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## Foreword

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With a track record of five, consecutive years of solid economic growth, Saskatchewan is well positioned to meet the challenges that lie ahead. While oil prices remained persistently low throughout 1998, this was offset by relative strength in the natural gas sector. Potash production and sales also remained strong, aided by the Province's new royalty structure. Residential, commercial and industrial construction increased, and average employment in the province set a new record in 1998.

Economic growth is slowing across Canada. In Saskatchewan, we are coming off a five year period of record growth. While this pace is slowing, the 1998-99 Provincial Budget, released in March, forecasts an overall increase in Gross Domestic Product of 2.7 per cent this year. The Government of Saskatchewan continues to support this growth by maintaining a balanced budget, lowering taxes for families and business in a steady and sustainable manner, reducing debt and investing in priority areas such as health, education and highways.

Over the past few years, businesses have responded to these efforts by creating jobs for Saskatchewan people. In 1998, Saskatchewan recorded the highest average employment level in its history at 478,600 — 4,400 higher than the previous year. More importantly, part-time jobs are being replaced with full-time jobs. That means increased earnings and a better quality of life for more Saskatchewan people.

There are, of course, some challenges on the horizon. For example, the current international farm subsidy war has driven down grain and pork prices, placing many Saskatchewan farmers at considerable risk. Our Government is very concerned about the impact of this subsidy war on Saskatchewan families and communities. We have already announced a provincial, short-term loan program to assist hog producers, and we are working with the federal government and other provincial governments to develop a national disaster program which will offer relief to Saskatchewan grain farmers. We are also encouraging the federal government to take action to deal with the subsidy wars within the context of established international trade agreements.



On balance, Saskatchewan people can take pride in the progress they have made to build and diversify our economy. Government has assisted by providing a stable economic climate and incentives targeted to industries that have the greatest potential to grow and create jobs. For example, employment in the manufacturing sector has increased by well over 7,000 since 1992, aided by a series of tax incentives for the manufacturing and processing sector. Much work remains to be done but, by reducing our reliance on primary products and increasing our efforts to add value to our products, we are heading in the right direction.

Our Government will continue to pay down debt, lower taxes and invest in priority public services, all within a sustainable, responsible fiscal framework. And, we will continue to work with farmers, business, cooperatives and communities to expand economic opportunities and improve the high quality of life for which Saskatchewan is renowned.

### Introduction

Saskatchewan led the nation in terms of economic growth over the last five years. The Province's economy averaged 4.3 per cent real growth per year from 1992 to 1997 compared with the national average of 2.7 per cent.

In parallel with the growth of the provincial economy, Saskatchewan's rate of job creation accelerated. In 1997, 13,000 net new jobs were added on top of the 11,000 created over the previous four years. This was by far the best performance by Saskatchewan in the 1990s. The Province's unemployment rate averaged 6.0 per cent in 1997, a 16-year low, while the size of the labour force continued to grow.

Following five years of solid economic progress, Saskatchewan's rate of economic growth has moderated in 1998 in tune with slower growth in other countries and the associated decline in commodity prices. The Province's improved fiscal capacity, private sector investment initiatives, low interest rates, the low value of the Canadian dollar and many other positive elements, however, have allowed Saskatchewan's economy to continue to grow.

### The 1998-99 Budget Supports Growth

The 1998-99 Provincial Budget included significant new public spending, cut the income tax rate for individuals, granted an array of tax incentives for businesses, paid down the debt and remained on track to show a surplus. These budget measures have supported economic growth in 1998.

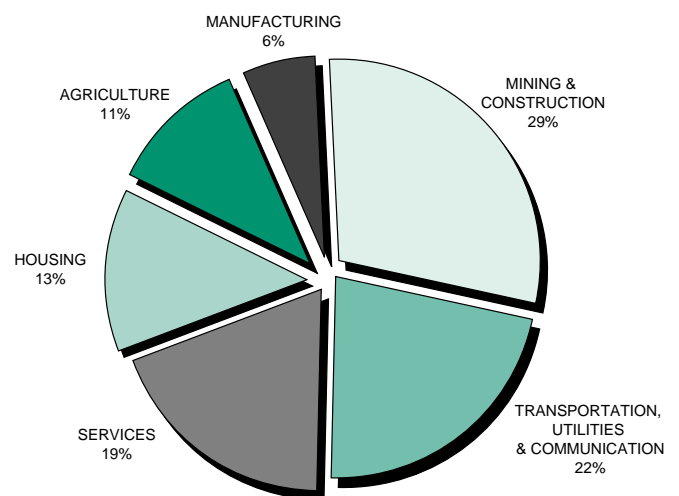
### Large Projects Provide Major Impetus For Growth

The available information indicates that, as in 1997, investment played an important role in generating economic growth in 1998. The revised Public and Private Investment Intentions Survey by Statistics Canada, for example, showed more than \$7.0 billion in new capital expenditures made in 1998, approximately 7.0 per cent more than the new capital spending made in the Province in all of 1997.

Actual building permits issued in the first ten months of 1998 corroborate the findings of the Statistics Canada survey. Non-residential building permits rose strongly in the first ten months, led by industrial building permits, which went up by 71 per cent, and commercial building permits, which rose 32 per cent.

The investment projects involve large-scale capital expenditures and reflect an increasingly diversified economy. The list includes construction of new uranium mines, natural gas pipelines, a co-generation plant, a new sawmill and expansion and upgrading of existing potash plants, oil upgrader facilities and the fine paper mill, among many others.

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## Pipeline Projects Boost Gas Drilling

Oil drilling fell 68 per cent in the first ten months of 1998 as a result of low oil prices. Gas drilling, however, increased by 86 per cent in the same period.

Elsewhere in mining, potash production increased by 9 per cent in the first nine months and sales rose more than 12 per cent in the same period.

## Growth In Residential Construction Bodes Well For Spending On Retail Goods

Housing starts increased at a healthy 16 per cent pace in the first nine months of 1998. This is the third consecutive year in which housing starts have significantly advanced.

The housing sector's strength is expected to provide some support to retail sales in coming months, particularly for furniture and similar durable items. Following five years of solid growth, retail trade increased by only 0.6 per cent in the first ten months of 1998. Wholesale trade, however, rose 6 per cent in the same period.

## Manufacturing Continues To Diversify

Manufacturing shipments fell by 3 per cent in the first ten months of 1998 from a comparable period in 1997. The apparent weakness was largely due to shipments of machinery returning to more normal levels following brisk growth in each of 1996 and 1997.

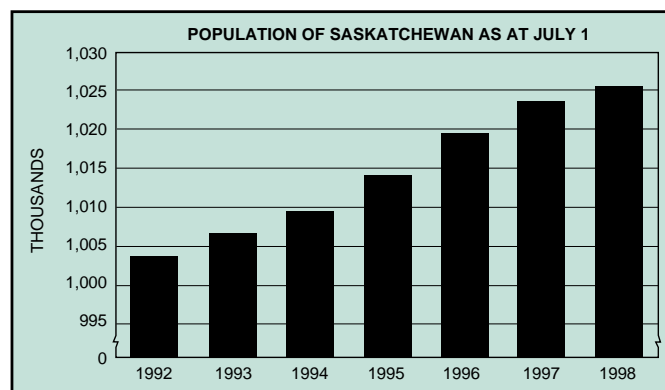
Other components of manufacturing activity remained vibrant. Shipments of food products, for example, posted a 5 per cent gain in the first ten months. Shipments of beverages, clothing, non-metallic mineral products and electrical and electronic products each posted double-digit growth in the period.

## Farm Income Drop

The level and quality of the 1998 crop were above average. Low grain prices, however, will significantly affect farmers' incomes in 1998.

## Saskatchewan's Population and Employment Levels Rise

Saskatchewan's population increased by 2,220 persons from 1,023,380 on July 1, 1997 to 1,025,600 on July 1, 1998.



Saskatchewan's employment level averaged 478,600 in 1998, 4,442 more than the average employment level in 1997. There were 7,100 more full-time jobs in 1998. Agriculture, manufacturing, construction and service reported higher employment levels in 1998.

Saskatchewan's unemployment rate averaged 5.9 per cent in 1998, down from 6.0 per cent in 1997.





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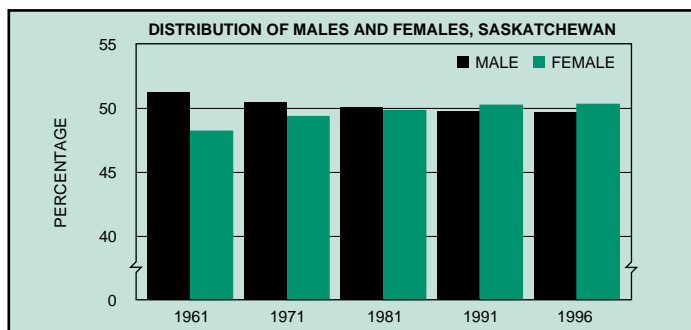
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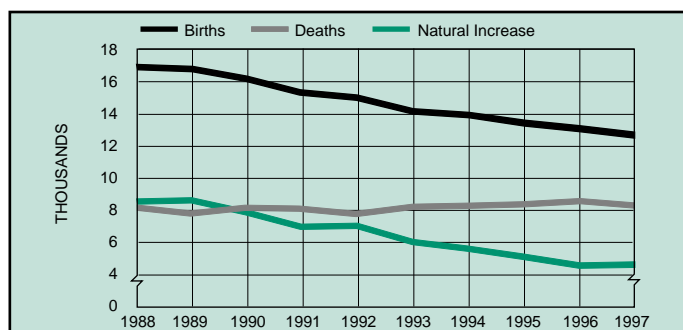
Table 1: Population, Canada and Saskatchewan by Sex

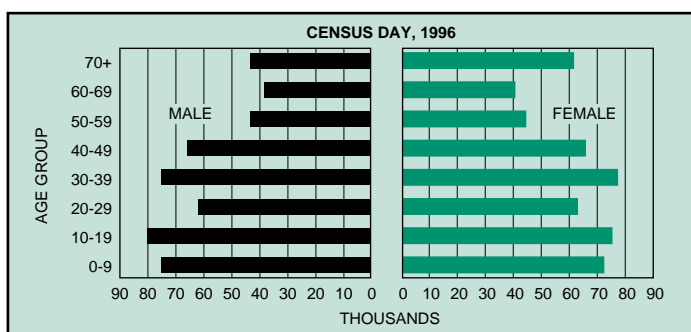

Table 3: Population, Saskatchewan Distribution by Age Groups

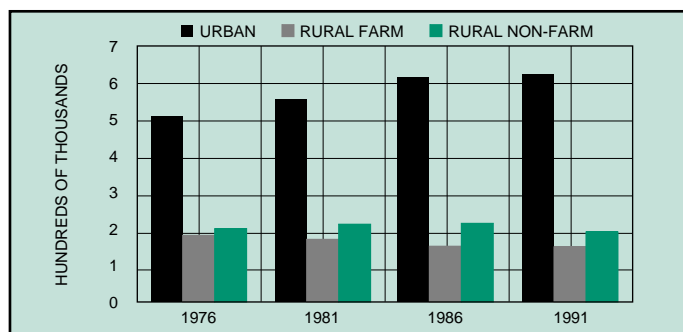

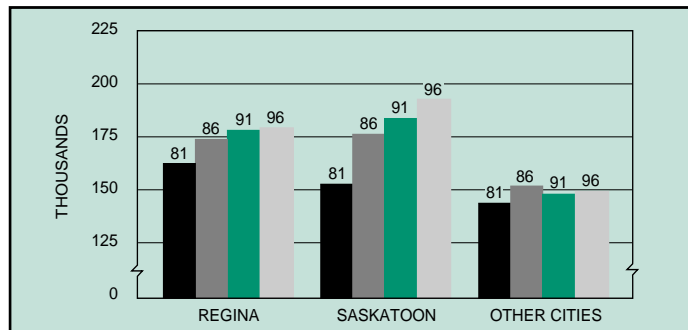

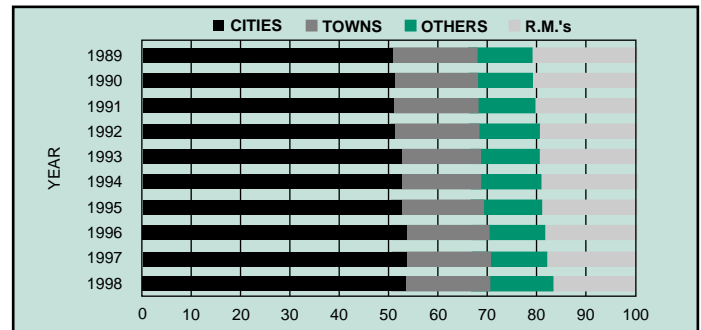

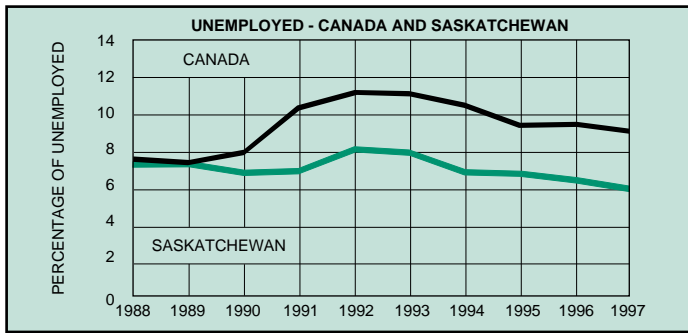

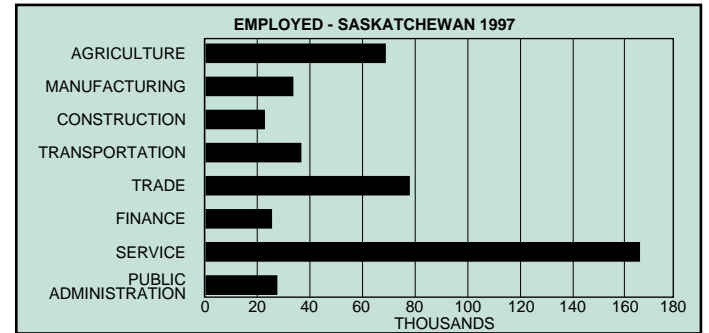

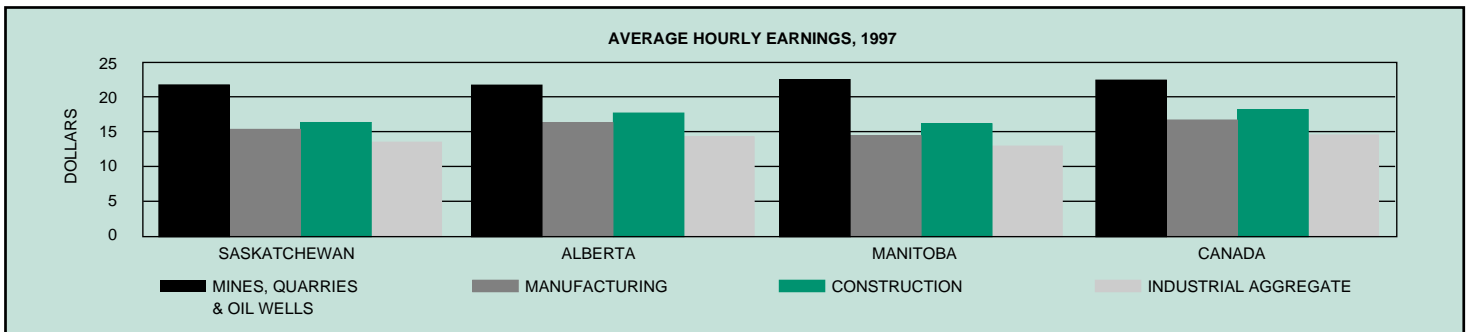

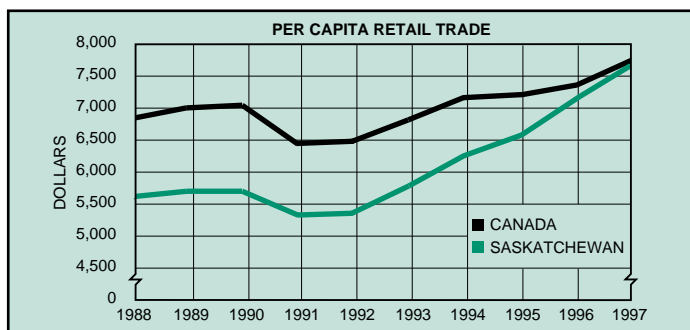

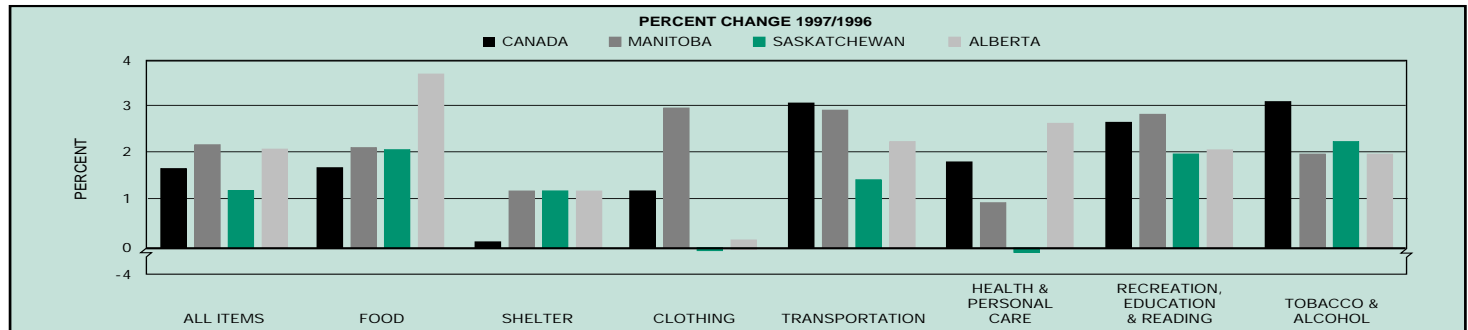

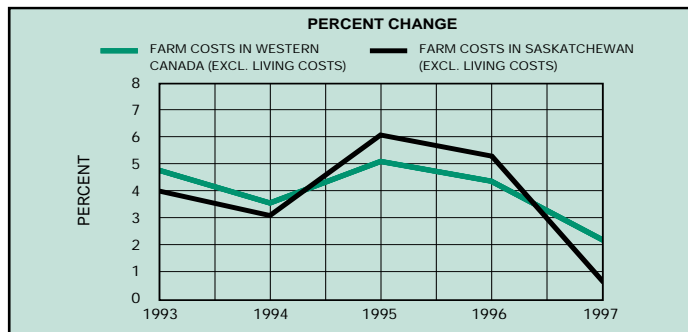

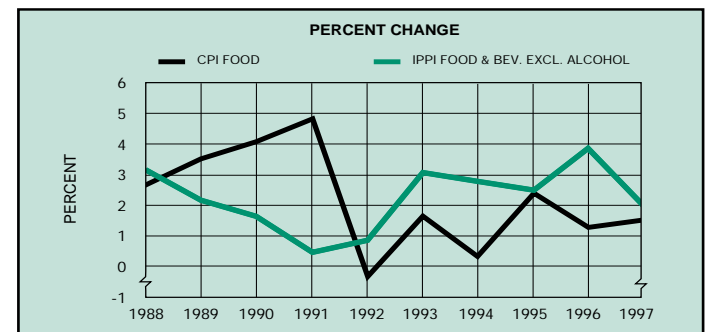

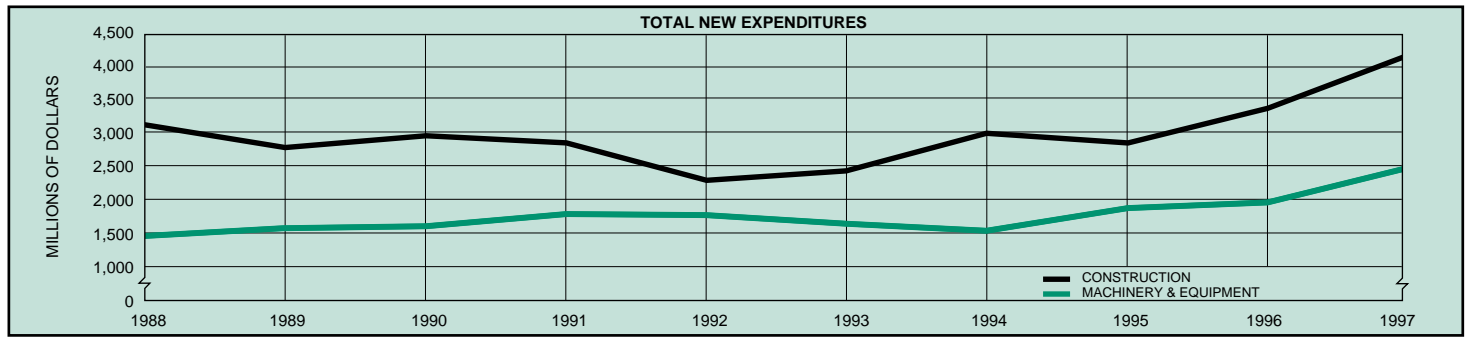

Table 21: Private and Public Investment by Industry, Saskatchewan



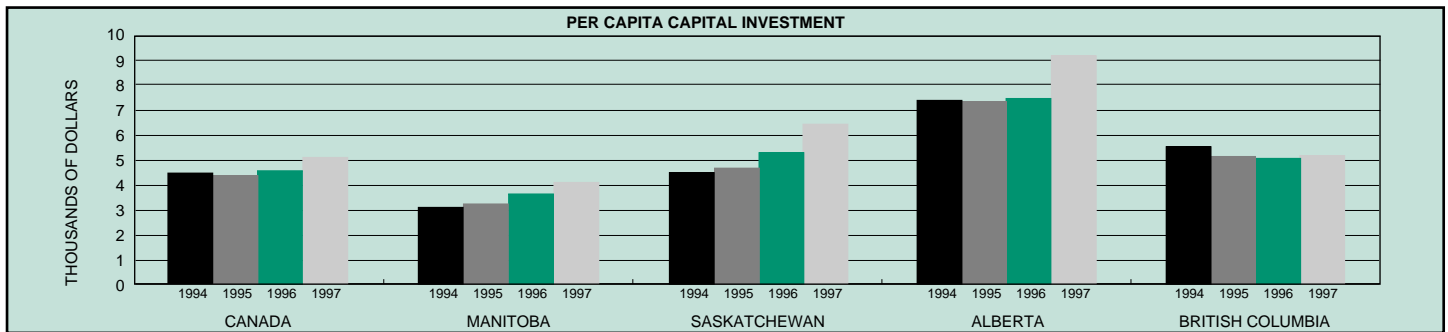

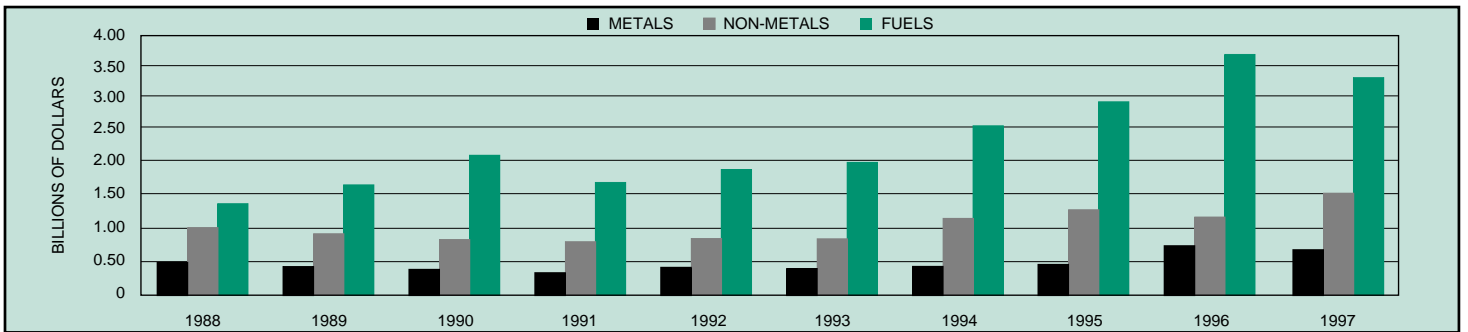

Table 27: Value of Mineral Sales by Kind, Saskatchewan

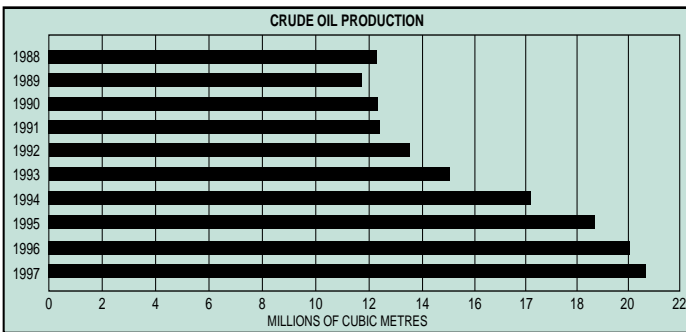

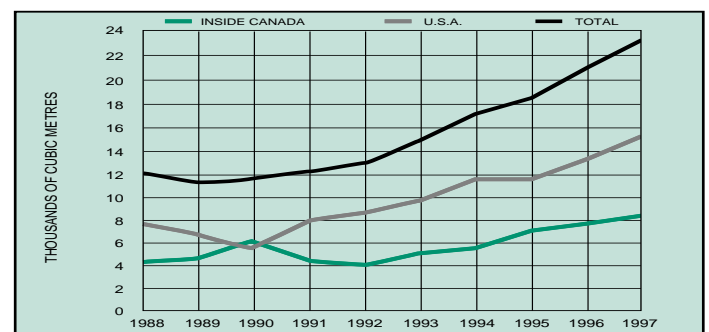

Table 29: Principal Markets for Saskatchewan Crude Oil



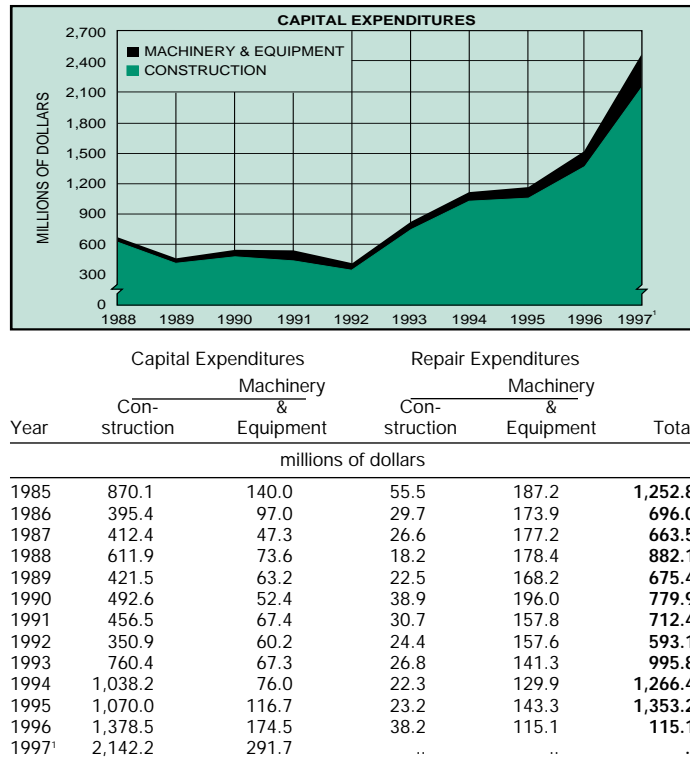

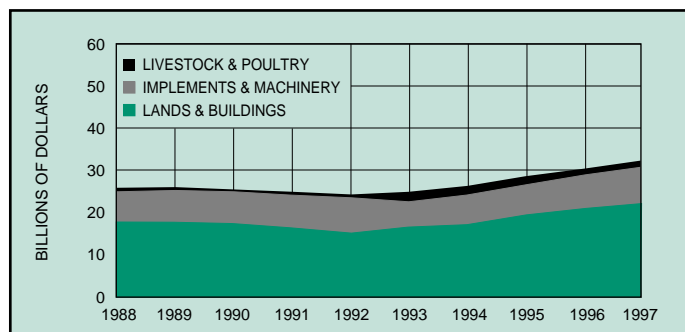

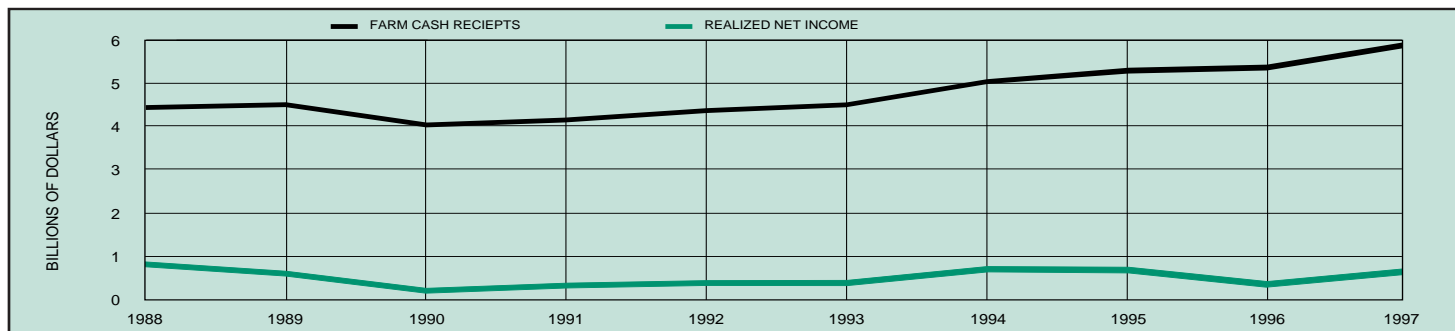

Table 36: Cash Receipts and Net Income of Farm Operators from Farming Operations, Saskatchewan



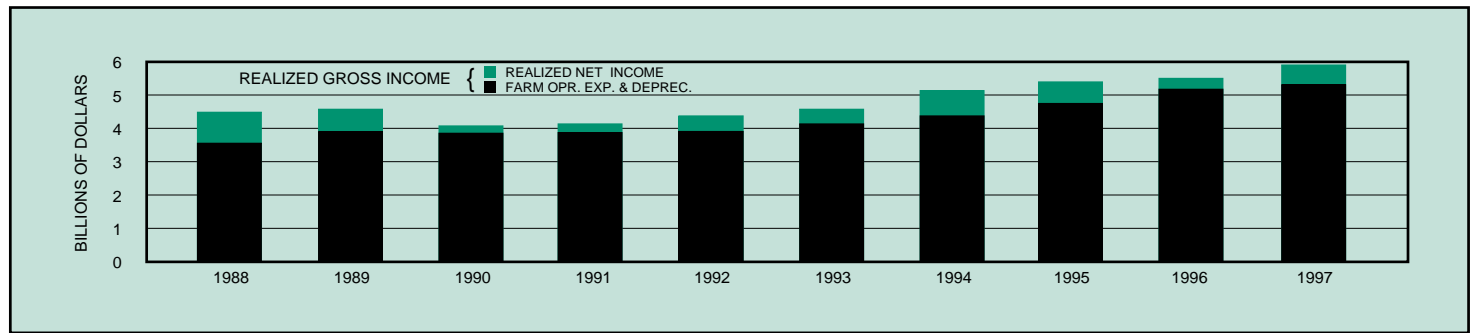

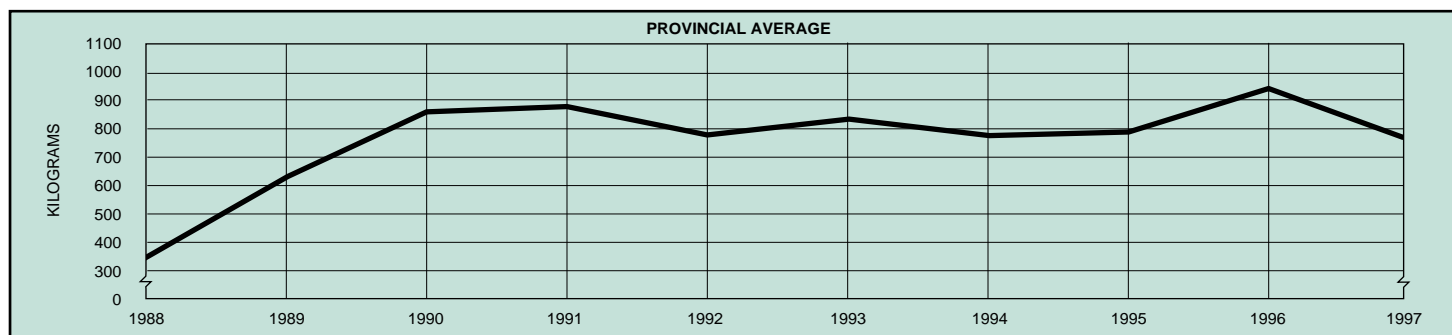

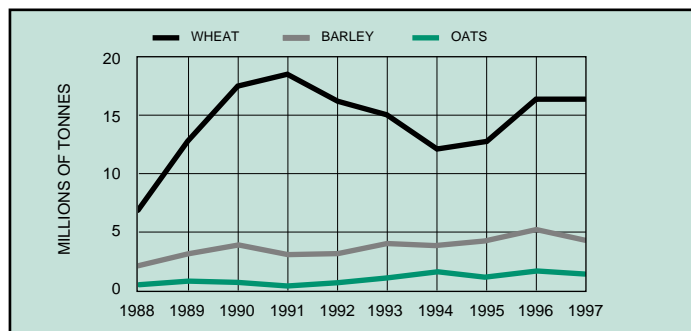

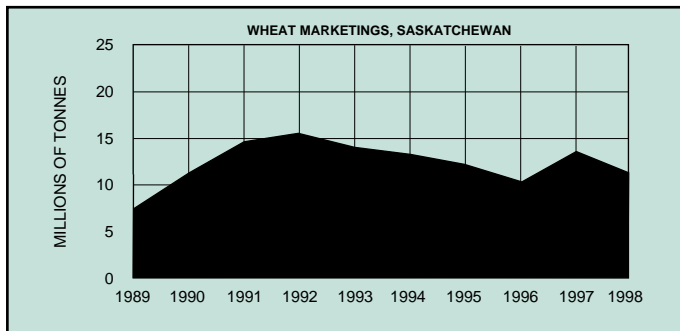

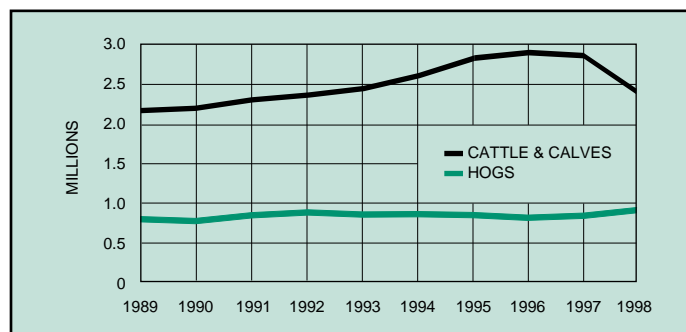

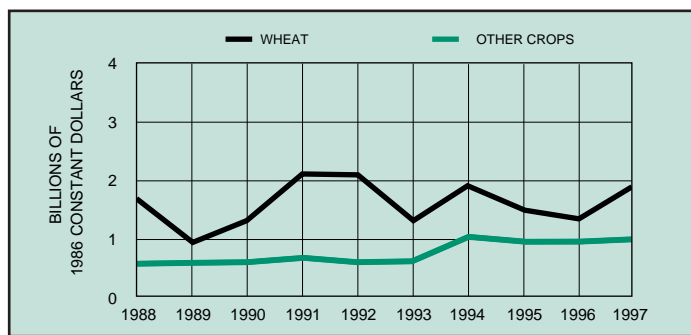

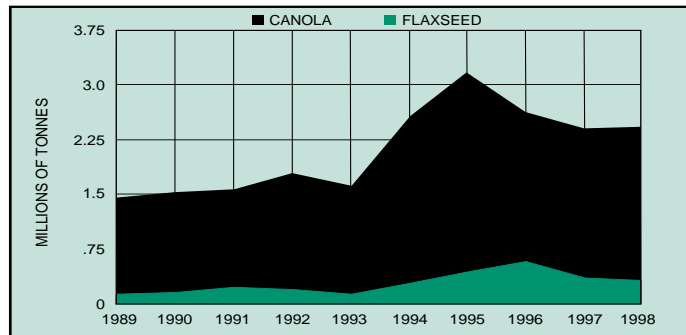

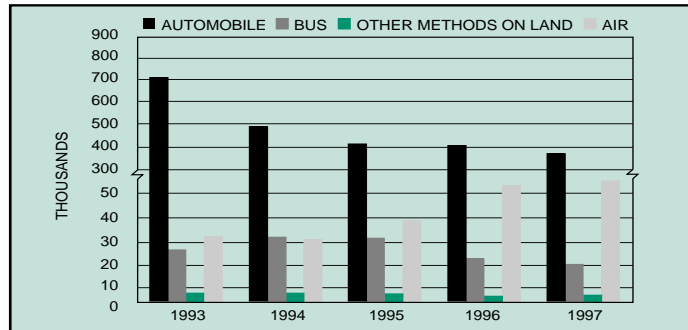

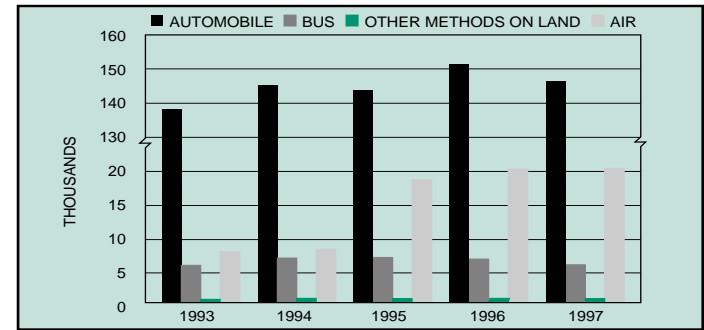

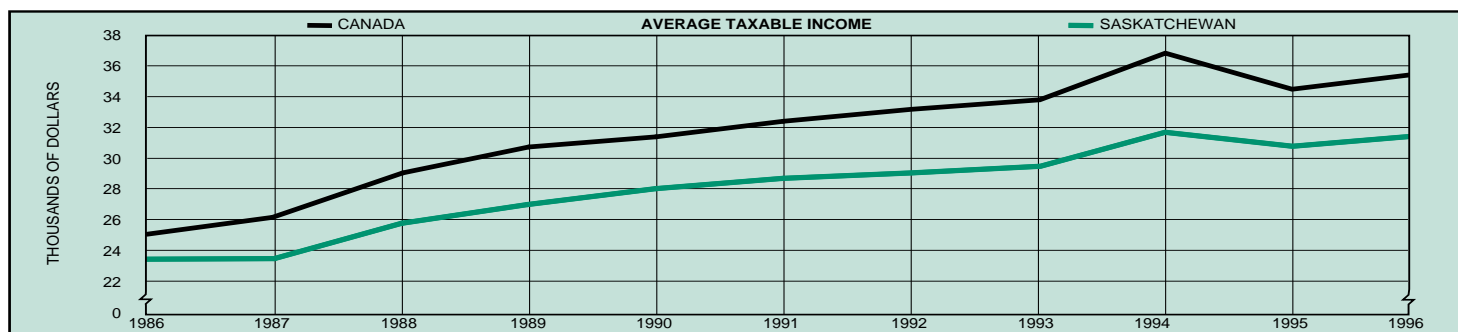

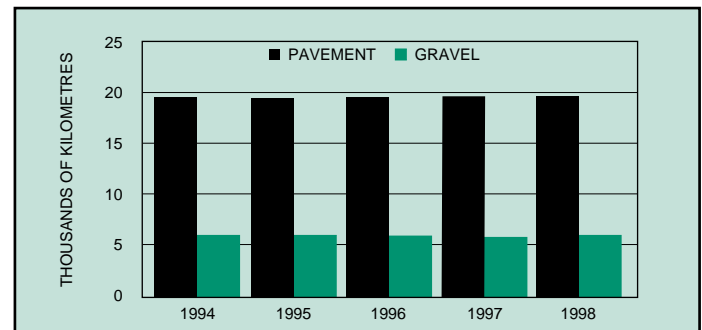

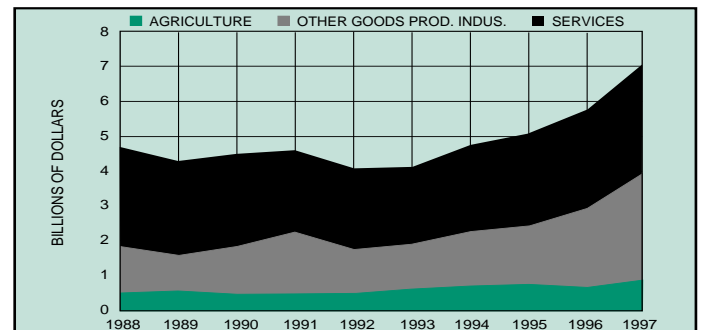

**Table 58: Gross Fixed Capital Formation, by Industry, on a GDP Basis, Saskatchewan**



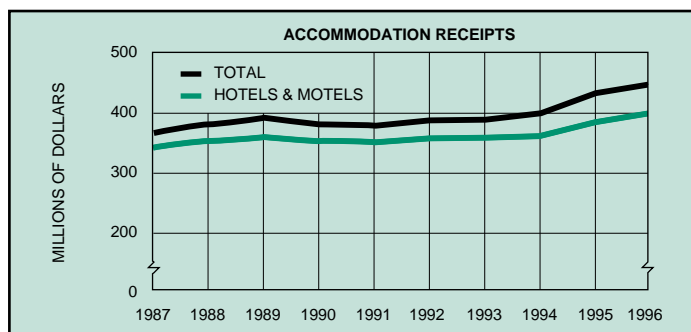

Table 59: Number of Locations and Total Receipts for Major Accommodation Groups, Saskatchewan



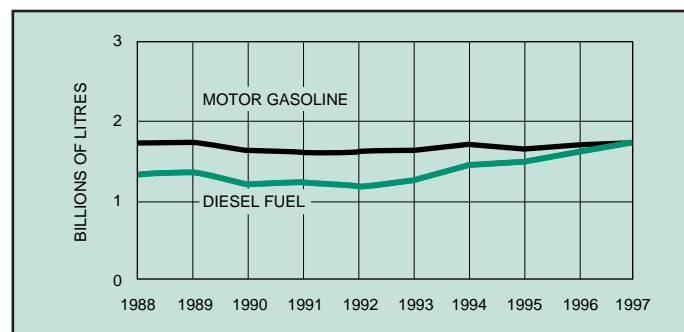

Table 60: Net Sales of Selected Petroleum Products, Saskatchewan

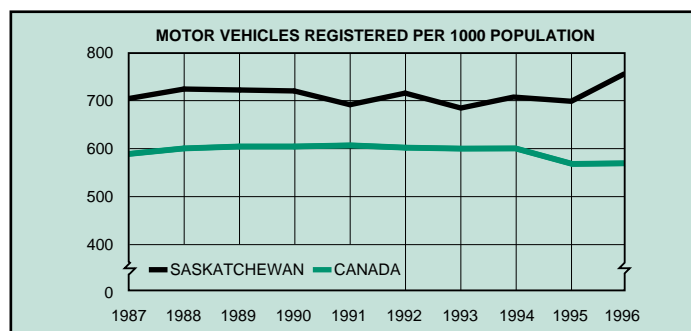

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# Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

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The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has developed a set of economic accounts which can be used to trace the development and growth of the Saskatchewan economy.

The purpose of the accounts is to measure the value of economic activity in each sector of the economy. This is done by means of a balancing set of accounts similar to the annual income and expenditure statements of a commercial enterprise.

The accounts have many useful functions. They consolidate information which is now provided through a number of scattered sources and organize it into a central framework. This allows many kinds of economic analysis to be performed ranging from monitoring current economic performance to analysis of structural change in the economy.

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has available upon request, many more detailed tables and other information concerning the Saskatchewan Economic Accounts.

## Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

Saskatchewan Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the total value of goods and services produced annually in the province. By removing the effects of inflation, it is possible to measure the volume of output. After adjusting for price changes, Saskatchewan's real Gross Domestic Product increased by 3.0 percent in 1997.

In nominal terms, Saskatchewan's GDP increased by 1.5 percent in 1997 to \$28,389 million. Personal expenditure on consumer goods and services rose by 5.4 percent as consumers increased spending in most categories. Government current expenditure on goods and services rose by 2.1 percent in 1997 after low growth in 1996.

Total investment increased 20.9 percent over 1996 despite a 2.8 percent decrease in government investment. Business investment rose 23.1 percent as growth occurred in agriculture, mining, construction, manufacturing, communication, miscellaneous utilities, finance, insurance and real estate, and commercial services.

The value of physical change in inventories was negative in 1997 as grain exports exceeded production.

Nominal exports increased by 8.9 percent over 1996 levels following advances in grain, livestock, lumber, potash, natural gas, manufactured goods and tourism. Nominal imports rose by 8.8 percent in 1997 as imports of natural gas, electricity and manufactured goods from Canada and imports of goods from abroad increased.

Final domestic demand for goods and services by individuals, the government and for investment purposes rose by 7.3 percent over 1996 levels, after adjustments for inflation. Real personal expenditure on consumer goods and services increased by 3.7 percent, government expenditures on goods and services increased by 0.6 percent and real gross fixed capital formation increased by 20.2 percent.

This document represents an update to the Saskatchewan economic accounts, released in June 1998. Periodic revisions are common to all economic series to improve the accuracy, reliability and consistency of the data.
