

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

April 2014

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the time period covering April 13 to 19, 2014, there were 557,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan during April 2014, an increase of 4,800 from March 2014 and 8,500 more than the number employed in April 2013.

Agricultural employment was 43,700 persons in April 2014, up 2,700 from the March 2014 level and 3,700 more than the April 2013 agricultural employment level of 40,000. Non-agricultural employment was 513,300 persons in April 2014. This is an increase of 2,100 from the March 2014 non-agriculture employment level of 511,200 and 4,800 more than April 2013.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for April 2014 was 3.7 percent. This is a decrease of 0.9 percentage points from the March 2014 rate of 4.6 percent and 0.7 percentage points lower than the April 2013 level of 4.4 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 400 to 578,400 persons in April 2014 from 578,800 persons in March 2014. This is 4,800 more than the April 2013 labour force of 573,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 68.9 percent in April 2014 from 69.1 percent in March 2014. The April 2013 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.8 percent.

There were 21,400 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during April 2014. This is a decrease of 5,200 from March 2014 and is 3,700 less than the number unemployed in April 2013.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 561,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan in April 2014, up 3,000 from the March 2014 level of 558,300 and is up 8,300 from the April 2013 employment level of 553,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for April 2014 was 3.4 percent. This is a decrease of 1.1 percentage points from the March 2014 rate of 4.5 percent and 0.6 percentage points lower than the April 2013 rate of 4.0 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 79,900 persons in April 2014 to 17,627,900 persons from 17,548,000 persons in March 2014. In April 2013, there were 17,490,100 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.2 percentage points in April 2014 to 7.2 percent from the March 2014 level of 7.4 percent. In April 2013, Canada's unemployment rate was also 7.4 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.9 percent in April 2014. This is unchanged from March 2014 and 0.3 percentage points lower than the April 2013 level of 7.2 percent.
