

# Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

September 2009

## UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended September 19, 2009, there were 521,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan during September 2009, an increase of 400 from August 2009 but 700 less than the number employed in September 2008.

Agricultural employment was 46,200 persons in September 2009, up 1,700 from the August 2009 level but 1,000 less than the September 2008 agricultural employment level of 47,200. Non-agricultural employment was 475,600 persons in September 2009. This is a decrease of 1,300 from the August 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 476,900 but 300 more than September 2008.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for September 2009 was 4.0 percent. This is a decrease of 2.1 percentage points from the August 2009 rate of 6.1 percent but 0.4 percentage points higher than the September 2008 level of 3.6 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 11,600 to 543,500 persons in September 2009 from 555,100 persons in August 2009. This is 1,400 more than the September 2008 labour force of 542,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 1.6 percentage points to 69.5 percent in September 2009 from 71.1 percent in August 2009. The September 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.3 percent.

There were 21,700 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during September 2009. This is a decrease of 12,000 from August 2009 but is 2,100 more than the number unemployed in September 2008.

## SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 519,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan in September 2009, up 2,100 from the August 2009 level of 516,900 but is down 500 from the September 2008 employment level of 519,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for September 2009 was 4.6 percent. This is a decrease of 0.4 percentage points from the August 2009 rate of 5.0 percent but 0.6 percentage points higher than the September 2008 rate of 4.0 percent.

## CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 179,100 persons in September 2009 to 16,901,300 persons from 17,080,400 persons in August 2009. In September 2008, there were 17,230,200 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 1.4 percentage points to 7.6 percent from the August 2009 level of 9.0 percent. In September 2008, Canada's unemployment rate was 5.7 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 8.4 percent in September 2009. This is 0.3 percentage points lower than August 2009 but 2.2 percentage points higher than the September 2008 level of 6.2 percent.
