

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

January 2016

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering January 10th to 16th, 2016, there were 563,400 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 7,500 from December 2015 and 5,200 more than the number employed in January 2015.

Agricultural employment was 38,600 persons in January 2016, down 2,000 from the December 2015 level and 200 less than the January 2015 agricultural employment level of 38,800. Non-agricultural employment was 524,800 persons in January 2016. This is a decrease of 5,500 from the December 2015 non-agriculture employment level of 530,300 and 5,400 more than January 2015.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for January 2016 was 6.1 percent. This is an increase of 1.0 percentage points from the December 2015 rate of 5.1 percent and 1.2 percentage points higher than the January 2015 level of 4.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 1,500 to 599,900 persons in January 2016 from 601,400 persons in December 2015. This is 13,100 more than the January 2015 labour force of 586,800 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 69.3 percent in January 2016 from 69.5 percent in December 2015. The January 2015 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.4 percent.

There were 36,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during January 2016. This is an increase of 6,000 from December 2015 and 8,000 more than the number unemployed in January 2015.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 573,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan in January 2016, down 1,800 from the December 2015 level of 575,100 and is up 6,400 from the January 2015 employment level of 566,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for January 2016 was 5.6 percent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the December 2015 rate of 5.5 percent and 1.1 percentage points higher than the January 2015 rate of 4.5 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 253,100 persons in January 2016 to 17,661,900 persons from 17,915,000 persons in December 2015. In January 2015, there were 17,540,000 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased by 0.8 percentage points in January 2016 to 7.5 percent from the December 2015 level of 6.7 percent. In January 2015, Canada's unemployment rate was 7 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.2 percent in January 2016. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than December 2015 and 0.6 percentage points higher than the January 2015 level of 6.6 percent.
