

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

December 2010

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended December 11, 2010, there were 522,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan during December 2010, a decrease of 4,400 from November 2010 but 4,200 more than the number employed in December 2009.

Agricultural employment was 35,900 persons in December 2010, down 3,800 from the November 2010 level and 6,800 less than the December 2009 agricultural employment level of 42,700. Non-agricultural employment was 486,900 persons in December 2010. This is a decrease of 600 from the November 2010 non-agriculture employment level of 487,500 but 11,000 more than December 2009.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for December 2010 was 4.9 percent. This is unchanged from November 2010 and 0.6 percentage points higher than the December 2009 level of 4.3 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 4,300 to 549,900 persons in December 2010 from 554,200 persons in November 2010. This is 8,000 more than the December 2009 labour force of 541,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.6 percentage points to 69.1 percent in December 2010 from 69.7 percent in November 2010. The December 2009 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.1 percent.

There were 27,200 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during December 2010. This is an increase of 200 from November 2010 and is 3,900 more than the number unemployed in December 2009.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 527,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan in December 2010, unchanged from November 2010 and is up 4,900 from the December 2009 employment level of 522,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for December 2010 was 5.5 percent. This is unchanged from November 2010 and 0.7 percentage points higher than the December 2009 rate of 4.8 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 55,600 persons in December 2010 to 17,186,800 persons from 17,242,400 persons in November 2010. In December 2009, there were 16,826,500 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.1 percentage points to 7.1 percent from the November 2010 level of 7.2 percent. In December 2009, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.8 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.6 percent in December 2010. This is unchanged from November 2010 and 0.8 percentage points lower than the December 2009 level of 8.4 percent.
