

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

May 2015

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering May 10th to 16th, 2015, there were 582,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is an increase of 13,200 from April 2015 and 4,800 more than the number employed in May 2014.

Agricultural employment was 42,900 persons in May 2015, up 1,900 from the April 2015 level but 2,400 less than the May 2014 agricultural employment level of 45,300. Non-agricultural employment was 539,800 persons in May 2015. This is an increase of 11,300 from the April 2015 non-agriculture employment level of 528,500 and 7,200 more than May 2014.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for May 2015 was 5.3 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the April 2015 rate of 4.8 percent and 1.3 percentage points higher than the May 2014 level of 4.0 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 17,300 to 615,300 persons in May 2015 from 598,000 persons in April 2015. This is 13,300 more than the May 2014 labour force of 602,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 1.9 percentage points to 71.5 percent in May 2015 from 69.6 percent in April 2015. The May 2014 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.7 percent.

There were 32,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during May 2015. This is an increase of 4,100 from April 2015 and is 8,500 more than the number unemployed in May 2014.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 575,400 persons employed in Saskatchewan in May 2015, unchanged from April 2015 but up 5,600 from the May 2014 employment level of 569,800 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May 2015 was 4.9 percent. This is an increase of 0.6 percentage points from the April 2015 rate of 4.3 percent and 0.9 percentage points higher than the May 2014 rate of 4.0 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 412,600 persons in May 2015 to 18,110,500 persons from 17,697,900 persons in April 2015. In May 2014, there were 17,924,400 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate for May 2015 was 7.1 percent. This is unchanged from the April 2015 level but is 0.1 percentage points lower than the May 2014 level of 7.2 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.8 percent in May 2015. This is unchanged from the April 2015 level but is 0.2 percentage points lower than the May 2014 level of 7.0 percent.
