

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

February 2015

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering February 15th to 21st, 2014, there were 558,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 200 from January 2015 and 100 more than the number employed in February 2014.

Agricultural employment was 38,800 persons in February 2015, unchanged from the January 2015 level and 3,200 less than the February 2014 agricultural employment level of 42,000. Non-agricultural employment was 519,200 persons in February 2015. This is a decrease of 200 from the January 2015 non-agriculture employment level of 519,400 and 3,300 more than February 2014.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for February 2015 was 5.5 percent. This is an increase of 0.6 percentage points from the January 2015 rate of 4.9 percent and 1.4 percentage points higher than the February 2014 level of 4.1 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 3,900 to 590,700 persons in February 2015 from 586,800 persons in January 2015. This is 9,100 more than the February 2014 labour force of 581,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.4 percentage points to 68.8 percent in February 2015 from 68.4 percent in January 2015. The February 2014 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.6 percent.

There were 32,700 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during February 2015. This is an increase of 4,100 from January 2015 and is 9,000 more than the number unemployed in February 2014.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 565,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan in February 2015, down 700 from the January 2015 level of 566,600 and is up 700 from the February 2014 employment level of 565,200 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for February 2015 was 5.0 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the January 2015 rate of 4.5 percent and 0.9 percentage points higher than the February 2014 rate of 4.1 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 42,000 persons in February 2015 to 17,582,000 persons from 17,540,000 persons in January 2015. In February 2014, there were 17,466,400 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.2 percentage points in February 2015 to 7.2 percent from the January 2015 level of 7.0 percent. In February 2014, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.4 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.8 percent in February 2015. This is 0.2 percentage points higher than January 2015 but 0.3 percentage points lower than the February 2014 level of 7.1 percent.
