

# Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

October 2011

## UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended October 15, 2011, there were 529,100 persons employed in Saskatchewan during October 2011, a decrease of 1,100 from September 2011 but 6,200 more than the number employed in October 2010.

Agricultural employment was 39,900 persons in October 2011, down 2,200 from the September 2011 level and 4,100 less than the October 2010 agricultural employment level of 44,000. Non-agricultural employment was 489,200 persons in October 2011. This is an increase of 1,100 from the September 2011 non-agriculture employment level of 488,100 and 10,300 more than October 2010.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for October 2011 was 3.7 percent. This is a decrease of 0.3 percentage points from the September 2011 rate of 4.0 percent and 1.4 percentage points lower than the October 2010 level of 5.1 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 2,800 to 549,600 persons in October 2011 from 552,400 persons in September 2011. This is 1,400 less than the October 2010 labour force of 551,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.4 percentage points to 68.5 percent in October 2011 from 68.9 percent in September 2011. The October 2010 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.4 percent.

There were 20,400 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during October 2011. This is a decrease of 1,700 from September 2011 and is 7,700 less than the number unemployed in October 2010.

## SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 528,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan in October 2011, up 1,100 from the September 2011 level of 527,800 and is up 6,500 from the October 2010 employment level of 522,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for October 2011 was 4.1 percent. This is a decrease of 0.5 percentage points from the September 2011 rate of 4.6 percent and 1.6 percentage points lower than the October 2010 rate of 5.7 percent.

## CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 47,900 persons in October 2011 to 17,402,300 persons from 17,450,200 persons in September 2011. In October 2010, there were 17,183,500 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.1 percentage points in October 2011 to 6.7 percent from the September 2011 level of 6.6 percent. In October 2010, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.2 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.3 percent in October 2011. This is 0.2 percentage points higher than September 2011 but 0.5 percentage points higher than the October 2010 level of 7.8 percent.
