

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

January 2015

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering January 11th to 17th, 2015, there were 558,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 13,600 from December 2014 and 1,200 less than the number employed in January 2014.

Agricultural employment was 38,800 persons in January 2015, down 3,000 from the December 2014 level and 5,000 less than the January 2014 agricultural employment level of 43,800. Non-agricultural employment was 519,400 persons in January 2015. This is a decrease of 10,600 from the December 2014 non-agriculture employment level of 530,000 but 3,800 more than January 2014.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for January 2015 was 4.9 percent. This is an increase of 1.5 percentage points from the December 2014 rate of 3.4 percent and 0.2 percentage points higher than the January 2014 level of 4.7 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 5,200 to 586,800 persons in January 2015 from 592,000 persons in December 2014. This is 100 more than the January 2014 labour force of 586,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.7 percentage points to 68.4 percent in January 2015 from 69.1 percent in December 2014. The January 2014 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.3 percent.

There were 28,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during January 2015. This is an increase of 8,400 from December 2014 and is 1,300 more than the number unemployed in January 2014.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 566,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan in January 2015, down 8,400 from the December 2014 level of 575,000 and is down 400 from the January 2014 employment level of 567,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for January 2015 was 4.5 percent. This is an increase of 0.8 percentage points from the December 2014 rate of 3.7 percent and 0.2 percentage points higher than the January 2014 rate of 4.3 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 225,900 persons in January 2015 to 17,540,000 persons from 17,765,900 persons in December 2014. In January 2014, there were 17,408,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.8 percentage points in January 2015 to 7.0 percent from the December 2014 level of 6.2 percent. In January 2014, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.4 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.6 percent in January 2015. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than December 2014 and 0.4 percentage points lower than the January 2014 level of 7.0 percent.

Past labour force estimates have been revised to account for the incorporation of 2011 Census data into the population estimates. This labour force report is not directly comparable to past reports.
