

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

January 2012

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended January 14, 2012, there were 520,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan during January 2012, a decrease of 2,900 from December 2011 but 3,200 more than the number employed in January 2011.

Agricultural employment was 32,900 persons in January 2012, down 2,800 from the December 2011 level and 4,600 less than the January 2011 agricultural employment level of 37,500. Non-agricultural employment was 487,700 persons in January 2012. This is a decrease of 100 from the December 2011 non-agriculture employment level of 487,800 but 7,800 more than January 2011.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for January 2012 was 5.1 percent. This is an increase of 0.4 percentage points from the December 2011 rate of 4.7 percent but 0.5 percentage points lower than the January 2011 level of 5.6 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 1,100 to 548,500 persons in January 2012 from 549,600 persons in December 2011. This is 300 more than the January 2011 labour force of 548,200 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 68.1 percent in January 2012 from 68.3 percent in December 2011. The January 2011 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.9 percent.

There were 27,900 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during January 2012. This is an increase of 1,800 from December 2011 but is 2,800 less than the number unemployed in January 2011.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 529,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan in January 2012, up 1,800 from the December 2011 level of 528,000 and up 3,200 from the January 2011 employment level of 526,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for January 2012 was 5.0 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the December 2011 rate of 5.2 percent and 0.3 percentage points lower than the January 2011 rate of 5.3 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 275,100 persons in January 2012 to 16,996,600 persons from 17,271,700 persons in December 2011. In January 2011, there were 16,877,000 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 1.1 percentage points in January 2012 to 8.0 percent from the December 2011 level of 6.9 percent. In January 2011, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.1 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.6 percent in January 2012. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than December 2011 but 0.1 percentage points lower than the January 2011 level of 7.7 percent.
