

# Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

March 2015

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## UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering March 15<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup>, 2015, there were 564,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is an increase of 6,600 from February 2015 and 6,400 more than the number employed in March 2014.

Agricultural employment was 39,700 persons in March 2015, up 900 from the February 2015 level and the same as the March 2014 agricultural employment level of 39,700. Non-agricultural employment was 524,900 persons in March 2015. This is an increase of 5,700 from the February 2015 non-agriculture employment level of 519,200 and 6,400 more than March 2014.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for March 2015 was 4.9 percent. This is a decrease of 0.6 percentage points from the February 2015 rate of 5.5 percent but 0.1 percentage points higher than the March 2014 level of 4.8 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 3,100 to 593,800 persons in March 2015 from 590,700 persons in February 2015. This is 7,300 more than the March 2014 labour force of 586,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.3 percentage points to 69.1 percent in March 2015 from 68.8 percent in February 2015. The March 2014 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.1 percent.

There were 29,200 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during March 2015. This is a decrease of 3,500 from February 2015 but is 900 more than the number unemployed in March 2014.

## SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 572,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan in March 2015, up 7,000 from the February 2015 level of 565,900 and is up 6,700 from the March 2014 employment level of 566,200 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March 2015 was 4.4 percent. This is a decrease of 0.6 percentage points from the February 2015 rate of 5.0 percent and 0.2 percentage points lower than the March 2014 rate of 4.6 percent.

## CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 8,000 persons in March 2015 to 17,574,000 persons from 17,582,000 persons in February 2015. In March 2014, there were 17,491,400 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.2 percentage points in March 2015 to 7.4 percent from the February 2015 level of 7.2 percent. In March 2014, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.4 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.8 percent in March 2015. This is the same as the February 2015 level but 0.2 percentage points lower than the March 2014 level of 7.0 percent.
