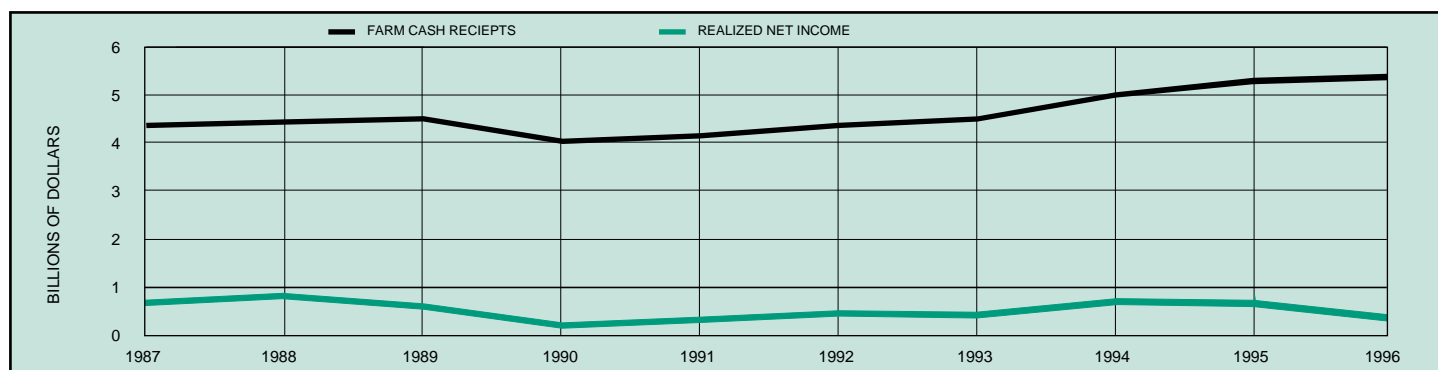

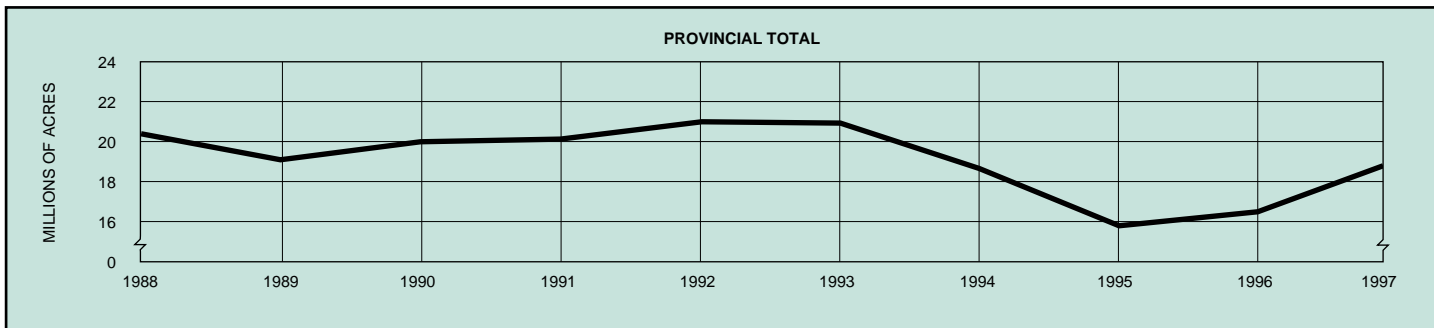

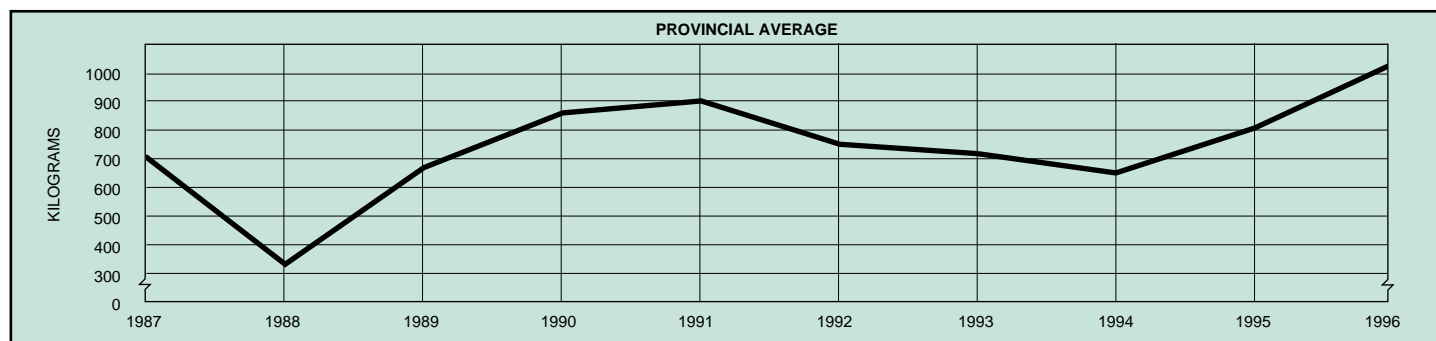

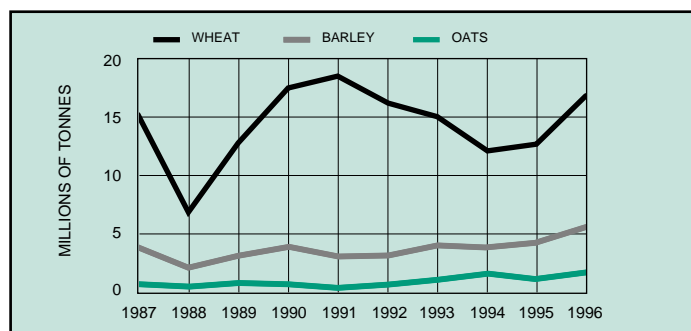

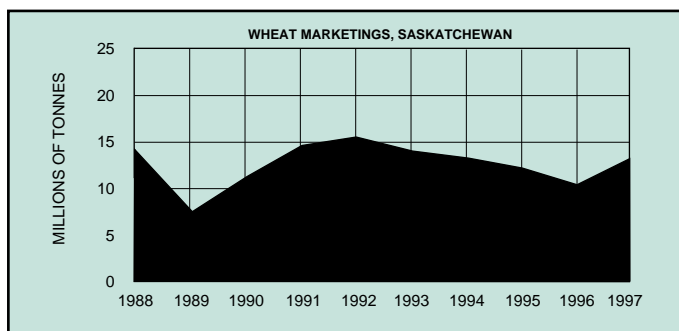

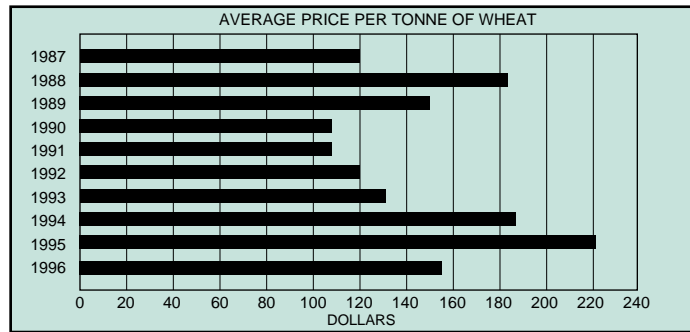

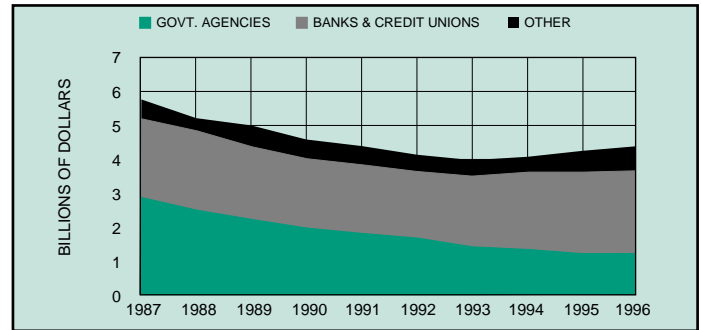

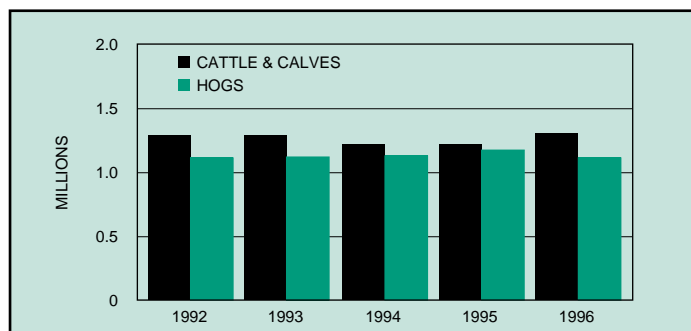

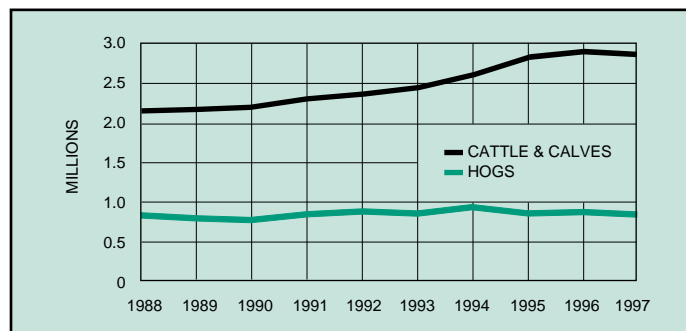

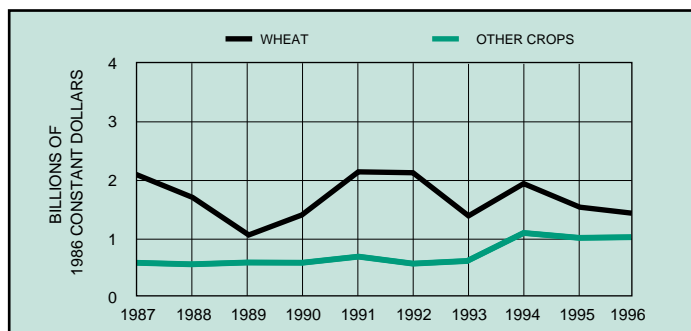

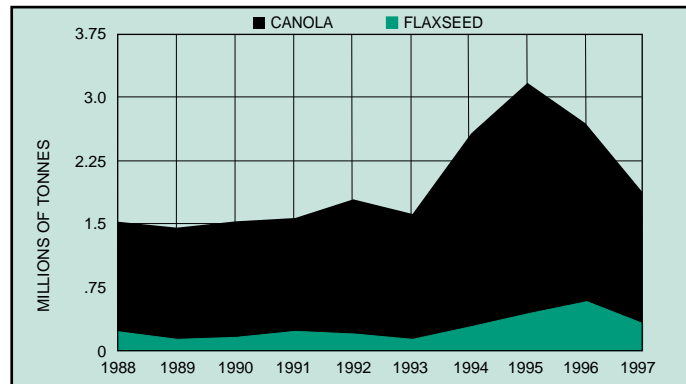

Table 49: Saskatchewan Receipts from Out-of-Province Canadian Residents and Foreign Visitors

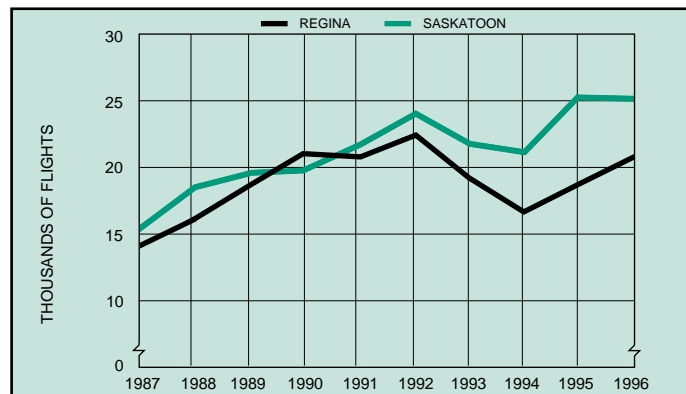

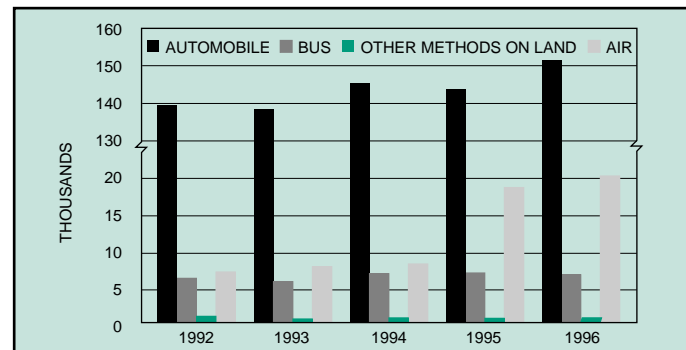

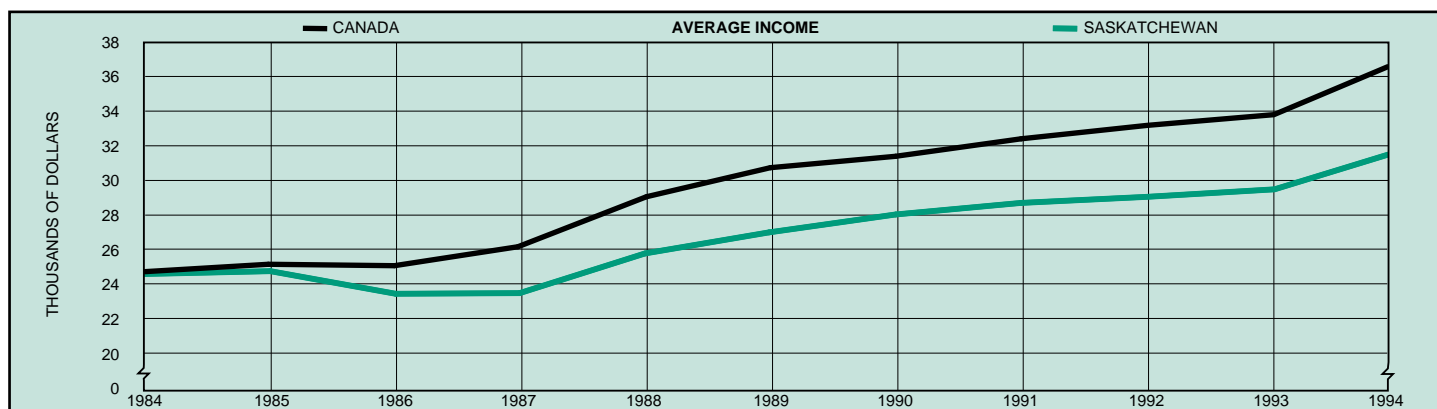
Table 52: United States Visitors Entering Saskatchewan by Type of Transportation

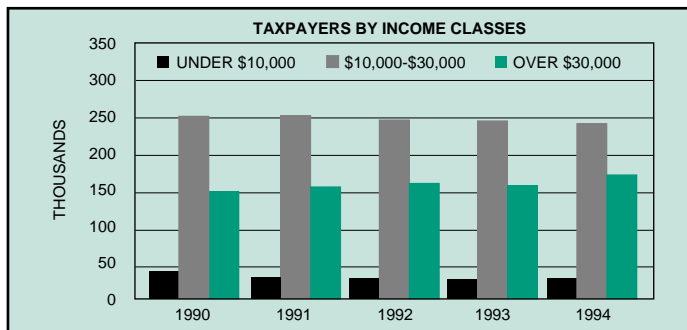

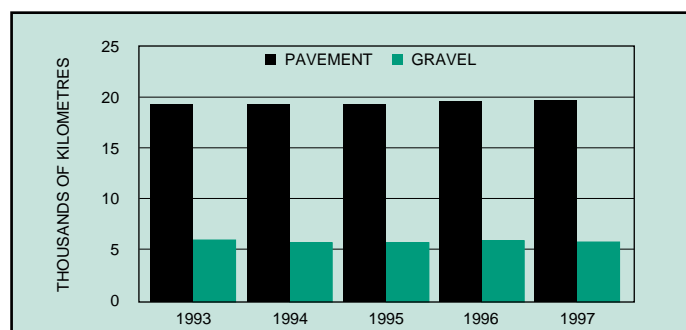

Table 56: Provincial Highways by Surface Type, Saskatchewan¹



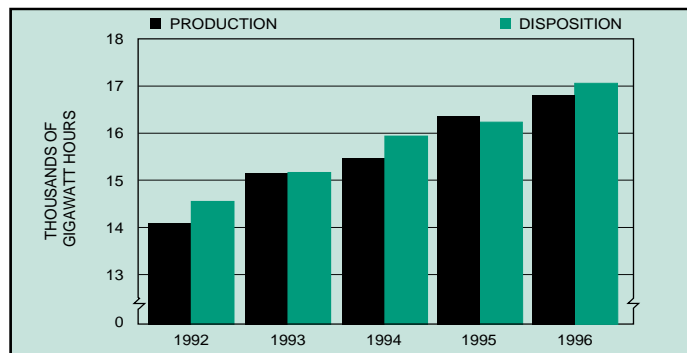

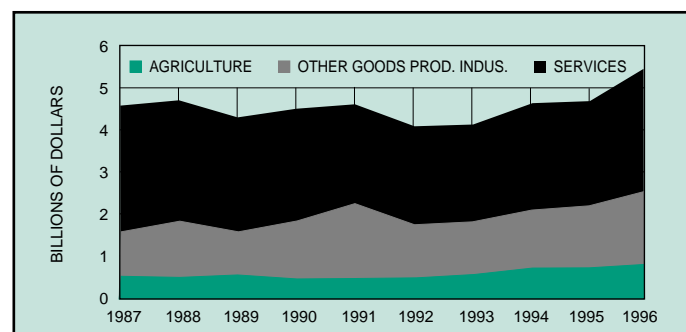

Table 58: Gross Fixed Capital Formation, by Industry, on a GDP Basis, Saskatchewan

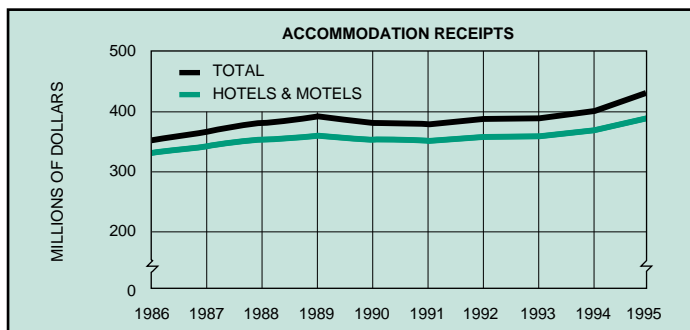

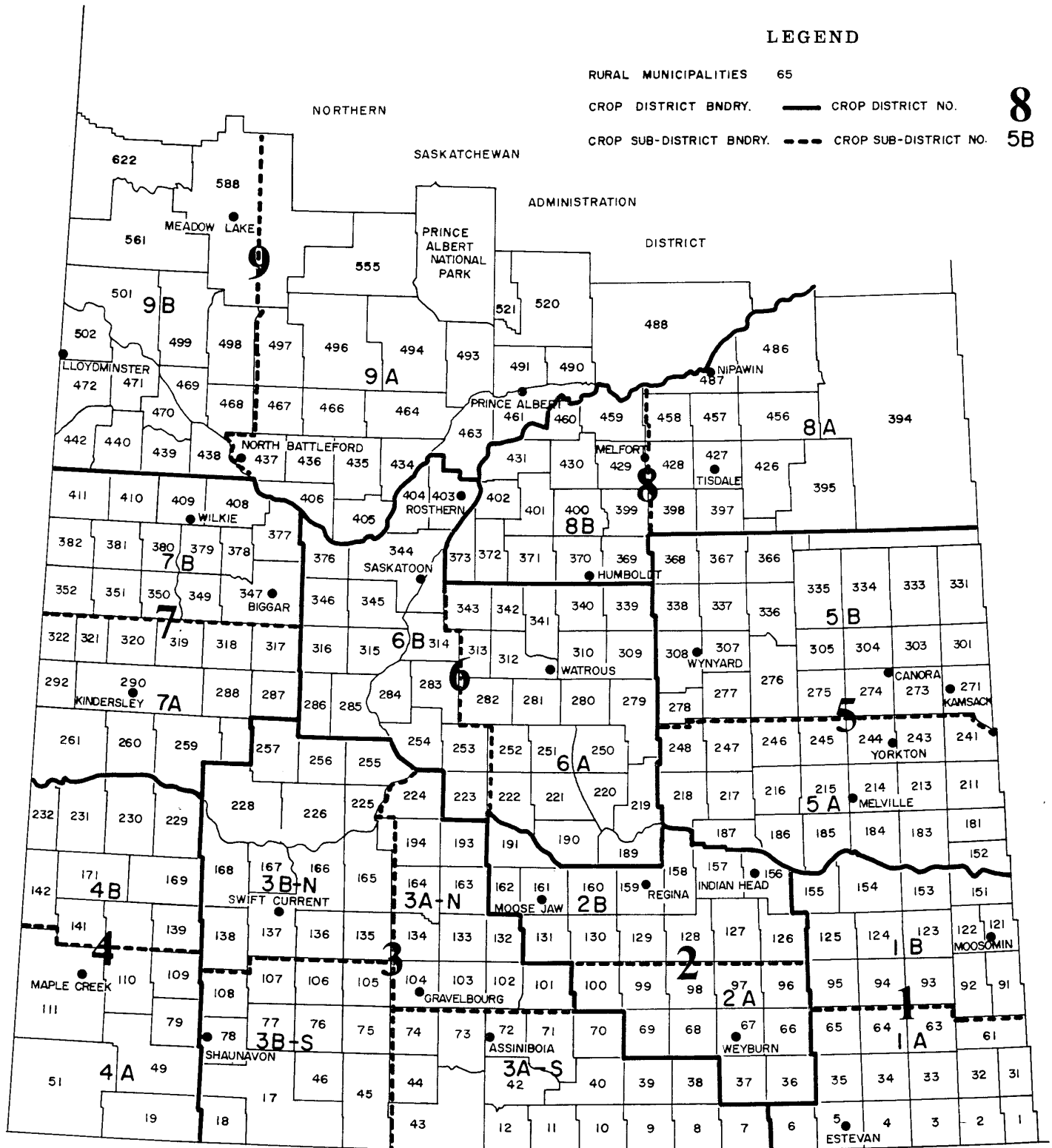

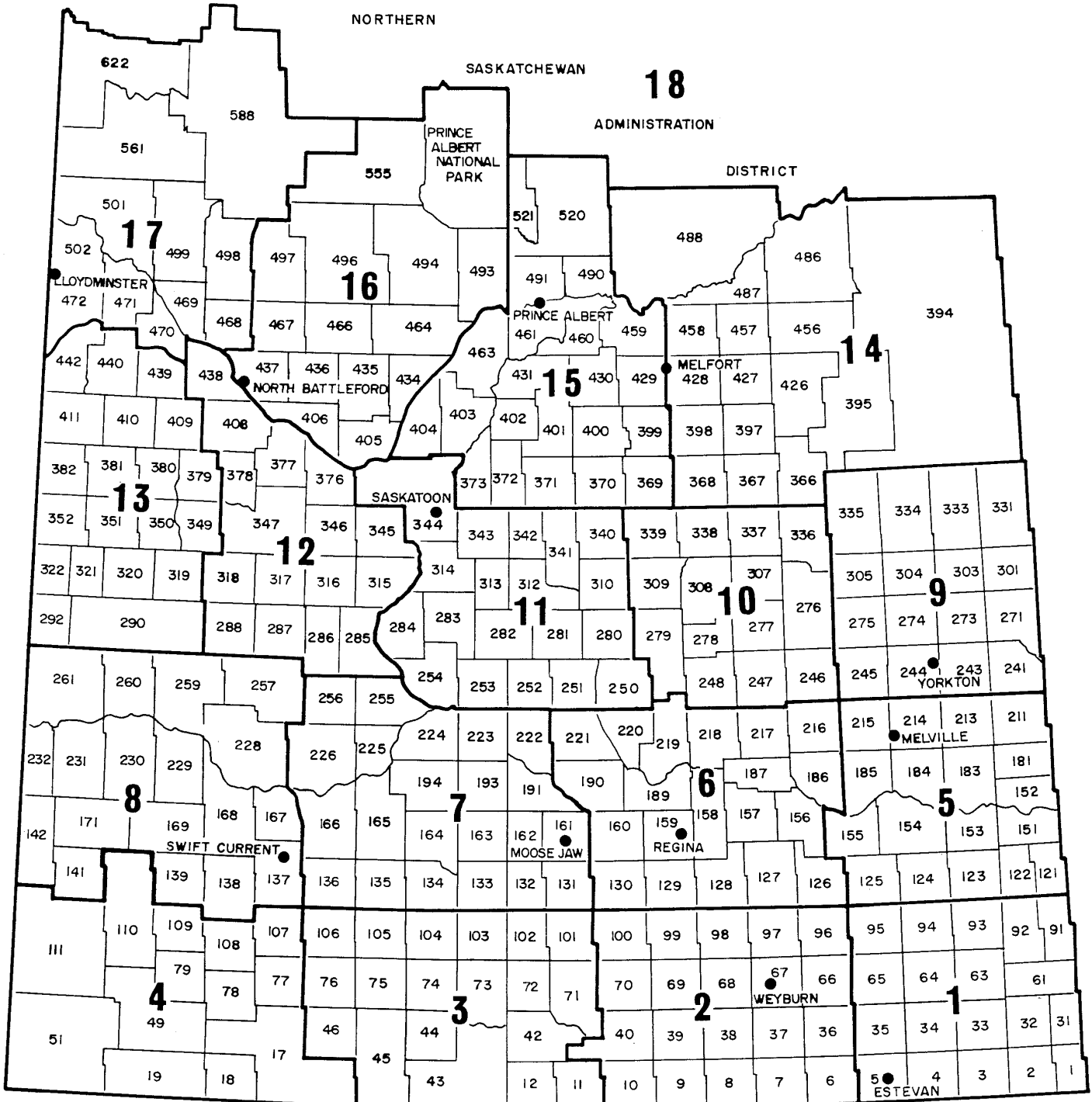

Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has developed a set of economic accounts which can be used to trace the development and growth of the Saskatchewan economy.

The purpose of the accounts is to measure the value of economic activity in each sector of the economy. This is done by means of a balancing set of accounts similar to the annual income and expenditure statements of a commercial enterprise.

The accounts have many useful functions. They consolidate information which is now provided through a number of scattered sources and organize it into a central framework. This allows many kinds of economic analysis to be performed ranging from monitoring current economic performance to analysis of structural change in the economy.

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has available upon request, many more detailed tables and other information concerning the Saskatchewan Economic Accounts.

Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

Saskatchewan Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the total value of goods and services produced annually in the province. By removing the effects of inflation, it is possible to measure the volume of output. After adjusting for price changes, Saskatchewan's real Gross Domestic Product increased by 2.8 percent in 1996.

In nominal terms, Saskatchewan's GDP increased by 6.1 percent in 1996 to \$26,443 million. Personal expenditure on consumer goods and services rose by 5.2 percent as consumers increased spending in all categories. Government current expenditure on goods and services rose slightly in 1996 after falling in 1995.

Total investment increased 12.8 percent over 1995 despite a 2.7 percent decrease in government investment. Business investment rose 16.6 percent as growth occurred in agriculture, mining, construction, manufacturing, communication, transportation, retail and wholesale trade, finance insurance and real estate, and commercial services.

The value of physical change in inventories increased in 1996 as higher grain production overtook exports.

Nominal exports increased by 7.3 percent over 1995 levels following advances in crude oil, lumber, uranium, manufactured goods and tourism. Nominal imports rose by 12.7 percent in 1996 as imports of crude oil, natural gas and manufactured goods from Canada and imports of goods from abroad increased.

Final domestic demand for goods and services by individuals, the government and for investment purposes rose by 6.0 percent over 1995 levels, after adjustments for inflation. Real personal expenditure on consumer goods and services increased by 3.7 percent, government expenditures on goods and services increased by 0.6 percent and gross fixed capital formation increased by 16.7 percent.

This document represents an update to the Saskatchewan economic accounts, released in June 1997. Periodic revisions are common to all economic series to improve the accuracy, reliability and consistency of the data.
