

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

April 2009

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended April 18, 2009, there were 512,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan during April 2009, an increase of 1,800 from March 2009 and 9,700 more than the number employed in April 2008.

Agricultural employment was 44,900 persons in April 2009, up 6,900 from the March 2009 level and 5,100 more than the April 2008 agricultural employment level of 39,800. Non-agricultural employment was 467,900 persons in April 2009. This is a decrease of 5,100 from the March 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 473,000 and 4,600 more than April 2008.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for April 2009 was 5.4 percent. This is an increase of 0.2 percentage points from the March 2009 rate of 5.2 percent and 0.9 percentage points higher than the April 2008 level of 4.5 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 2,900 to 542,000 persons in April 2009 from 539,100 persons in March 2009. This is 15,300 more than the April 2008 labour force of 526,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.3 percentage points to 69.7 percent in April 2009 from 69.4 percent in March 2009. The April 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.0 percent.

There were 29,200 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during April 2009. This is an increase of 1,100 from March 2009 and is 5,600 more than the number unemployed in April 2008.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 520,100 persons employed in Saskatchewan in April 2009, up 300 from the March 2009 level of 19,800 and is up 10,300 from the April 2008 employment level of 509,800 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for April 2009 was 5.0 percent. This is an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the March 2009 rate of 4.7 percent and 0.7 percentage points higher than the April 2008 rate of 4.3 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 106,300 persons in April 2009 to 16,645,100 persons from 16,538,800 persons in March 2009. In April 2008, there were 16,915,500 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.3 percentage points to 8.5 percent from the March 2009 level of 8.8 percent. In April 2008, Canada's unemployment rate 6.3 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 8.0 percent in April 2009. This is the same level as of March 2009 and 2.0 percentage points higher than the April 2008 level of 6.0 percent.
