

# Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

February 2013

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## UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended February 16, 2013, there were 546,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan during February 2013, an increase of 900 from January 2013 and 24,400 more than the number employed in February 2012.

Agricultural employment was 40,400 persons in February 2013, down 500 from the January 2013 level but 8,000 more than the February 2012 agricultural employment level of 32,400. Non-agricultural employment was 505,800 persons in February 2013. This is an increase of 1,400 from the January 2013 non-agriculture employment level of 504,400 and 16,400 more than February 2012.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for February 2013 was 3.8 percent. This is a decrease of 0.3 percentage points from the January 2013 rate of 4.1 percent and 1.5 percentage points lower than the February 2012 level of 5.3 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 600 to 567,800 persons in February 2013 from 568,400 persons in January 2013. However, this is 16,600 more than the February 2012 labour force of 551,200 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.1 percentage points to 69.3 percent in February 2013 from 69.4 percent in January 2013. However, the February 2012 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.4 percent.

There were 21,700 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during February 2013. This is a decrease of 1,400 from January 2013 and is 7,700 less than the number unemployed in February 2012.

## SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 552,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan in February 2013, up 700 from the January 2013 level of 551,600 and up 22,900 from the February 2012 employment level of 529,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for February 2013 was 3.8 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the January 2013 rate of 4.0 percent and 1.1 percentage points lower than the February 2012 rate of 4.9 percent.

## CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 100,300 persons in February 2013 to 17,409,000 persons from 17,308,700 persons in January 2013. In February 2012, there were 17,064,100 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.1 percentage points in February 2013 to 7.3 percent from the January 2013 level of 7.4 percent. In February 2012, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.7 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.0 percent in February 2013. This is unchanged from January 2013 and 0.4 percentage points lower than the February 2012 level of 7.4 percent.
