

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

October 2009

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended October 17, 2009, there were 520,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan during October 2009, a decrease of 1,200 from September 2009 and 1,000 less than the number employed in October 2008.

Agricultural employment was 46,700 persons in October 2009, up 500 from the September 2009 level and 5,600 more than the October 2008 agricultural employment level of 41,100. Non-agricultural employment was 473,900 persons in October 2009. This is a decrease of 1,700 from the September 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 475,600 and 6,600 less than October 2008.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for October 2009 was 4.4 percent. This is an increase of 0.4 percentage points from the September 2009 rate of 4.0 percent and 1.1 percentage points higher than the October 2008 level of 3.3 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 1,200 to 544,700 persons in October 2009 from 543,500 persons in September 2009. This is 5,500 more than the October 2008 labour force of 539,200 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.1 percentage points to 69.6 percent in October 2009 from 69.5 percent in September 2009. The October 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.8 percent.

There were 24,100 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during October 2009. This is an increase of 2,400 from September 2009 and is 6,500 more than the number unemployed in October 2008.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 517,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan in October 2009, down 1,300 from the September 2009 level of 519,000 and is down 2,000 from the October 2008 employment level of 519,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for October 2009 was 5.3 percent. This is an increase of 0.7 percentage points from the September 2009 rate of 4.6 percent and 1.4 percentage points higher than the October 2008 rate of 3.9 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 8,100 persons in October 2009 to 16,909,400 persons from 16,901,300 persons in September 2009. In October 2008, there were 17,270,700 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate was 7.6 percent, no change from the September 2009 level of 7.6 percent. In October 2008, Canada's unemployment rate was 5.6 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 8.6 percent in October 2009. This is 0.2 percentage points higher than September 2009 and 2.3 percentage points higher than the October 2008 level of 6.3 percent.
