

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

March 2016

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering March 13th to 19th, 2015, there were 559,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is an increase of 4,200 from February 2016 but 5,400 less than the number employed in March 2015.

Agricultural employment was 40,200 persons in March 2016, down 800 from the February 2016 level but 500 more than the March 2015 agricultural employment level of 39,700. Non-agricultural employment was 519,000 persons in March 2016. This is an increase of 5,000 from the February 2016 non-agriculture employment level of 514,000 but 5,900 less than March 2015.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for March 2016 was 6.9 percent. This is an increase of 0.2 percentage points from the February 2016 rate of 6.7 percent and 2.0 percentage points higher than the March 2015 level of 4.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 6,000 to 600,700 persons in March 2016 from 594,700 persons in February 2016. This is 6,900 more than the March 2015 labour force of 593,800 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.6 percentage points to 69.3 percent in March 2016 from 68.7 percent in February 2016. The March 2015 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.1 percent.

There were 41,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during March 2016. This is an increase of 1,900 from February 2016 and 12,400 more than the number unemployed in March 2015.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 568,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan in March 2016, up 2,800 from the February 2016 level of 565,500 but down 5,300 from the March 2015 employment level of 573,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March 2016 was 6.2 percent. This is an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the February 2016 rate of 5.9 percent and 1.7 percentage points higher than the March 2015 rate of 4.5 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 29,500 persons in March 2016 to 17,726,600 persons from 17,697,100 persons in February 2016. In March 2015, there were 17,574,000 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate remained unchanged in March 2016 at 7.7 percent from the February 2016 level. In March 2015, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.4 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.1 percent in March 2016. This is 0.2 percentage points lower than February 2016 but 0.3 percentage points higher than the March 2015 level of 6.8 percent.
