

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

May 2009

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended May 16, 2009, there were 530,100 persons employed in Saskatchewan during May 2009, an increase of 17,300 from April 2009 and 12,600 more than the number employed in May 2008.

Agricultural employment was 45,500 persons in May 2009, up 600 from the April 2009 level and 1,100 more than the May 2008 agricultural employment level of 44,400. Non-agricultural employment was 484,600 persons in May 2009. This is an increase of 16,700 from the April 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 467,900 and 11,500 more than May 2008.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for May 2009 was 4.9 percent. This is a decrease of 0.5 percentage points from the April 2009 rate of 5.4 percent but 0.9 percentage points higher than the May 2008 level of 4.0 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 15,700 to 557,700 persons in May 2009 from 542,000 persons in April 2009. This is 19,000 more than the May 2008 labour force of 538,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 2.0 percentage points to 71.7 percent in May 2009 from 69.7 percent in April 2009. The May 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.4 percent.

There were 27,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during May 2009. This is a decrease of 1,600 from April 2009 but is 6,300 more than the number unemployed in May 2008.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 523,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan in May 2009, up 3,100 from the April 2009 level of 520,100 and is up 13,400 from the May 2008 employment level of 509,800 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May 2009 was 4.9 percent. This is a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the April 2009 rate of 5.0 percent but 0.8 percentage points higher than the May 2008 rate of 4.1 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 307,200 persons in May 2009 to 16,952,300 persons from 16,645,100 persons in April 2009. In May 2008, there were 17,289,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.2 percentage points to 8.7 percent from the April 2009 level of 8.5 percent. In May 2008, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.2 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 8.4 percent in May 2009. This is 0.4 percentage points higher than April 2009 and 2.3 percentage points higher than the May 2008 level of 6.1 percent.
