

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

January 2010

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended January 16, 2010, there were 511,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan during January 2010, a decrease of 7,600 from December 2009 and 1,600 less than the number employed in January 2009.

Agricultural employment was 39,200 persons in January 2010, down 3,500 from the December 2009 level but 100 more than the January 2009 agricultural employment level of 39,100. Non-agricultural employment was 471,800 persons in January 2010. This is a decrease of 4,100 from the December 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 475,900 and 1,700 less than January 2009.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for January 2010 was 5.1 percent. This is an increase of 0.8 percentage points from the December 2009 rate of 4.3 percent and 0.5 percentage points higher than the January 2009 level of 4.6 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 3,600 to 538,300 persons in January 2010 from 541,900 persons in December 2009. This is 1,200 more than the January 2009 labour force of 537,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.5 percentage points to 68.6 percent in January 2010 from 69.1 percent in December 2009. The January 2009 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.3 percent.

There were 27,200 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during January 2010. This is an increase of 3,900 from December 2009 and is 2,600 more than the number unemployed in January 2009.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 519,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan in January 2010, down 2,300 from the December 2009 level of 522,100 and is down 1,200 from the January 2009 employment level of 521,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for January 2010 was 4.7 percent. This is a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the December 2009 rate of 4.8 percent but 0.5 percentage points higher than the January 2009 rate of 4.2 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 231,600 persons in January 2010 to 16,594,900 persons from 16,826,500 persons in December 2009. In January 2009, there were 16,600,900 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.9 percentage points to 8.7 percent from the December 2009 level of 7.8 percent. In January 2009, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.8 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 8.3 percent in January 2010. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than December 2009 but 1.0 percentage points higher than the January 2009 level of 7.3 percent.
