

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

December 2008

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended December 13, 2008, there were 516,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan during December 2008, a decrease of 4,700 from November 2008 but 16,900 more than the number employed in December 2007.

Agricultural employment was 36,800 persons in December 2008, down 5,200 from the November 2008 level and 1,600 less than the December 2007 agricultural employment level of 38,400. Non-agricultural employment was 479,200 persons in December 2008. This is an increase of 500 from the November 2008 non-agriculture employment level of 478,700 and 18,500 more than December 2007.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for December 2008 was 4.0 percent. This is an increase of 0.8 percentage points from the November 2008 rate of 3.2 percent and 0.2 percentage points higher than the December 2007 level of 3.8 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 700 to 537,400 persons in December 2008 from 538,100 persons in November 2008. This is 18,600 more than the December 2007 labour force of 518,800 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 69.4 percent in December 2008 from 69.6 percent in November 2008. The December 2007 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.4 percent.

There were 21,400 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during December 2008. This is an increase of 4,000 from November 2008 and is 1,700 more than the number unemployed in December 2007.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 520,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan in December 2008, down 300 from the November 2008 level of 520,600 but is up 15,600 from the December 2007 employment level of 504,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for December 2008 was 4.2 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the November 2008 rate of 3.7 percent and 0.2 percentage points higher than the December 2007 rate of 4.0 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 107,300 persons in December 2008 to 17,010,500 persons from 17,117,800 persons in November 2008. In December 2007, there were 16,929,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.1 percentage points to 6.3 percent from the November 2008 level of 6.2 percent. In December 2007, Canada's unemployment rate 5.6 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.6 percent in December 2008. This is 0.3 percentage points higher than November 2008 and 0.6 percentage points higher than the December 2007 level of 6.0 percent.
